<u>December 7 – New Executive Director of Hastings Area</u> <u>Chamber of Commerce & HEDC, Shannon Landauer</u>

Shannon grew up in the Sandhills and knew in high school that she wanted to serve rural communities, but was not sure how that would be in practice.

Her career in Economic Development started in Albion. She later went to Carroll, Iowa where she served two boards with two budgets and brought the two together. That is the same course that Hastings is pursuing now. She is looking at how resources have changed funding for both organizations, duplication of talent, and how the two can be brought together for more efficiency.

Her priorities are:

Expanding the tax base and getting new money into the community. Adequate, affordable housing is necessary for this to happen. Businesses need to employ good people. Those people need good housing and child care. The HEDC looks at how to bring new business in, and the Chamber helps solidify it.

Marketing – making sure companies look beyond Lincoln. European manufacturing com-



panies looking for locations in the U.S. focus more on the people available, and the availability of housing for their employees.

Looking at how the two organizations can work together as one team to elevate Hastings' reputation and what it has to offer.

She is also looking to bring more energy to the community with more events like Business After Hours. The Chamber is looking at what's missing to support existing businesses and retailers. They are also seeing new, independent businesses in all areas. They are looking holistically at what types of housing are needed: entry-level, rentals, and senior. She recognizes that volunteerism is the heart of a community, and offered appreciation for what Kiwanis contributes.

December 14 – Special Olympics, Anne Hermann (with assist from dad, Russ)





Anne participated in Track and Field at the Special Olympics World Games in June 2023. The adventure started with the trials in Texas in November of 2022. She was notified of acceptance in March 2023, and she and her father, Russ Hermann, left on June 8th. They met other participants in South Dakota and then went on to New York City.

The competition was held in Berlin, Germany from June 17-25. Anne summed up the experience: "It was awesome!" She made lots of friends and would love to do it again. There were 94 athletes from the United States representing 42 states – Anne was the only one from Nebraska. There were 103 countries participating.

Anne said she was up at 5:15 every morning. Training was for three days prior to competition, mostly with people she had never met. She participated in the opening ceremony in the Olympic Stadium built for the 1936 Olympics.

She placed 3rd in shotput, ran in a 400 meter heat, and was on the 4x4 relay team who placed 1st ... except both the first and second place teams were disqualified "for some unknown reason." They feel it was due to a language barrier.

Special Olympics helps with communication and mobility, staying active. Their motto is: "Let me win, but if I cannot win, let me be brave in the attempt." Russ said that last part was foremost at the 4x4 relay medal ceremony. The team didn't know they had been disqualified until they were on the podium. He was very proud of how they handled it.

They got to do some group sightseeing, including visiting the U.S. Embassy. Russ was able to visit Checkpoint Charlie, a well-known Berlin crossing point between East Germany and West Germany following WWII. He saw signage everywhere that expressed the thought, "We must keep our history. We may not like it, but it is our history and we need to keep it."

Anne participates in track, basketball, swimming, pentathlon, unified bowling, and recently skiing in Winter Park. Her favorite sport is Track and Field, with skiing second. In January 2024 there is a competition in Snow Creek, MO she and one other are competing in. They will have seven events in two days, including alpine, super G, downhill slalom, and snowshoeing. Their coach told them, "If you don't fall, you're not learning."
