Program/Speaker: Neil Mottinger – JPL

It all began when his mom had him use a neighbor's telescope. He slept outside in a tent, and he miraculously saw the Galileo Satellite. He clearly loves his work; he has worked at JPL as a Navigation Engineer since 1967. He delighted us with a very interesting presentation!

MARS - In 1965, the Mariner 4 spacecraft made history when it completed the first flyby reconnaissance of Mars after a 228-day journey from Earth. In 1971, the Mariner 9 was the first spacecraft to orbit Mars. The spacecraft entered Martian orbit and began photographing the surface and analyzing the atmosphere with its infrared and ultraviolet instruments. At the time of Mariner 9's arrival, Mars was almost totally obscured by dust storms.

JUPITER - NASA launched the two Voyager spacecraft to Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune in the late summer of 1977. Voyager 1's closest approach to Jupiter occurred March 5, 1979. Voyager 2's closest approach was July 9, 1979. Photography of Jupiter began in January 1979, when images of the brightly banded planet already exceeded the best taken from Earth. Voyager 1 completed its Jupiter encounter in early April, after taking almost 19,000 pictures and many other scientific measurements. Voyager 2 picked up the baton in late April and its encounter continued into August. They took more than 33,000 pictures of Jupiter and its five major satellites.



Ingenuity Mars Helicopter

Designed for up to 5 flights over 30 days. It eventually completed 72 flights in just under 3 years. It operated on Mars from 2021-2024 as part of the Mars 2020 mission. Cost: 80 million dollars.



NASA'S EUROPA CLIPPER MISSION

Will visit the mysterious MOON to determine if it has conditions favorable for life. Europa Clipper will fly as close as 16 miles above the surface providing an unprecedented science investigation helping us answer one of the most fundamental guestions ever ... Are We Alone?

Scientists are almost certain a vast

ocean lies beneath Europa's icy shell. In 2024, the journey begins! Why Europa? Europa has the ingredients essential for life ... water, chemistry & energy.



Understanding the composition of these potential plumes could shed light on the makeup of its alien ocean.
