

Amtryke models include those with combined hand and foot motion to stimulate reciprocal movement, hand cycles for those with limited lower body mobility and traditional foot cycles designed for riders with special needs.










London County Education Foundation (LCEF) meets monthly to encourage business and community participation in education within Loudon County schools.


