Adopt-A-Highway, Amtrykes, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Blount County Elementary School Libraries, Blount County Public Library, Blount County Youth Court, Bottle Cap Benches, Boys & Girls Club, Builders Clubs, CASA, Circle K Club, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts, Key Clubs, Kiwanis International Foundation, K-T District Kiwanis Foundation, Leadership Adventure Camp, Newspapers in Education, Read for Success, ReUnite, SalvationArmy, Second Harvest Food Bank Back Pack Program. **Leadership Adventure Camp** - Since 2003, the Kiwanis Club of Maryville has brought together promising eighth graders from Blount County middle schools for one week each summer to learn leadership skills from local community leaders and club members. These future leaders experience camp activities such as rock climbing, canoeing, hiking, and archery having fun while they learn the importance of leadership and service.

**Kiwanis Aktion Club** - Kiwanis Club of Maryville is proud to sponsor its own Volunteer State Kiwanis Aktion Club which allows local adults living with disabilities to participate in community service projects, gain leadership skills, to serve their community and become more involved in society while demonstrating their dignity and value as citizens.

**Circle K International** - Maryville College's Circle K Club is sponsored jointly by the Kiwanis Club of Maryville and Alcoa Kiwanis. It is self-governing and elects its own officers, conducts its own meetings, and determines its own service activities. Circle K blends community service and leadership training with the opportunity to meet other college students.

**Key Club International** - Maryville High School and Eagleton College & Career Academy Key Clubs are sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Maryville. Key Club assists Kiwanis in carrying out its mission to serve the children of the world. Student members of Key Club learn leadership skills while performing acts of service in their communities, such as cleaning up parks, collecting clothing and organizing food drives.

**Kiwanis Builders Club** - The Kiwanis Club of Maryville sponsors Builders Clubs at Eagleton College & Career Academy, Heritage Middle School, Maryville Junior High School and Montgomery Ridge Intermediate School. Builders Clubs are student-led community service organizations that operate under school regulations. The members learn leadership skills through planning and implementing service projects.



**Maryville Kiwanis Foundation** has sponsored Dolly Parton's Imagination Library in Blount County since 2005. We have raised over \$600,000 and mailed nealy one million books with the goal of improving youth reading performance by providing a free age appropriate reading book to every young child, age birth to five years old each month. We serve about 5000 young children in Blount County (74% of eligible children). Books are purchased from funds raised by Maryville Kiwanis and the Tennessee Governor's Early Literacy Foundation. at a total yearly cost of over \$120,000.
