Program/Speaker: Glendale Police Department – Officer Amy Tate & Brisket Amy is a civilian employee of the Glendale Police Department. She had 4 other "norr

Amy is a civilian employee of the Glendale Police Department. She had 4 other "normal" dogs of her own, before she acquired Brisket, a trained service dog from Canine Companions (in Oceanside), back in November. It takes a long time and effort to find a dog that will be a match for a particular person. Brisket is 2 ½ years old. He is fed twice a day and weighs 68 pounds. From 2 months to 1 ½ years they are raised by families who learn what to do. Then the last 6 months they are sent to professional training centers, where they learn the commands etc. They are retired at about 10 years of age and the dog "owner", like Amy, has first choice of keeping him as her "forever" dog. If not, she can recommend family or friends.

Some dogs are often trained for one person or can be for many in a facility, like nursing homes, hospitals and even police departments. It costs about \$50K to train the dogs. That

is where donations come in. The LA Chargers actually sponsored Brisket and donated the full amount. He was seen at their stadium often and at special events. 50% of dogs that get trained are unable to complete the program as they may show a fear of something, or dislike an elevator etc., which disqualifies them for service. People are allowed to sign up to get a "rejected" dog as a home pet, but the sign up list is very long.

Trained dogs like Brisket are therapeutic for both victims and witnesses as well as police officers in the department, who often are involved in many stressful situations. Children in particular are reluctant or afraid to talk, but most kids all love a friendly dog. Brisket knows about 40 commands and Amy had him demonstrate some of them- from barking (Speak) to picking up sunglasses on the floor (Get). They get small treats when they are asked to perform. She showed us a special rope that can be attached to doors and drawers, which enables a dog to open them. Rehab centers work well with dogs, as sometimes people do not like doing workouts, but dogs will get them to do tug-of-war exercises or taking the dog for a walk. Amy travels a lot in her job with Brisket to elementary school presentations, events (like at USC) or later today for the Special Olympics and of course our club this morning. When schools are out in the summer, she will visit often Vacation Bible Schools. Every day is different! We all fell in love with Brisket! Thank you Amy and Brisket for visiting us today. What a remarkable service you provide. We presented Amy with a \$500 check to the Glendale Police Department K9 Unit.
