Program/Speaker: The Netherlands-Brian Hummel

Brian attempted to show his photos from his I-pad, but for some reason he couldn't get it to connect, so we only have a few pix. The reason he goes to Holland? His son's family (wife & 2 daughters) live there now, and will be return back home in a year. He had to pace himself for his 3 & 5 year old grandkids. Fortunately there are lots of playgrounds everywhere. Most transportation is by bike, bus or train.

He informed us that the Netherlands are made up of 12 provinces and there is a North Holland where Amsterdam is located, and a South Holland where the Hauge is located. They stayed 3 days at a wonderful hotel at Hague on the beach and also visited Maastricht on the border of Belgium, and saw a beautiful medieval church & actual working water mills. In Amsterdam he visited the Rijks Museum. The dialect in the Netherlands is varied. Holland is often known for tulips, windmills, wooden shoes, and cheese. But he only managed to see and eat cheese! They also have lots of French fries, but they are served with mayo, not ketchup!

The Dutch are very thankful to their allies-Britain and the US. The largest parachute assault in the Netherlands during WWII was in September 1944, which involved over 35,000 American and British airborne troops descending into Holland to seize key bridges over 3 main rivers.
