

100 BENCHES BY **DECEMBER 31, 2025**

The "A Bench for Caps Program" exemplifies an inspiring initiative blending community involvement & environmental responsibility. Since its inception in 2019 by Kiwanian Kevin Meyer, the program has been remarkably successful in repurposing non-recyclable plastic caps and lids, which would otherwise contribute to landfill waste. Greentree Plastics in Evansville, Indiana transforms the collected plastic into benches and tables.

How many pounds of non-recyclable plastic caps and lids have been kept out of landfills to-date? Each bench requires 200 pounds of non-recyclable plastic, and 550 pounds for a table. Through collective efforts, this club program has diverted an astoundingly 20,000 pounds, or 10 tons, of non-recyclable plastic from landfills, showcasing the positive impact of community-driven environmental initiatives.




