<u>PROGRAM:</u> Surviving 911 ~ Kevin Danni

Kevin is a St. Francis High School Alumni, a friend of Barbie Elands son (Rob), and a La Cañada resident. Immediately after high school graduation in 2001, he was hired by Morgan Stanley as an intern. His 6 week sales training in New York began on 9/10/2001, he arrived a day early to explore the city. He recalls looking down outside the highrise hotel to see the Statue of Liberty which looked tiny from way up there! There were 300 people taking the sales

training in the Morgan Stanley offices in the World Trade Center. During the first day of training he made plans to meet another trainee on the observation deck on the 110 floor / top of the World Trade Center the next day during a break after a morning session.

9/11/2001

His morning began on the bus from the hotel to the World Trade Center, the weather was just beautiful so he was looking forward to seeing the sights from the observation deck. The speaker in the first training session spoke 15 minutes longer than scheduled, which meant that the free time before the next session was not long enough to visit the observation deck as planned.

Had he gone up as planned, he would not be here today!

Instead he was in the Morgan Stanley office on the 61t floor of the South Tower in the World Trade Center, he was 20 feet from the window and could see what looked like confetti falling outside. At closer look he saw that the North Tower was on fire. An alert instructed everyone in the Morgan Stanley offices to stay in the office, but Richard Rescorla (Morgan Stanley's vice president of security) ignored that alert and called for immediate and mandatory evacuation of employees and insisted that everyone use the stairs. Kevin did as told and started down the stairs and at each floor the stairwell more and more people were entering so it became very crowded. He recalls people trying to be helpful to those that needed help navigating the evacuation. One of the managers carried a women down 30 floors to the ambulance. When he was on the 55th floor, the plane hit the building. Kevin continued down the stairs and passed at least 40 fire fighters going UP the stairs on their way to help everyone they could. Kevin reached the ground level and exited the building and when he turned around and looked up he saw that both towers were on fire. He is thankful that he did not witness any jumpers that day. He was walking away from the buildings so that he could call his family. When he was 10 blocks away, the tower collapsed and he started running away in hopes to stay out of the dust cloud coming his way. He was young, and fit and was able to out run it thankfully. He went back to the hotel where all the trainees where staying to check in. There were 20 trainees missing, come to find out that they were people that lived in NY and they went directly home instead of the hotel.

He shared that Richard Rescorla supervised the evacuation of Morgan Stanley's employees from the burning building. Among the 13 employees and consultants who were unable to exit the building safely was Rescorla. He was last seen climbing up the stairs to make a final sweep for other employees minutes before the building toppled. His actions that day are credited with thousands of lives, he left no man behind.


Kevin stayed in New York for one more day, then took a train to Boston to stay with his uncle because there were no car rentals or planes flying. After a few days in Boston he was able to fly home to be with his family, and as he entered the airplane the captain was there to assure passengers that he would get everyone there safely.

He chooses to focus on the amazing courage of the rescue workers. All of the survivors from his company were committed to recognizing local fire fighters in their hometowns and actually visited in person to express appreciation for their bravery.

Kevin shared that there were K9's on site searching the rubble. Some of the dogs were trained to search for live survivors, and some dogs were trained to search for cadavers. Unfortunatly, the dogs were showing depression because they were not finding anybody alive so the rescue workers were hiding so that the dogs could find pleasure in finding people. Wow.

Kevin survived the near death experience that day, and was given a 2nd chance. In 2017, he went to the 911 Memorial in NY. A very emotional experience.

After the dissaster, 50 of the 300 trainees quit. The Morgan Stanley office moved to New Jersey. Currently, there are 10 of this group still working with the firm. And ... 24 years later, Kevin is still working for Morgan Stanley in Pasadena.
