# **Program/Speaker:** Laurie Weller-Environment Matters: Revamping our Schools with Digitally Printed Graphics

The Thompson's daughter gave a wonderful PowerPoint presentation on the above topic. Laurie is a freelance write and some of the work is for a printing industry. Certain printing businesses are focusing on the education & public health market and helping to create better environments for children. There is a movement underway to make our educational institutions & other youth settings more conducive to learning & thriving, especially in underserved neighborhoods, which are often neglected.

In the past, we relied on traditional paint, paper & canvas to refresh a space and put up bulletin boards and framed artwork to get children inspired. But today, there are amazing digital innovations that can turn an entire campus in to a better experience for the children.

Wide-format printers today come in models to print on just about an surface-vinyl, plastics, metals, glass, canvas & fabrics. Some can even print on dimensional objects like ball or water bottles. This technology initially started with athletic directors who revitalized gyms & stadiums, but soon administrators wanted to have graphics installed all over the campus.

You will see in one photo below staircases with multiplication tables or book titles or even text from the Constitution. There is even a push to promote nutrition & keep kids on campus during lunch instead of going off to the local fast-food places in town.

At a pediatric ER room at an LA hospital was a typical dark sterile place. One of the Disney partnering companies provided funding & wanted to incorporate the Shrek character. However, the printer who was commissioned to do the work felt that might be frightening to a two-year old. They wanted something friendly & calming. So the ocean scene was developed you see in another photo below. The results have helped children get through their treatments with less anxiety.

It is exciting to see how educators and public health are embracing the new technology. Thanks so much Laurie for introducing us to this whole new world of art. It was all so fascinating. We welcome you back anytime you wish to visit.


