

H.A.M.S.: Martha Burns gave a very happy \$10, as for months she has had a reservation at the Magic Castle for last Sunday with their 4 teenage grandkids, & fortunately it was not canceled. So everyone had a great time at the fabulous brunch and participating in their amazing magic shows. A wonderful place for any age. Insook Park gave 20 grateful bucks to see us all today at the meeting. During the evacuation time period, she went to her son's house each day, but came home to her house in the evening. Chris Ecker also gave \$20 as he survived his 11 ft skylight above his bed which collapsed in the winds. Also his storage shed, full of his brother's papers flew 25' into the neighbor's yard and papers were everywhere. Carol Scheck was \$5 happy that her daughter & son volunteered at our LCF Library from 8am-5pm, where FEMA was processing all the people (mostly from Altadena) who lost homes in the fire. Chuck Hughes paid a thankful \$10 for all the people who worked on our local float. He told us they used batteries instead of fuel to work the moving parts and for the truck. The float won the "Crown City Innovator" Award for most outstanding use of imagination, innovation and technology. He said the flowers all have their own vials of water and beans and seeds were put on with tweezers. It is a wonderful educational experience for our HS students to learn about welding etc. Chuck has worked on every float since 1979, one year after they started. John Wray pledged \$10, first because he was so sad about all the fires going on in LA County, but totally overcome with happiness for all the concern friends of his all over the country had for him & Donna. They called and emailed and even offered them a place to stay if his house was inhabitable (it wasn't). It really affected him emotionally. **Christie Crahan** pledged \$25 as she came home from Maui on the Tuesday night the fire started and driving home was pitch black and USCVHH had a little light and so did CVS & Vons, but everything else was dark.

### **Program/Speaker:** Fire Awareness-John Wray

Our member John, former Glendale Fire Captain, says in his mind, he could still fight fires, but his body says NO! He retired 23 years ago. Everything we have seen this past week, he has seen before, but not at the level it is now. It was a very aggressive fire and there

are a lot of pointing fingers as to whose fault it was. Firemen need to know where the pumps are and also how much water supply they have and the amount of water pressure. If everyone is using hoses to protect their homes, the pressure drops drastically for firemen. A member asked why they can't use people's pool water. The pumps are only 20' long and they can't reach a pool usually. But if you have time, hosing down your house helps. The median on Angeles Crest has a water tank for fire trucks. Winds dry out the water dropped on homes.

Members asked about having generators, which John has. He does recommend them if you are concerned, however they can cost \$8K or more. He also warned us that our insurance rates are going to go up because of this. There are two factors: insurance for potential fires and real loss fires. The potential will go way up. He said insurance companies cannot cancel policies for a year.

He recommended plants and trees to be 5'-10' from a house and seal attics off. Stucco homes provide a bit more protection, but usually the eaves are wood. If you have to evacuate, don't close your shades or curtains. The heat from windows can easily set them on fire. Also take videos of everything in your home for replacement purposes. We certainly learned a lot today and we thank John for sharing such necessary information. Our hearts are saddened by the devastation for others however. La Canada and La Crescenta were very fortunate.
