


Thank you to our Guest Speaker, Nicci Grigsby.

> Our 55 Buddy Benches now share the spotlight with 2 Ozark Hex shaped tables. The table seats 6 with spaced for 3 special chairs.









Commodity Food Distribution - September 10th

Fred Gibson explained the why, the when, the what of the Commodity Food Distribution Project.

Fred joined our club in 2017 and has been involved with this quarterly project since that time.







Volunteers meet at the War Memorial Building in Lenoir City.

Packers arrive at 9 a.m. They pack bags of the surplus food; averaging 3 bags per individuals. Currently 25 – 30 individuals are recipients.

Drivers arrive at 10 a.m. They pack the bags of food into their Vans, Pickup Trucks or SUVs and deliver the bags to the designated recipients.

Project Directory Explanation – Commodity Food Distribution:

Once each quarter, Kiwanis helps coordinate with the Mid-East government organization for the receipt, packing, and delivery of surplus government commodities to residents in Lenoir City. Those receiving food are primarily low-income elderly or handicapped individuals unable to pick up the food themselves.

Recipients are qualified for the distributions through Mid-East.
