A BENCH for Caps

ABC Program (A Bench for Caps)

A Bench for Caps Program is environmentally conscious, repurposing non-recyclable plastic lids and bottle caps into benches and tables. Since its inception in 2019 by Kiwanian Kevin Meyer, the Tellico Village Kiwanis Club's A Bench for Caps Program has produced 133 benches, 4 Ozark Hex Tables, and 2 regular picnic tables from 30,000 pounds of non-recyclable plastic, showcasing an innovative approach to community building and environmental stewardship.

To date that equates to over an incredible 2.5 million non-recyclable pieces of plastic caps and lids collected, equaling 15 tons out of landfills.

You can donate caps and lids by dropping them off at the Community Church at Tellico Village, 130 Chota Ctr. Loudon, TN. There is a Wishing Well located under the long staircase in the church lobby.

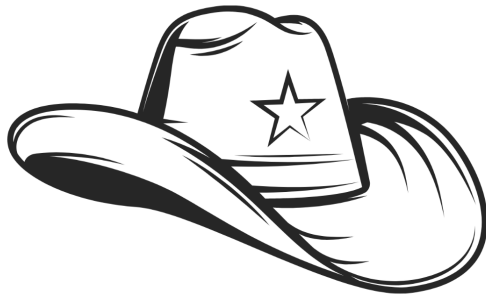

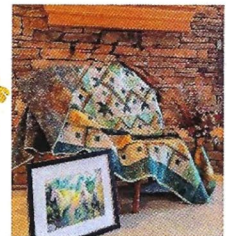
