

Program/Speaker: Sudden Infant Death Syndrome - Dr. Tom Keens

Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) is the sudden, unexplained death of an infant younger than one year old. It's also known as cot death or crib death. While the exact cause of SIDS is unknown, it is the leading cause of death for infants between one month and one year of age. About 2,500 infants die every year in the US because of SIDS and of that 150 are in CA. Fortunately the rate of deaths per years as declined as more people become aware etc.

Key Facts about SIDS:

Sudden and Unexplained:

SIDS occurs without any warning signs or symptoms, and the cause of death remains unexplained after a thorough investigation.

Age Range:

While SIDS can occur anytime during the first year of life, it most commonly occurs between 2 and 4 months of age.

Risk Factors:

Several risk factors have been identified, though SIDS can still occur in babies without these factors. These include:


- **Sleeping Position:** Babies who sleep on their stomach or side are at higher risk than those who sleep on their back.
- **Soft Sleeping Surfaces:** Soft bedding, pillows, and loose objects in the crib can increase the risk.
- **Exposure to Smoke:** Smoking during pregnancy or exposure to secondhand smoke after birth increases the risk.
- **Other Factors:** Premature birth, low birth weight, and male sex are also associated with a higher risk.


Prevention:


While SIDS cannot be completely prevented, there are measures parents can take to reduce the risk:


- **Back to Sleep:** Always place infants on their backs to sleep for naps and at night.
- **Firm Sleep Surface:** Use a firm, flat sleep surface like a safety-approved crib mattress.
- **Safe Bedding:** Keep soft objects, loose bedding, and toys out of the baby's sleep area.
- Avoid Overheating: Ensure the baby is not too hot or too cold during sleep.
- **Pacifier Use:** Consider offering a pacifier at bedtime, as it may help reduce the risk. **No Smoking:** Do not smoke or allow smoking around the baby.


Thank you Dr. Keens for sharing this information with us. Hopefully someday they might be able to prevent this type of death.





































Risk Factors **‡** Causes

- Some infants without risk factors will die from SIDS.
- However, infants with risk factors are at increased risk of dying from SIDS.
