September 2 Meeting Notes

Speaking on *Today's Financial Markets & Services* was Shane Smith, a Certified Financial Planner and more recently a Chartered Financial Analyst. He has been part of Quality Financial Concepts in Maryville since 2011.

It is not unusual to hear a good financial planner to say you should focus on the long term. Shane gave several examples of the wisdom of this strategy and several where emphasis on short term gains resulted in no better, and oftentimes worse, performance for one's portfolio.



He emphasized how young professionals may not realize the importance of early entry into financial planning. In the past, reliance on the pension plan was depended on to provide that cushion between work and retirement. With pension plans now giving way to individual retirement accounts (IRA), the burden falls more squarely on the shoulders of the employee to plan for the future. Employers most often provide some contribution to the IRA but only as an incentive for personal contributions.

We should all heed his caution that our future well being is dependent on how we manage saving across the spectrum of our earning years. Each age and the specifics of your job stability, health, and your own specific goals play an important part in why a professional planner is necessary.


August 19 Weeting Notes

Both Maryville and Alcoa have their own government structure and fortunately for us all, they each are well-managed and complement each other much more than compete with each other.

Coming to Alcoa from a position as Assistant City Manager for Covington, Kentucky, Bruce Applegate brings an impressive resume in city governments to his position as Alcoa City Manager since 2021.



The City Manager is an appointed position of the elected Commissioners and is responsible for ensuring Commission policies are carried out, presenting the annual budget, and the recruitment, hiring, termination, and supervision of Department heads and staff.



The City of Alcoa now has over 15,000 residents who support a budget of over \$180 million. A great deal of planning goes into the 600+ page Capital Planning Sheet from which the annual priorities are identified. As part of these plans the City brings in businesses that add to the sales tax base and are coordinated with resident and apartment complex developments. Each trip up Alcoa highway past the airport brings into view the tremendous development taking place along Tesla

Avenue and the Covenant Campus with other expansion along Topside Road, Springbrook Farms, Pellissippi Place and the Middlesettlements area.

Both Alcoa and Maryville are known statewide for their educational excellence and sports domination. It is a tribute the management of both cities that they have largely contributed to making our community a vibrant and attractive place to live.
