Program/Speaker: LCF Educational Foundation-Ian Holloway, Board President
Ian is a professor at UCLA and volunteer parent president of LCFEF. He showed a short
video of all the projects and facilities that LCFEF supports and provides for students &
teachers in our school district. He just presented this same video to parents at the recent
"Back to School Night."

The state provides money to the LCUSD per child, but there is a nearly 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ million dollar gap that LCFEF raises during the year to improve the situation. At "Back to School Night" they receive close to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ million dollars.

They have 3 fundraisers annually to raise funds for their Endowment Acct, which was established by the Board of Trustees two decades ago. They are a 501 (c) (3) organization.

- 1. The Wine Auction, in the Rose Garden at Descanso Gardens on Sept. 27 at 6pm
- 2. Poker Night at Oakmont Country Club, which is a ticketed event with a silent auction
- 3. Spring Gala, in Hollywood on Mar. 14, with dinner & dancing. This year's theme is "Futuristic" and they also present two prestigious awards.

LCUSD has a current enrollment of about 4,200 students. Most are LCF residents, but children of employees who work in the city, like JPL, can request a permit to attend providing there is space available. Also grandparents who have lived in LCF a minimum of 8 years can "permit" their grandchildren into the district if they live in communities nearby. The Sagebrush area of LCF has finally been granted by the state to be part of our school district, after a 30 year "battle" with Glendale.

After the recent fires in Altadena, the Board also decided to help some of the 20 teachers in our school district who reside in that city and lost their homes.

The parcel tax of \$750 on your property tax bill was voted for by the residents in town. It is strictly for improvement of the infrastructure of the schools. Recently a new near-Olympic size pool was built at the HS. LCFEF also allows for smaller class sizes in elementary schools, support for the arts, drama, music & language programs I middle & high school.

California is 48th in the nation when it comes to spending for education. But LCFEF donates yearly to fix the gap necessary to educate our children. A good school district also keeps our property values high.

Thanks, Ian for a fabulous presentation with the slide show and information on LCFEF. It is so wonderful they have such an enthusiastic volunteer & excellent speaker like you to head up this extraordinary organization. We presented Ian with \$300 check for the LCFEF.
