Program/Speaker: Fire House Youth Center-Mary O'Keefe

The Firehouse is used as meeting center and safe house for local middle schoolers and teens is a mission of St. Lukes of the Mountains Episcopal Church, which was built in 1924-over 100 years ago. The old fire station 17, which is on church property is now used or the Youth Center, where they can do homework, play games or play the piano and other instruments in the music room. The Firehouse is open several nights per week to serve as a

safe place for teens to hang out, do homework and share fellowship. The Firehouse also serves a pancake breakfast once a week to middle schoolers who attend nearby Rosemont Middle School. This breakfast regularly serves over 100 students from 6:30-9am.

As a mission of St. Luke's of the Mountains, the Fire House has been able to reach kids that normally would not enter a church, or even a youth center. The youth center has been a place where kids feel safe, and the program helps kids who are in immediate need. The mentors at the Fire House have partnered with law enforcement, the fire department, Glendale school district, veterans, Boy and Girl Scouts, and many more in the community on a variety of events. But the most important function of the Fire House is to be a place where kids can feel safe and not judged.

A girl scout several years ago started a project of "recyling" prom dresses and they have over 300 that can be borrowed by girls from various high schools in the area including La Canada & La Crescenta. They have recently started receiving tuxedoes for the boys. The students help protect the property from graffiti and watch out for each other. There is also a "Cool Group" on Mondays to help the kids socialize & where they have dinner, movies, etc. The first and third Thursdays , there is a food bank open to the public at the church.

Thank you so much Mary for sharing passion with us. She and her friend Julie have helped to support the Youth Center with their time and money. We presented Mary a check for \$200 for the facility. A couple of years ago our club actually visited the site.

History

The stone building at 2563 Foothill Blvd. is part of St Luke's of the Mountains Episcopal Church but in 1924 it was LA County Fire Station 19, which is where we get our name from.

Tutoring

We have had peer tutoring on Thursdays after school for middle school students.

We will start the program up after winter break. We get our tutors from CV High

School and they earn community service hours.

Outreach

We have awariety of outreach programs that are created at the request of the students that include art classes, poetry sessions and photography exhibits.

CVHS Academy of Science of Medicine and the JROTC use the Fire House for food drives.

Prom Plus and Prom Plus Club uses the Fire House for meetings

We have over 300 prom dresses that we loan out to students from all local high schools in Crescenta Valley, La Cañada Flintridge, Burbank, Glendale and Tujunga.



The Future

We want to continue to serve the youth population but would also like to reach out to all adults who may need a safe place to gather. We are working with therapists to create a caregivers group to support those who are helping loved ones.

We are working with CHP to hold their Smart Start driving education program.

We work with CV Cares to help educate youth and adult on drug addiction and support.





Support

Many of the Fire House students were skaters. They wanted a place to skale and worked with the County of LA to create, and design, the CV Skatepark

We have lost several students due to car accidents, drug overdoses and death by suicide. The Fire House has been a place for them to come and get comfort. Comfort from their peers, and from caring adults.

The Fire House is a mission of St. Luke's of the Mountains Episcopal Church and supports our youth. They have offered this safe place in this historic place for their community.
