KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL

Dedicated to serving the children of the world, this global volunteer organization annually raises almost US\$340 million and dedicates more than 7.3 million hours to strengthen communities and help children. Through service projects and fundraisers, Kiwanis members improve their communities, make lifelong friendships and, most importantly, help children reach their full potential.

ADULTS

Kiwanis International offers three types of clubs for adults: Kiwanis, Aktion Club and Circle K International. Kiwanis clubs serve their communities through more than 241,000 service projects each year. Aktion Club is the only community service club for adults with disabilities. It provides members with opportunities to become integrated into their communities while developing initiative and leadership skills. CKI is one of the largest student-led collegiate service organizations, with clubs on college and university campuses in 20 nations and geographic areas.

YOUTH

Kiwanis offers three clubs for youth: Key Club, Builders Club and K-Kids. Key Club is the oldest and largest service organization for teens and teaches leadership through service to others. Builders Club provides students age 11-14 with opportunities to develop leadership skills, improve self-esteem, increase civic engagement and learn life skills through service. K-Kids gives students ages 6-12 opportunities to work together on service projects, develop leadership potential and create strong moral character.

PROGRAMS

Kiwanis offers programs for students: Terrific Kids, Bring Up Grades and Key Leader. Terrific Kids and Bring Up Grades, both for students age 6-12, teach children to plan, set goals, work with others and celebrate success. Key Leader is a weekend experiential leadership retreat for teens.

Maryville Kiwanis Foundation has sponsored Imagination Library in Blount County

since 2005. We have raised over \$600,000 and mailed over 625,000 books with the goal of improving youth reading performance by providing a free age appropriate reading book to every young child, age birth to five

years old each month. We serve about 5200 young children in Blount County (74% of eligible children). Books are purchased from funds raised by Maryville Kiwanis and the Tennessee Governor's Books from Birth Foundation. at a total yearly cost of over \$100,000.

Children may register at birth at Blount Memorial Hospital on a form provided to all new mothers, at the Blount County Public Library, or online at www.blountimaginationlibrary.org.

Children become better readers if we read to them and encourage them to read more, resulting in better school performance at an earlier age.



SERVING AS PROUD SPONSORS AND SUPPORTERS



Leadership Adventure Camp - Since 2003, the Kiwanis Club of Maryville has brought together promising eighth graders from Blount County middle schools for one week each summer to learn leadership skills from local community leaders and club members. These future leaders experience camp activities such as rock climbing, canoeing, hiking, and archery having fun while they learn the importance of leadership and service.

Kiwanis Aktion Club - Kiwanis Club of Maryville is proud to sponsor its own Kiwanis Aktion Club which allows local adults living with disabilities to participate in community service projects, gain leadership skills, to serve their community and become more involved in society while demonstrating their dignity and value as citizens.

Circle K International - Maryville College's Circle K Club is sponsored jointly by the Kiwanis Club of Maryville and Alcoa Kiwanis. It is self-governing and elects its own officers, conducts its own meetings, and determines its own service activities. Circle K blends community service and leadership training with the opportunity to meet other college students.

Key Club International - Maryville High School and Heritage High School Key Clubs are sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Maryville. Key Club assists Kiwanis in carrying out its mission to serve the children of the world. Student members of Key Club learn leadership skills while performing acts of service in their communities, such as cleaning up parks, collecting clothing and organizing food drives.

Kiwanis Builders Club - The Kiwanis Club of Maryville sponsors Builders Clubs at Eagleton Middle School, Heritage Middle School, Maryville Junior High School and Montgomery Ridge Intermediate School. Builders Clubs are student-led community service organizations that operate under school regulations. The members learn leadership skills through planning and implementing service projects.
