Program/Speaker: Joy Gibson Craft Talk

Joy started out by saying he "was born at an early age" in Pasadena. So he didn't exactly give us a date but I think he's close to 90. His dad was a pastor at different churches. He even remembers hearing on the radio on Dec. 7, 1941 that Japan had been bombed. He grew up near Bakersfield and joined the Air Force after school and moved to San Antonio. He also went to a tech school there. He met Barbara, who was a teacher and had a mix of white, Hispanic and black students. They got engaged before he went to boot camp and got married after boot camp. Then he was sent to Victorville and trained on a fighter plane. He probably would still be there, however Barbara did not like the dust storms in Victorville. His parents could not afford college, so he learned a trade and went to barber school. He could have graduated from high school early, but he didn't have 4 years of PE, so he had to make that up. He actually enjoyed cutting hair and continued to do that on the side for 17 years. He tried engineering, but failed miserably at it. His brother suggested he try law school. So they went back to TX and attended Southwest University at night and worked as a barber at a men's clothing store. Barbara continued to teach. They eventually moved back to Pasadena and after a couple of firms he eventually found a fit and stayed 45 years in the same office. He didn't handle divorces, but was involved mostly with estate planning.

He and Barbara have 3 sons, 6 grandkids and 4 great-grandchildren. He has been very involved with his church in Sierra Madre since 1961 and their social life revolved around the people they met there. But recently he has decided to look for a new church as his former one has made a lot of changes. As you know, Joy is our "Salvation Army Bell-ringer" chairperson since he joined our club in 2001. He actually joined a different Kiwanis club in 1971, where he first got involved with SA. He has been on their AA advisory board for a many years. He certainly has been a long-time Kiwanian and we as members over the years have certainly enjoyed his jokes at Happy/Sad Bucks time. Thank you Joy for giving us a little peek into your life and giving all of us such joy over the years at our Kiwanis meetings!
