

As a member of the Florida Kiwanis Membership Expansion Committee (MEC), I've gained insight into this discrepancy. Despite the generational gap, I feel compelled to express my belief that embracing diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) could hold the key to revitalizing Kiwanis.

## CKI

What a year it has been for the Florida District of Circle K International! This past year has been a record-breaking year for CKI, which could not have been possible without the support of Florida Kiwanis. We held our 65<sup>th</sup> annual District Convention in Altamonte Springs at the end of February where we celebrated the outstanding accomplishments that all Florida CKI members, clubs, and the District achieved this year. Some of these accomplishments include:

- Positive membership growth in the District for the first time since 2019
- Many clubs experienced a membership increase, including one club that had a 400% increase.
- · All Florida CKI Clubs met membership requirements and are now clubs in good standing.
- Chartered Rollins College CKI and are continuing to work with many other clubs that are in the chartering process.
- 65% increase in attendance at our annual fall Leadership Training Conference.

- 48% increase in attendance at our District Convention with attendees from all Florida CKI clubs.
- Over 10% increase in reported service hours and over 37% increase in reported Kiwanis Family Relations events.
- Raised over \$2,600 USD for Brick x Brick, CKI International's Project with UNICEF, through three large District-wide fundraisers.

On behalf of Florida CKI, thank you so much for all of Florida Kiwanis' continued support and dedication to Florida CKI. April 1<sup>st</sup> officially begins the 2024-2025 CKI service year and I know that it will be another fantastic year. Jose Mendez of Florida International University will be serving as District Governor and Krystal Laudicina will be serving as District Administrator. Jose and Krystal both have huge goals and aspirations for the District, so we are excited to work alongside Florida Kiwanis to help us continue to grow Florida CKI throughout the new service year!

# **INTERCLUBS**

## WHAT THE HECK IS INTER-CLUB?

An inter-club meeting is a meeting staged by two or more Kiwanis clubs (including clubs in formation), or by a Kiwanis club and any K Kids, Builders Club, Kiwanis Junior, Aktion Club, Circle K Club, or Key Club. You can also Inter-Club events, fundraisers and service projects!

# How do you qualify for an Inter-Club event?

Clubs with 20 or fewer members need a minimum of two members in attendance to constitute an Inter-Club meeting. Clubs with 21-30 members need three members, and clubs with 31 or more members need at least four members in attendance.

#### WHY INTER-CLUB?

Inter-clubbing is a means of supporting Kiwanis' objective, which is "To provide, through this club, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build a better community." This wider scope of Kiwanis can be achieved by arranging visits between clubs in the same town, division, and district, as well as inter district get-togethers. One of the most important responsibilities is the development of fellowship among members of the Kiwanis family (Kiwanis clubs, K-Kids, Builders Clubs, Kiwanis Junior, Aktion Clubs, Key Clubs, and Circle K Clubs) by having inter-club activities. Through the fellowship gained by inter-club activities, members learn how other clubs function, get to know their neighboring Kiwanians, develop new ideas and a broader interest in how Kiwanis operates, find new ideas for use in their own club, and become better Kiwanians.


