DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

January 31, 2015

The second meeting of the 2014-15 District Board of Trustees was held on January 31, 2015 at the Kiwanis District Office, Harrisburg, PA. Governor Bob Raub presided. The meeting was called at 9:30AM

The invocation was provided by Trustee Ann Graves

All board members were present.

Guests included Jeff Rose, Matt Wise, Bill Henning, Mike Coolbaugh, Darlene Anderson, Ben Osterhout and Tracy Smith.

Region VI Trustee Megan Kuffa has submitted a letter of resignation. That letter of resignation was accepted.

Candidates to replace Megan Kuffa were solicited and two Kiwanians have submitted the proper forms to be candidates. They are Mike Coolbaugh of Wyoming Area and Jeff Rose of Allentown Northeast. Both candidates addressed the board. After consideration, the board selected Mike Coolbaugh and Mike was immediately seated as Region VI Trustee.

Membership & New Club Building (See the pages marked 14-23)

(Note: This portion of the meeting actually occurred at 1:00PM)

Formula Chair Cathy Szymanski spoke to the board via a phone call.

Growth in existing clubs was discussed. An incentive contest is being developed to help spur existing club growth.

New clubs were discussed. Efforts are underway or have been discussed in Warrington, Norristown, East Norriton, Back Mountain, Reading, Columbia and Hughsville.

The need for action and urgency now was discussed.

Consent Agenda (See the pages marked 24-57)

The items on the consent agenda were considered. The board approved all items on the consent agenda.

Comments were made by guests present.

Discussion and Action items

Extensive discussion and review of the 2013-14 & 2014-15 budgets took place. See pages the pages marked 57A to 59.

Review of District investments and account balances took place. The investment report and account balances are on the pages marked 60-65.

The District Holiday party was reviewed. The financial report on the 2014 party is on the page marked 67 with the page marked 68 offering a comparison from 2013.

The District Super Raffle was discussed with a focus on plans for the 2015 raffle sale. See the page marked 69 for a report.

The District shirt sale was discussed.

Extensive discussion took place on vacant Trustee and Lt. Governor positions for 2015-16. See the page marked 70.

Club officer training and the master instruction position and certified instructors were discussed. We need to fill the master instruction position. A candidate is considering accepting the position but has not yet committed. Discussion will take place between the Governor and Governor-elect on how to proceed.

A review took place on the 2015 Midwinter Conference registration and sponsorships.

Key Leader was discussed. See the page marked 77 for information on the 2015 Key Leader program. Conversation took place on the establishment of a western Pennsylvania Key Leader conference as well as potential changes to the overall Key Leader program. Any ideas and information on the conference should be shared with Key Leader Chair Stef Patounas.

Information was shared on the 2015 District Convention in Erie. See the pages marked 78-81.

Spring Regional meetings were discussed. See the page marked 82 for updated information.

The 2015 Kiwanis International in Indianapolis was discussed. Registration is now open. Discussion took place about having a District dinner or breakfast at the convention. After discussion, Executive Director Kevin Thomas was directed to explore having a breakfast in conjunction with the District Caucus on Thursday, June 25, 2015.

The clubs not paying dues for 2014-15 was reviewed. Please see pages marked 86A to 86C

2015-16 Board Meeting dates were discussed. See the page marked 87. The dates were approved as presented for 2015-16.

The location of the April 18, 2015 board will be the District office.

A report was provided on the Kiwanis Day at Citizens Bank Park/Philadelphia Phillies. See the page marked 88. The report was accepted as presented.

Background checks and the District policy were discussed in light of the recent changes enacted by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. There was considerable discussion about what can and should be the Kiwanis approach and policy moving forward. At the present time, no action was possible because of all the uncertainties surrounding the implementation of this new law. More review and discussion will be necessary before a new District policy can be implemented. The new law requires a policy be in place by July 1st.

The District office lease was discussed. See the pages marked 97 and 98. After the new lease proposal is received, the committee appointed to study this will reconvene and consider a new lease at the present location and what other options might be the best possible alternative for the District. The target for completing this will be April 18th.

Laws and Regulations Chair Matt Wise provided a report on the process to update the District Board Bylaws and policies in accordance with the new Kiwanis International Standard Form of Bylaws. See the pages marked 98A to 98F. The target to get the bylaw portion of this done is April 18, 2015. The revised/new bylaws will be adopted at the District Convention in Erie.

