Program/Speaker: LCUSD Superintendent, Wendy Sinnette

Wendy said the LCUSD mission statement is "We are a learning community committed to personal growth & academic excellence.

She first mentioned the "Sagebrush" issue that started way before LCF was even incorporated. The families who lived in the Western part of LCF were required to be part of the Glendale school district. Finally in January a group of LCF community people went to Sacramento to present their case to the State Board of Education. It was finally settled that those people can elect to attend LCF schools or stay with Glendale. People can also apply for a permit one time. This should go in effect either in July of 2025 or 2026. It is the largest territorial transfer in the history of the state.

Save the date: April 22, 11:30am-1pm, there will be a LCUSD Budget Lunch to set goals and write a 3-year plan. Contact the district if you are interested in attending. There are currently 2,950 students in the District and 219 new residents. They also started last year a new "Grandparent legacy permit," which allows grandchildren of grandparents, who have lived in their LCF home for at least 8 years, to get a permit to attend LCF schools. Last year 8 students applied. This year it was 40.

She said there were new classes at the HS particularly in PE, which students always avoided. So they are restructuring the program with mor fun things. They instituted an art history class and culinary arts class similar to those TV shows. PCC instructors also are on campus teaching some college level classes.

Many of the students take classes involving travel. 7-12 band went to Ireland, all 5th graders attend Valley Forge for nearly a week, Chamber Singers just got back from Hawaii, and the Sister Cities Organization has an exchange student program too.

They added a new building at PCR and remodified buildings from the 1960's. Bond monies have to go to voter approved projects. The state of California has a huge budget deficit for schools, but our school district is in pretty good shape, thanks to the Educational Foundation, property taxes, etc.

Thank you Wendy for sharing all this information. We are all very proud of you as our leader and appreciate you taking time out of your busy schedule to visit.
