





Finance & budget

Administrative account

- Income from club dues, meal charges, new member fees
- For administrative expenses of club

Service account/Maryville Kiwanis Foundation

- Income from public fundraising projects or contributions
- Cannot be used to pay club administrative expenses of the club
- Imagination Library is largest project



Membership costs

Total Dues - **\$307 per year**, paid quarterly.

Dues breakdown - \$107 Kiwanis International dues (includes \$22 liability insurance, \$8 for subscriptions \$20 Kentuck y- Tennessee District dues, \$180 Mar yville Kiwanis dues

Meals - \$17 per meal, paid quarterly.

Total cost including dues and meals is \$61/month. Former SLP members pay no new member fee and pay \$20 for the first 2 years of dues.
