Christie gave out several prizes: Dick Barley won for "Demands Respect" as Julius Caesar, Insook Park won for "Most Beautiful" with her gorgeous original Korean gown; Cindy Bradford for "Most Innovative" with her stethoscope, mask & bloody doctor's gown; and Chuck Hughes for "Most Ugly" with no real costume on at all.













Program/Speaker: Girl Scout Founder Juliette Low aka Miss Daisy aka Christie Crahan aka President of our club.

A little about Christie. She has been a girl scout for 68 years starting as a Brownie and then as a Campus Gold in college. She took a troop up the back side of Mt. Whitney while in college, served on the planning committee in Kenya for their international camp for 270 girl guides and scouts from around the world. She was also a Camp Commandant & Music Director. She received the "Evergreen" award for LCF, given to 1 scout volunteer a year. She in the National "Juliette Low" presenting as her, about her all over the country & in Europe. During Covid she did 180 virtual presentations to girls in 37 states. She is also a national song leader & recipient of the "Thanks" badge, the highest volunteer award. What a background in scouting!

Girl Scouts were founded in 1912 in England and were call girl guides, whereas here in the US they are called girl scouts. Juliette was born on Halloween in 1860 & her nickname was Daisy. Juliette's home was in Savannah and that is where she is buried wearing her full uniform and her Silver Fish Award. However, she did live in England for 20 years. She married a wealthy man in 1886, but he died in his 40's. She passed in 1927 from breast cancer and was 67.

Christie shared with us one of the many questions she gets asked. A little girl wondered if she was really Juliette Low. Her response was no, not in person, but in spirit, yes. Christie has been in many parades, including the Rose Parade. She explained about her uniform- a belted khaki jacket and skirt. It was to resemble one from 1919 and was made by 2 Armenian women. The buttons are original brass & she has a replica of the Silver Fish Award, that Juliette received in 1918 in England, which is the highest honor in Girl Guides/Scouts. Only 3 US people have received one. The fish represents the salmon who have an arduous swim uphill to spawn. The pocket-knife attached to her uniform is over 100 years old. She explained about the emblem on her hat and the gold cord around it.

Thank you Christie for sharing this history with us and some of the experiences you have enjoyed playing this historic lady.
