What an honor and privilege to have as our guest speaker today, Captain Rick Creange. He attended the Pennsylvania State University and was commissioned an Ensign USN through the NROTC program in 1981. He earned his gold wings as a Naval Flight Officer in 1983 and qualified in the F-14 Tomcat. His career spanned 27 years participating in combat operations in Lebanon (1984), Desert Shield & Desert Storm (1990-91), and in Bosnia, Somalia, and Iraq (1993-94). Captain Creange is also a graduate of the Navy Fighter Weapons School (TOPGUN) and has logged over 3000 flight hours, 200 Combat hours, and 800 carrier arrestments. Retired from Active Duty on Sept, 1, 2008, he joined the Navy's Operational Test and Evaluation Force team as the Director for Advanced Programs. After 41 combined years of service to the country, Captain Creange retired for good in July 2022. He and his wife moved to Tellico Village in May 2022.

His dedication and commitment to our country continues as the Commander of the VFW Post 12135. The Tellico Village VFW Post 12135 is an all volunteer organization of combat Veterans dedicated to helping fellow veterans in need while supporting and organizing many events throughout our community. *Their mission: To foster camaraderie among United States veterans of overseas conflicts. To serve our veterans, the military and our communities. To advocate on behalf of all veterans, seeking out the needs of those in and around our community. To serve our youth, sharing patriotism through youth organizations and recognition.*

Once each quarter, Kiwanis helps coordinate with the Mid-East government organization for the receipt, packing, and delivery of surplus government commodities to residents in Lenoir City. Kiwanis Members meet at the War Memorial Building located at 101 N B Street in Lenoir City. Volunteer Packers should arrive by 9:00 a.m. to receive and pack the food received from USDA. Delivery Volunteers should arrive by 10:00 a.m.

Those receiving food are primarily low-income elderly or disabled individuals unable to pick up the food themselves. Recipients are qualified for the distributions through Mid-East.

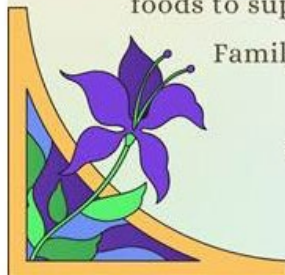

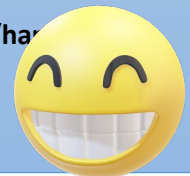

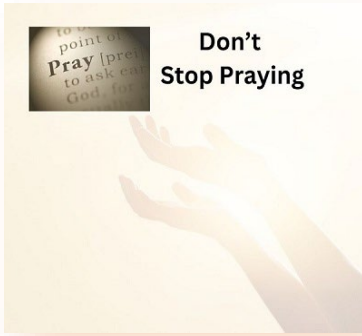
