

That resulted in only 1 school, Lenoir City Intermediate/Middle, in the competition.






We were one of 4 clubs to receive the Distinguished Club award for 2024-2025. Pat Humphrey earned the Superior Reporting Award.

Young Children: Priority One Committee

The Lending Library Program at Lenoir City Elementary School is every Thursday while school is in session.

Our Kiwanians serve as librarians, equipped with a cart full of diverse books. The kindergarten students independently select a book that interests them. This process not only empowers young learners to make their reading choices but also instills a sense of responsibility as they manage their borrowed books. Teachers supply folders containing useful reading tips for parents, ensuring that the reading experience continues beyond the classroom into the home. This endeavor fosters an environment that celebrates literacy and promotes lifelong learning.

Volunteers spend approximately one hour of their from 7:45 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. serving as librarians.



Early Childhood Literacy Young Children: Priority One Committee (Reading to Pre-Kindergarten Children)

The Early Childhood Literacy Program at Lenoir City Elementary School is designed to promote books and reading among Pre-Kindergarten children. Held every other Thursday, during the school year, this program complements the Lending Library initiative, providing a literacy experience. Volunteers read aloud to the children, capturing their attention and inspiring their imagination.

The interactive question-and-answer sessions that follow encourage curiosity and engagement, helping to develop critical thinking and comprehension skills. This program introduces children to storytelling and aims to lay a foundation for lifelong learning and literacy.

Volunteers begin at 8:30 following the Lending Library Project. They spend an hour reading to the Pre-kindergarten children.
