We hope Joe will be home soon. He also mentioned our speaker Tim Nistler, whom he has known for a long time, when he used to deliver food to Friends in Deed. He said he compares Tim to people who were born in the "Greatest Generation." Insook Park gave a very ecstatic \$10 for the cataract surgery she had recently, and now no longer requires contact lenses or glasses. She is just amazed at the difference. Jack Labrie pledged \$10 and told us on Zoom that members are welcome to stop by and say hello if they are in the area-Encinitas. You can join him for a delicious lunch at his new place.







Program/Speaker: Friends in Deed-Tim Nistler

Tim has been the Program Director of this wonderful organization since January 1, 2013. **Dick Barley** introduced him and they have become good friends over the years. Tim talks about the hunger around the world and he started volunteering at their food pantries early on before he became their director. Their motto is "Doing together what we cannot do alone." He explained how the organization came about. Back in 1894 churches in Pasadena saw a need for providing food to women whose husbands were not around-off to war, or in prison or died or whatever other reasons. Then in 1961 a person's garage was used as the storage and pickup place for food for women. Eventually in 1978 Friends in Deed was formed as a food pantry. They have many programs besides the pantry: The Women's Room where they can shower, do laundry, nap or use computers; Bad Weather Shelter, which operates at various churches, one is across from the Pasadena Salvation Army; Eviction Prevention & Rental Assistance etc. They also have special events like "Back to School" and Christmas gifts too.

When Tim first started working here, the pantry was providing about 230 families a week and now they are at 610. They first had 4 employees and now have 25. About 100 volunteers help out regularly. Everything is free with guidelines. They must provide a name, ID, & approximate income. All kinds of people show up-some for short periods of time and some all the 11 years Tim has been there. The pantry is open from 10am-3pm on Wednesdays and 10am-1pm on Thursdays. The LA Food bank provides a lot of food too. Brian Hummel does his Kiwanis food run on Saturdays to the Friends in Deed. There are limits to what a person receives based on each situation and # of people in a family. "Food Forward" organization picks a lot of fruit and vegetables, which they give to the food bank. Also Farmer's Markets help too. One time a place gave them 800 dozen eggs! They have an 8'x10' outdoor frig and freezer. Also outside on serving days, they have a "More than free" table that has no limit of how much people can take. These items might be bruised produce, or canned goods (like carrots) that don't always appeal to people, or canned goods that might be a few weeks beyond their "best used by date." Dick Barley also said the place is clean as whistle and spotless. Thank you Tim for sharing so much information with us. Your organization is doing so much good in the world by providing food for those in need.
