


YEAR IN REVIEW -2022




ABC – A Bench for Caps Program. Also known as the Buddy Bench Project.






LENOIR CITY ELEMENTARY NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION

READ ACROSS AMERICA – MARCH 1, 2022.


Kiwanis member volunteered to read to the students at Lenoir City Elementary School.




Fun times wrapping Christmas presents at Lenoir City Family Resource Center. There are going to be some very happy families this holiday.









TROUT IN THE CLASSROOM

The program began in Sept. 2021 with the delivery of 200 rainbow trout eggs from the Tellico Trout Hatchery. The 50 gallon aquarium was setup in the STEM classroom at Loudon County Middle School, under the supervision of teacher, Joey Breedlove. The students and Kiwanis members kept a close watch over water quality, monitored chemicals, and the tank temperature. On May 13, 2022, a school buss filled with students headed to Bald River Falls.



110 hardy trout survivors, known as fingerlings, were released into the river by the students.

Following the release, the students continued on this amazing field trip to the Tellico Trout Hatchery. An employee of the Hatchery gave the group food to feed the fish and explained how the hatchery stocks the local rivers.









Oakridge biologist, Trent Jeff, showed the students what fish in the wild ate for dinner!
