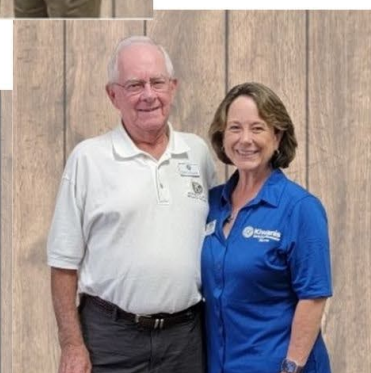

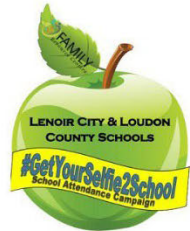


**Amtryke Project:** Our club provides financial and direct assistance in providing therapeutic tricycles to special needs children unable to operate traditional bikes. These unique tricycles can be

either hand and/or foot operated and can accommodate riders with varying degrees of physical limitations. The therapeutic benefits are multifaceted, enhancing motor skills, boosting physical strength, and significantly improving self-esteem of young riders.

As of October 2024, we have presented 86 Amtrykes valued at over \$49,000 to children ages 18 and younger who are living with disabilities affecting their motor skills and strength.

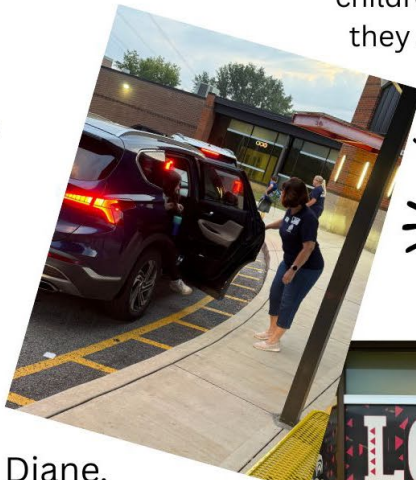

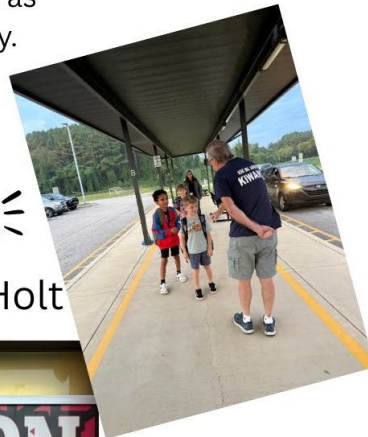

Since 2019, the program has produced 97 benches, 4 Ozark Hex Tables and 2 regular picnic tables from 22,700 pounds of non-recyclable plastic caps and lids, showcasing an innovative approach to community building and environmental stewardship. 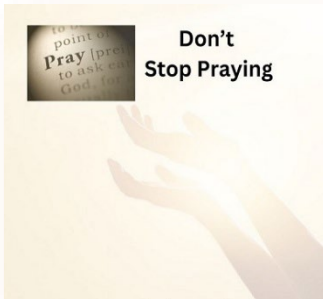
