This program brings the school library to the kindergarten classes at Lenoir City Elementary School. Once a week, on Thursdays during the school year, a cart stocked with library books is placed outside each classroom door (one cart for each classroom). Each Kiwanis member is assigned to a cart serving as the "librarian." Prior to the school start each child is permitted to search for a book, take the library card out of the pocket and hand it to the member who then records name and date of the child. The child's teacher will them provide a folder to take home. The folder contains suggestions for the parent as they read the book to their child. Volunteers spend approximately one hour of their time; 7:30 a.m. - 8:30 a.m.



Commodity Food Distribution – September 10th

Volunteers meet at the War Memorial Building in Lenoir City.

Packers arrive at 9 a.m. They pack bags of the surplus food; averaging 3 bags per individuals.

Drivers arrive at 10 a.m. They pack the bags of food into their Vans, Pickup Trucks or SUVs and deliver the bags to the designated recipients.

Packers should arrive by 9:00 a.m. and drivers by 10:00 a.m.
