

Guest Speaker: Evie Barley

Early Years – On November 4, 1936, I made a grand entrance. My picture was on the front page of the local Marysville, CA newspaper. The reason being, I weighed 3 pounds 13 ounces and was the smallest baby born at that hospital. I was told at that time there were no incubators, and I was kept warm with hot water bottles. My parents had to leave me at the hospital for six weeks until I weighed enough to

go home. When I was 6 months old, we moved to southern California. My dad was a caterpillar tractor operator, and my mom was a stay-at-home mom. I am an only child. We lived in a 24-foot trailer house and moved around from job to job. In 1941 we moved to Oceanside, California. My dad took a job with a construction company grading streets at Camp Pendelton Marine Base as war was pending and the base was being enlarged. There I attended first, second and third grades. In school we had air raid drills. Instead of getting under desks we went outside and got in the ditches around the school and covered our heads. The coast of California was vulnerable by land and sea so at night all windows were covered with black shades and streetlights were blackened. We had ration books for food, gas & other necessities. Three years later we moved to Inglewood, CA where my dad took a job with a construction company grading the streets for homes in Westchester.

School Years - The rest of my school years were in Inglewood. When I was in Junior High School, my parents bought our first house. At Inglewood High School I played clarinet in the band, which included performing at football games, belonged to many service clubs and was in the Girls' Athletic Association. I played goalie in field hockey. I graduated with honors and was only absent from school one half day during all four years of high school.

I am proud to be a USC Trojan. I attended all the football games including the Rose Bowl game in January 1955 in pouring down rain. It never rains on January 1st. While at USC I belonged to Alpha Delta Pi sorority. I graduated with a bachelor's degree in elementary education. For graduation my parents bought me a 1957 T- Bird, white with black interior. I paid my parents back when I started teaching. My first job was with Los Unified School District teaching fourth grade in Westchester. There was only one teacher for each grade. LAX bought the property to expand so I was transferred to Cowan Avenue School which was on the hill above Hughes Aircraft.

Dick – While teaching at Cowan Avenue School, I was introduced to Dick by a sorority sister while attending a single young adult group which met on Sunday evenings at Westwood Methodist Church near UCLA. There were over 100 singles on the mailing list, most were from the Midwest seeking jobs in sunny California. Ten of them attended Dick's memorial service. We were married on June 23, 1962 (63 years ago) at the Inglewood, Methodist Church and lived in an apartment in Mar Vista. We eventually bought the house next door to my parents in Inglewood. I retired from teaching in 1965, when our daughter Karen was born. Two years later, daughter Kristen joined our family.

La Canada - The La Canada School district brought us to La Canada when Karen & Kristen were in third & first grades and Dick & I have lived in the same house for 53 years. When our girls were in elementary school **Marie Hyland** taught them piano lessons through high school. I joined the PTA, was a girl scout leader for both girls' troops. This is where I first met **Rosemary Hook.** I went on all the encampments and eventually became the Community Association Chairman of all 22 troops. This included planning and being responsible for 2 yearly campouts for all 22 troops first through 12th grade. When our girls were in elementary school **Marie Hyland** taught them piano lessons through high school. We met **Joe & Lynn Thompson** when Laurie & Karen were high school classmates and **Chris Echer** when Kristen and Chris were high school classmates.

Our older daughter Karen attended USC, majoring in Finance. She met her husband John Finnerty when both were working in Glendale at Heller Financial. They live in Scottsdale, Arizona. Their son Bill is married to Caroline. They presented Dick & I with a great-granddaughter named Madison, now 10 months old. They live in Grapevine, Tex. Our granddaughter Kaitlyn is an OT and lives in Phoenix, Arizona. Younger daughter Kristen attended UCLA majoring in economics and USC with a Master's Degree in accounting. She is a CPA. She met her husband Mark Mc Kinney while at UCLA and they live in Tampa, Florida. They have two daughters; Jenna graduated from University of Chicago playing four years of soccer. She now lives and works in Orlando, Florida. Kallie is attending Rice University in Houston getting a Master's Degree in business while finishing her fourth year of soccer. After the girls graduated from high school, I went back to teaching in Granada Hills. This time I taught second grade. At El Oro Way Elementary I was a training teacher and supervised nine student teachers attending Cal State Northridge. I also had the opportunity to attend a weeklong science program for teachers given by JPL. The culmination was a trip to Kennedy Space Center to watch a space shuttle launch, sadly the launch was aborted at minus 10 seconds. Dick and I did get to go to Lancaster to see the spacecraft land. I retired in 1997 after teaching a total of 20 years for the Los Angeles Unified School District.

Dick & I enjoyed going on outings with a T-Bird club. The first outing was to Yosemite, and I was overwhelmed on seeing 50 T-Birds in one place. We went on several cruises together our favorite was to the Baltic. One week a year in November for 10 years we would go to our timeshare in Cabo San Lucas. Fortunately, we sold it in January just before Covid.

Volunteer Service & Activities

I joined the Assistance League in 1983, now called Action League of the Foothills. I am currently a member of CAP, an affiliate which meets at night, and was the chairman from 2004-2005.

I volunteered at Verdugo Hills Hospital for 20 years until Covid, then retired.

I have been playing bridge with a group of 8 for over 20 years and play with another four.

I am in a Book Club as well as a bible study group.

I am the philanthropic chairman of Chapter OM of P.E.O. (Philanthropic Educational Organization) who provide scholarships to high school senior women and older pursuing their education goals.

Now I am a Kiwanian.
