This inclusive program, which began in Monroe County in 2019, aims to make baseball accessible to everyone, regardless of their abilities or disabilities.

Sweetwater and Tellico Plains were the first Without Limits teams.

Working with the Loudon Diamond club, the Loudon Without Limits team made its debut April 26, 2023. This team, comprising players aged 5 to 28, benefits from community generosity, receiving uniforms and participation at no cost.

Tellico Village Kiwanis Club proudly supports this endeavor, embodying the spirit of inclusivity and community engagement that defines the Without Limits program. Following the game, our Projects Co-Chair, Ray Mouse, presented Rebecca McBride, Director of the Loudon team, with a check in the amount of \$1,400, plus a private \$200.00 donation, to be used as needed for the team.

Kiwanian Rob Orkney displayed an Amtryke at the game. Rob is co-chair of our club's Amtryke project. These therapeutic tricycles are designed for special needs children. The trikes can be operated by hand or foot, cater to children with varying physical limitations, offering a unique mobility solution. Our Kiwanis club supports both financial backing and hands-on assistance. The therapeutic benefits of these tricycles are multifaceted, enhancing motor skills, boosting physical strength, and significantly improving the self-esteem of young riders. This project underscores the profound difference that thoughtful innovation and community support can make in the lives of children with special needs.

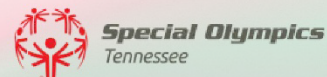

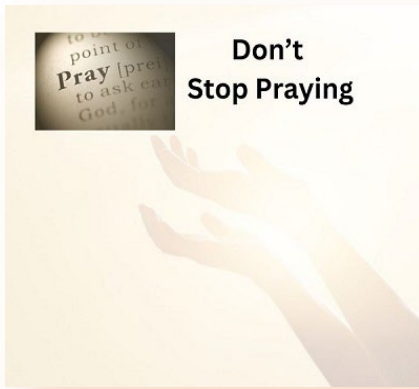

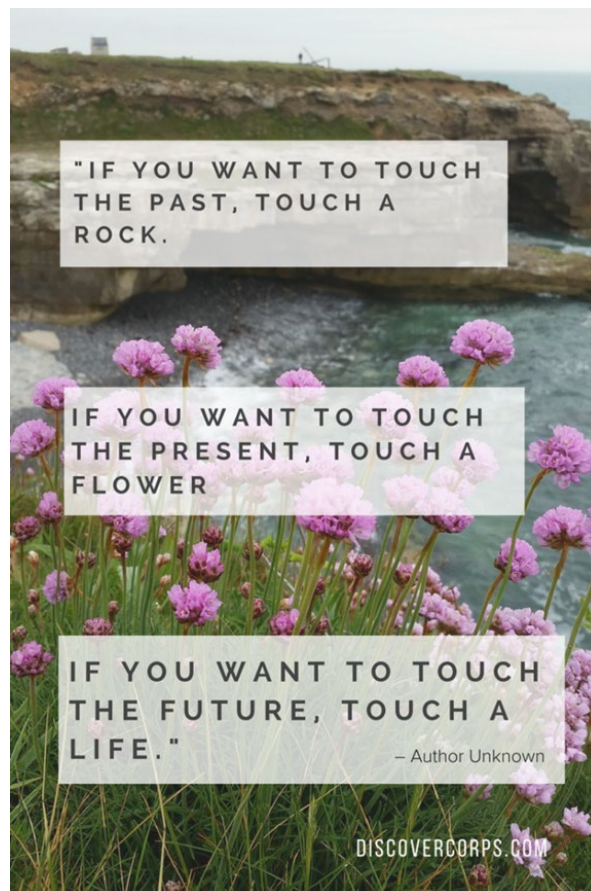
