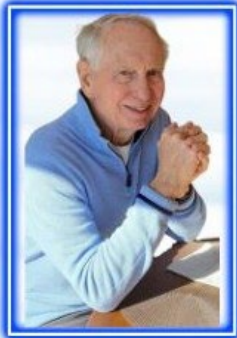

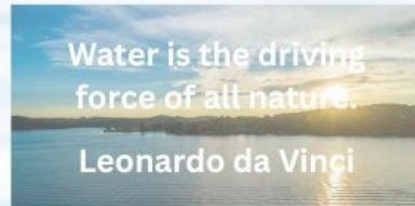

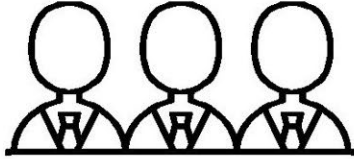
Over the years the Water Quality Committee has led many efforts to improve and monitor the water quality of the Tellico Reservoir Watershed. Most noteworthy of these efforts was the effort to improve the effluent from the Madisonville Water treatment plant. This effort took many years, coordination with other government and private agencies, and several court cases.

WATeR has also worked with other agencies to improve agricultural practices to lessen pollution runoff into the lake. These efforts are on-going. Agricultural runoff pollution is significant in this watershed because much of the watershed is located in rural, agricultural, areas.

Perhaps the most critical and unaddressed problem facing the watershed today is residential pollution runoff from the communities that have been built around Tellico Lake. Residents must be educated in how to avoid runoff and must be encouraged to change their lawn fertilizer methods and to grow boundaries that will lessen the runoff.

Additionally, the president-elect will attend the monthly Board of Directors meetings and preside over club/board meetings in the absence of the club president.

A Director is a two-year term position and serves on the Board of Directors.

(Responsibilities cover Officers & Directors): Provide general management of the club not delegated to the membership in our bylaws or club policy.

Assure the club complies with applicable governmental rules and regulations.

Determine the good-standing status of members in accordance with club policy.

Ruthie Thornton gave an update on the Lions Academy. It is our club's International Project.

The Lions Academy stands as a beacon of hope in the challenging environment of Isiolo County, Kenya. Established in 1998, this private school has become a safe haven for children aged 5 to 18, offering education to both orphans and day students under the capable leadership of Head Mistress Harriet Nkatha.

Despite the region's semi-arid conditions and economic hardships, the Academy has persevered, moving to a new facility in 2007 funded by Ruth Thornton and her late husband, Paul of Tellico Village. Our Kiwanis Club is a strong supporter of the school.

The school has faced numerous challenges, including natural disasters and financial constraints, yet continues to provide a happy Christian environment that follows the national syllabus while imparting vital life skills.

The students are disciplined and driven, achieving high academic rankings, and excelling in national competitions. There are currently 120 students. Seventeen students have been accepted into college.

While the school struggles with rising food costs and relies heavily on donations due to a lack of local and national funding, the unwavering dedication of Harriet Nkatha and the community's support ensure that the children have a chance to break the cycle of poverty and pursue their dreams.

With the help of God and the prayers and assistance of others, it is important for this school to survive.

Their efforts, along with those of other volunteers, were crucial in organizing and distributing food items efficiently and compassionately.

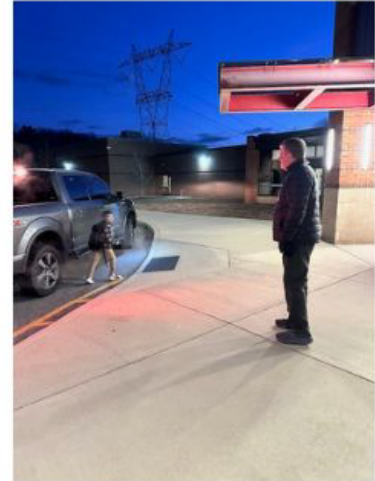

and camaraderie.

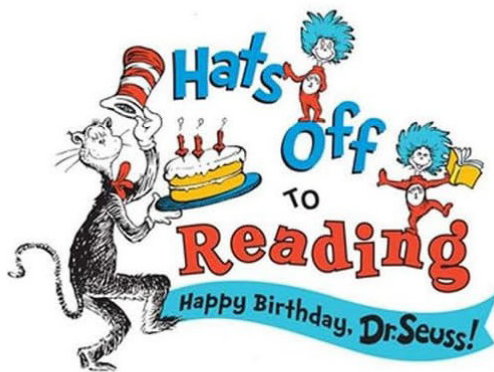

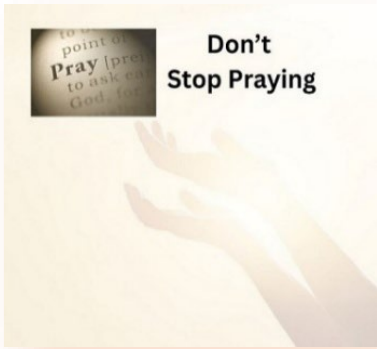
