Program/Speaker: Journey House – Jesse Aguiar

This wonderful program is located in Pasadena and Jesse is the Executive Director of Journey House. The place provides services for former foster youth who have aged out of the regular foster system. They support former foster and probation youth to live fully independent, successful lives. People are 19 or older and they are helped with housing, education, employment and independent living counseling. Three of his staff today were also with him to hear the program.

Journey House is 41 years old and it was the vision of Brother Tim Mayworm to offer disadvantaged young boys in Los Angeles County a quality education, and an opportunity for long term normalcy and stability. In 2010, Journey House added services for female former foster youth.

They have quite a few events, but the biggest and probably best is the "Graduation Gala," which celebrates youth who have graduated from high school, trade or tech school, college etc. There are some who even get their PhD's. They currently service about 450 in the program, of which 200 are very active.

Jesse himself was part of the system long ago. He was very different from now with a shaved head and lots of issues back then. What an amazing transition he has made to be head of the organization now. In fact the first member of Journey House years ago is still connected with them. So many of the youth form friendships and connections with the participants there. Social workers all over LA County can refer youth to the organization. They do not take anyone with addiction issues but of course make assessments on all youth who are accepted to the programs they offer.

This wonderful organization gets no money from the government and depends on donations, which go to fund & support students-like text books for school, a new car battery etc. The Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) program was founded in 2022 to support the development of artists and creative people that have experienced the child welfare system. VAPA has assisted our community members in creative projects in the following fields: Photography, Dance, Music, Painting, Screen Printing, Creative Writing and Graphic Design. We presented Jesse with a \$250 donation for Journey House and hope to have our board discuss about giving them more. Thank you so much Jesse and staff for sharing your "story." What an amazing organization.
