

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, launched in 1995, is a remarkable initiative aimed at fostering a love for reading among young children. By providing age-appropriate books to children aged 0 up to 5, the program seeks to enhance early literacy skills, setting a solid foundation for future educational success. Currently operational in the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, Ireland, and Australia, the Imagination Library has gifted over 257 million books as of October 2024, with 3 million books being shipped each month. With over 1.74 million children enrolled, the program's impact is widespread and profound.

The efforts by Monroe County Imagination Library's board of directors are focused on enrolling every eligible child, emphasizing the importance of early literacy in improving reading proficiency. With only 26% of elementary students testing at or above the proficient level for reading, initiatives like this are crucial. A strong educational foundation is vital for a child's future, and the Imagination Library is playing a pivotal role in shaping brighter futures through the power of books.





Lending Library– (Young Children: Priority One Committee)

This program brings the school library to the kindergarten classes at Lenoir City Elementary School. Once a week, on Thursdays during the school year, a cart stocked with library books is placed outside each classroom door (one cart for each classroom). Each member is assigned to a cart, serving as the "librarian."

Prior to the school start each child is permitted to search for a book, take the library card out of the pocket and hand it to the member who then records name and date of the child. The child's teacher will them provide a folder totake home. The folder contains suggestions for the parent as they read the book to their child. Volunteers spend approximately one hour of their time, from 7:30 a.m. – 8:30 a.m.

Early Childhood Literacy – (Young Children: Priority One Committee)

Every other Thursday of the month during the school year, volunteers read to Pre-Kindergarten children at Lenoir City Elementary School. This project follows the Lending Library program held on the specified Thursday morning.



Governor, International Officers or Trustee, if present, can be counted. Only one substitute for a club member may be used at any event.




