
### President's Corner



Connect with A Child has facilities in Nairobi Kenya and Siaya Kenya. Siaya is a very remote village close to the Uganda border. The mission group treated patients (over 1,000 for the two years) in the slums of Nairobi and in Siaya.

As part of the trip they spent some time on safari - Masai Mara National Reserve in 2018 and Amboseli National Park in 2019. One of the photos, the lioness in bush, was made in Masai Mara. The photo showing a group of people, who were patients waiting to see a doctor, was made in Siaya, and the others were in Amboseli. The mountain in the background is Mt. Kilimanjaro.
