SUMMARY

I had the distinct honor of serving as President during the 78th year of our Club and the 100th Anniversary of Kiwanis International. We set out on an ambitious year with five goals: 1. Celebrate the 100th Anniversary of Kiwanis to enhance our public visibility; 2. Complete our \$100K pledge to the Eliminate project; 3. Grow our Terrific Kids program; 4. Begin capitalizing a Club Scholarship Program with a second Club fundraiser in addition to the Annual Crawfish Boil; 5. Enhance access and utilization of the Camp Lake by planning, funding and constructing a bulkhead structure for fishing. The Club's Directors and Membership achieved those objectives and more! We enhanced the visibility of our Club kas the premier Service Club in our community; the Directors elected to increase our Eliminate pledge to \$135K after meeting the \$100K goal; we facilitated the addition of additional schools to our TK and Key Club programs, and held a Skeet Shoot to raise over \$2K for our new Club Foundation Scholarship Fund. A lasting highlight was the funding and construction of the Camp Lake bulkhead and renovation of the existing pier that allows for greater fishing opportunities for children and for children and adults with limited mobility. The project was funded by the Club, a generous \$4K grant from the LAMISSTN District Foundation, at or below cost materials and hauling from area businesses, along with labor and heavy equipment from the Louisiana National Guard's 225th Engineer Brigade. Construction Supervisor was Club Director and Professional Engineer Kerry LaBauve. The Gung Ho spirit of our Club members, Directors and Officers resulted in our Club being recognized as a LAMISSTN District Distinguished Club for 2014-2015. (I had the honor to serve as Lt.
