



Program / Speakers:

Major Adam Morales – Salvation Army Men's Rehabilitation

Joey Nappi – Program Resident

A very interesting presentation about the history of Salvation Army, established as a British organization in

1865 in London. All officers are ordained ministers of Salvation Army. Major Morales grew up in the Salvation Army church, and he shared a lot about his experiences. He has been assigned at the Pasadena Men's Rehabilitation Residence for 4.5 years, and his wife helps to run the facility. A transformation center that helps men with more than drug / alcohol problems, the program helps the residents work to correct issues that have become symptoms of deeper problems.

The Salvation Army is a NO-FEE and no insurance required six-month (and up to one year) residential drug and alcohol rehabilitation program. After completion of the initial six-month portion of the program, there are opportunities to continue living in the residence while taking advantage of vocational training, completing educational requirements, or starting employment and saving funds to successfully transition out.

Qualification for the program:

- Between the ages of 21-65 (Pasadena ARC accepts both men and women)
- Have the ability to do work therapy (performing tasks such as hanging clothes, sorting items, driving a forklift, being part of the kitchen crew, completing administrative tasks) while learning conflict resolution, good work ethic standards, team building, and self-discipline.
- Willing to participate in a Christian based program. All faiths are accepted, and no one is required to be a Christian.
- Must be clean and sober on the day of entry.

Each year, the program helps equip people to:

- Overcome social and spiritual problems, including substance abuse through group and individual counseling sessions, spiritual direction, holistic work therapy, and life skills development, program participants learn to overcome problems, including abandoning substance reliance.
- **Build work and social skills** the physical and spiritual components of the program equip participants with the tolls to provide for themselves and others as they set and maintain sustainable employment goals.
- **Regain health and stability** by developing a personal relationship with God as provided by Jesus Christ, many participants learn to depend on God for hope and relief.
- **Restore families** many who have been rehabilitated are reunited with their families & able to resume healthy daily routines. Children get their parents back. People get their lives back.

Joey Nappi is a current program resident. He is proudly clean and sober. He is gaining more and more confidence as a man. He is working hard, and thankful that this program is helping him learn how to be a better father to his 18-year-old and 8-year-old daughters. He did a great job talking to us about his experience in the program, and we all wish him the best!
