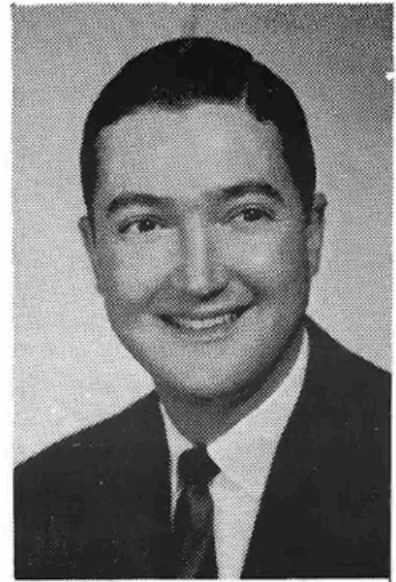

The Key Clubs and Circle K organization sponsored projects to clean up Camp Kiwanis on the weekends. 1967 was the second year of participation of our vocational committee on the rehabilitation program with patients of the Central Louisiana State Hospital. At the Mid-Winter Conference our club bulletin editor, Pin Dyer, was named winner of the district club bulletin contest. Don Moriarty, Past President, was given his 20th year perfect attendance pin. This year our local club celebrated its 30th anniversary with Dr. R.E. McGill, our first President, cutting a large cake. Kiwanis Day was proclaimed in Alexandria in celebration of Kiwanis International 52nd Anniversary.

SUMMATION:

This was a busy year for the Officers and Board of Directors. Neil Klock chaired a club planning meeting where committee assignments were distributed. 1937 - GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY - 1987

The historic occasion was celebrated in a historic setting, the Hotel Bentley.

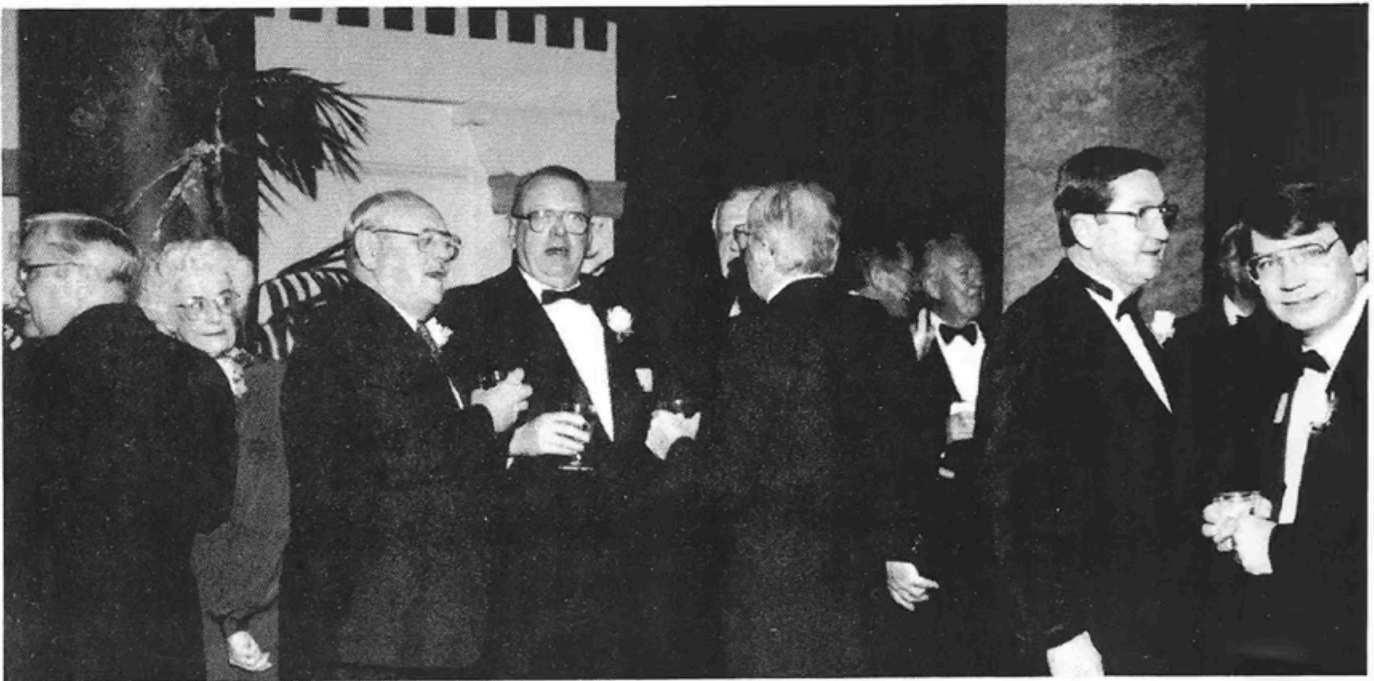
