Program/Speaker: Westminster Gardens – Bernadette Chang & Erica Cox

These two ladies are sales counselors for Westminster Gardens – a life plan community where the Johnsons reside currently. They also handle Royal Oaks where Joan McGee lives. The place is owned & managed by HumanGood, a non-profit corporation since 1949 and facilities in a number of states. As we reach retirement years we have several options: stay in our own home, move in with a family member or move to a retirement facility. There are many challenges when one ages: money, health, driving, home safety & maintenance, etc. Choosing a retirement plan has many options and one has to decide when is the time to move and make these decisions-where and how to pay for it.

Most places take people in at 55 or 65 years of age, and for couples, though only one has to meet the age requirement. No children are allowed to live there permanently, but pets often are. There are a variety of options out there: 55-plus communities, stand-alone assisted living, stand-alone skilled nursing, home care and a life plan community. Westminster has a one-time entrance fee and then monthly billing which is actually more affordable than many people think. They have 1 & 2 bedroom options with a 3rd option of including a garage. It includes nutritious meals, cable, most utilities, home & lawn maintenance (inside & out), security, transportation to medical appointments, educational & fitness classes, pools, own washer & dryer, full kitchen, and many other activities etc. You will have priority access to higher levels of care, if ever needed. Bernadette suggests you look at your current home expenses and compare the costs. She gave each of us a packet full of information to guide one in this decision-making process. Thank you so much for making such a valuable presentation to us senior citizens.
