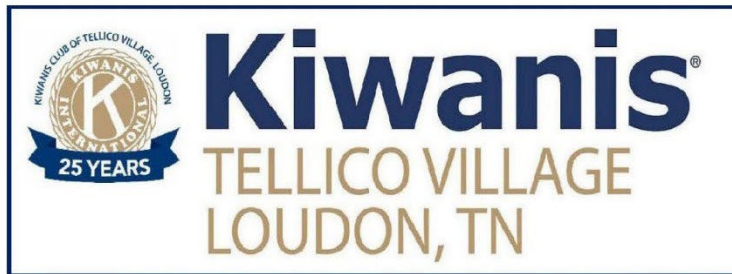

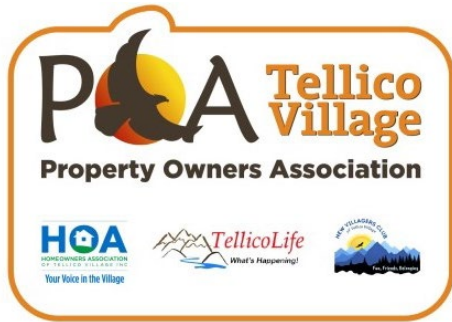

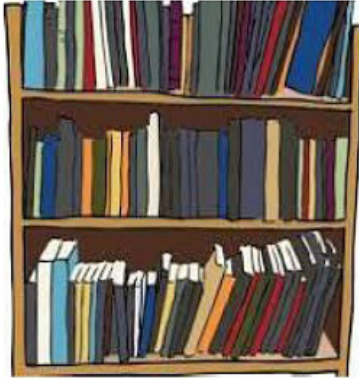

This program brings the school library to the kindergarten classes at Lenoir City Elementary School. Once a week during the school year, a cart stocked with library books is placed outside each classroom door (one cart for each classroom). A member is assigned to each cart to serve as the "librarian." Prior to the school start each child is permitted to search for a book, take the library card out of the pocket and hand it to the member who then records name and date of the child. The child's teacher will then provide a folder to take home. The folder contains suggestions for the parent as they read the book to their child.

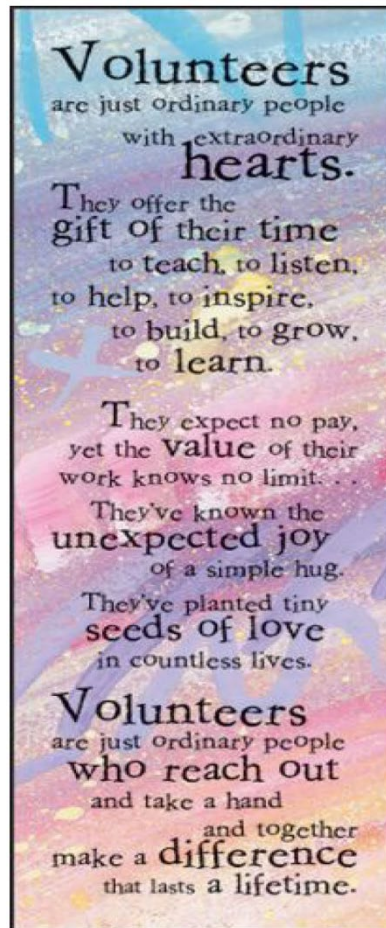
**Jim Barton:** Has stage 4 lung cancer. Jim has a long and difficult road ahead.
