Program/Speaker: Beacon Housing-Paling Ngaotheppitak-Executive Director

Beacon Housing's goal is to provide safe, sustainable, high-quality, and well-designed lodging options to enable tenants to achieve housing security. Their portfolio encompasses both transitional living program for families fleeing domestic violence as well as affordable rental accommodations for eligible low-income households. They began this program in 1996. They rely a lot on volunteers to help with everything from painting inside a house to needing assistance with accounting and legal work. They service about 130 people a year, who can live at their properties for up to 2 years. They currently are at 100% capacity. They

also provide children with educational services such as field trips and after school instruction. Many households have dual languages. They run a 5-week summer program for about 25 children. Recently they took children to Huntington Gardens, who had never been there before.


Currently they have a matching contribution goal for \$25,000. They are about halfway there. 75% of their monies are funded from the rental income and 25% from grants and donations.

Located in Northwest Pasadena, Garfield Agape Court offers 43 units of various sizes at below fair market rates to low and very low-income individuals and families. The building is ideally situated close to public transportation and freeways.

Casa de Alegria serves women and children survivors of domestic violence. The early 1900's craftsman-style home has nine private bedroom and bath units. In this transitional living program, each woman is assisted to enroll in an educational program during their stay (up to 24 months).

Lowe House, located in Northwest Pasadena, serves those working towards self-sufficiency. The property provides affordable permanent housing for low-income individuals and families.