At the last meeting District Governor-elect Jen Vare was assigned the task of reviewing the District Strategic Plan and beginning the process of making revisions necessary to make the plan measurable and relevant. However, Governor-elect Jen was told at Governor-elect training that all Districts will be asked to adopt a plan based on the new Kiwanis International Strategic plan; information and a template will be sent on this from Kiwanis International in the near future. Accordingly, Governor-elect Jen is recommending we not proceed in revising our current plan and instead we wait for the information to come from Kiwanis International. Governor Raub indicated, and the board agreed, that was a sound path to follow at this time and Governor-elect Jen is to keep us informed on what comes from Kiwanis International.

A report was provided on District Awards. See pages marked 100 – 101. After review and discussion, Governor Raub asked Trustee Kate Feryo to continue with this review by bringing others on her committee and come back to the board at the April 18th board meeting with specific recommendations.

The District Commonwealth of Pennsylvania License Plate program was reviewed. A report is on the page marked 102. By proper motion, second and vote, the recommendation in the report was accepted.

The Keystone Kiwanian was discussed and reviewed. Also considered were budget constraints and issues related to its publication. After consideration and discussion, it was decided by proper motion and vote that the current issue being developed would be the last under the current format and editor. The board was, also, directed to consider and develop thoughts on the future direction and format of the Keystone Kiwanian and come to the next meeting with thoughts and recommendations on its future direction.

The District Foundation nominating committee was discussed. Governor-elect Jen Vare was appointed by Governor Bob Raub to chair this committee, organize a committee and carry out the duties of the committee in accordance with the District bylaws and policy.

At the last board meeting, the board had voted to provide no time on the convention agenda for the Past Lt. Governors Association meeting. PLGA president Darlene Anderson addressed the board on this decision and provided written information which can be viewed as the pages marked 103-104. After Darlene's presentation, a motion was introduced, seconded and approved to rescind the motion approved at the September 27, 2014 board meeting and provide time for the PLGA to have its meeting during the convention.

A proposal from the Kiwanis club of Hanover for a special dinner celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Kiwanis was discussed. See the page marked 106 for more information. After discussion by the board, it was agreed that we would offer support to disseminate information on the event but the District would not provide financial or planning support for the event, if it moves forward.

Trustees were reminded by Governor-elect Jen to start giving consideration for dates for the Governor's Official Visit/Fall Meetings.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 3:24 PM.

Nittany

The Nittany Kiwanis Club and Pre K for PA combined together with Santa to visit local day cares and preschools. They also co-sponsored a Pre K for breakfast with the State College Club. they are known for the work they do with Pre K. Bill is heavily involved with Pre K which helps keep the club focused.

Each one of these clubs is truly unique in their own way, however; over all they are all dedicated to their community and continue to amaze me.

DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING September 27, 2014

The first meeting of the 2014-15 District Board of Trustees was held on September 27, 2014 at the Kiwanis District office. Governor Bob Raub presided.

With the election of Jen Vare to the position of Governor-elect, the position of Region VII is vacant and the board must appoint a replacement. Kate Feryo from the Kiwanis Club of West Chester has submitted a nomination form. After consideration, a motion was made, seconded and approved to appoint Kate Feryo as Region VII until September 30, 2016. See the pages marked 5-8.

At future meetings, board members will be asked to relate a Kiwanis message and/or thought. The order of presenters, starting with the February 1st meeting, will be Keith Smith, Megan Kuffa, Mark Mishinski, Judy Janes, Kate Feryo, Ann Moffitt, Ann Graves, Kevin Thomas, Rick Relyea and Jen Vare.

Membership & New Club Building (See the pages marked 12-24)

Formula Team Chair Cathy Szymanski led a discussion on new club building and membership.

The decision of the Elk County Kiwanis club to surrender its charter was discussed. The club decided to disband because they did not like getting information from Kiwanis and being told they needed to change to adopt to the Kiwanis way.

New clubs in Warrington, Kennett Square and East Norriton Curves are targeted for the first quarter of the administrative year.

Revitalization in Region 2 was discussed. Rebuilding the Bedford club was discussed.

A through discussion on membership was conducted.

A motion was introduced to send a letter to members of Kiwanis clubs that disband/surrender their charter offering them membership in another club; the Formula Team will develop the letter that will be sent out from the District office. The motion was seconded and approved.

Consent Agenda (See the pages marked 9-11 and 25-58)

The items in the consent agenda were approved by proper motion, second and vote.

Discussion and Action items

The situation of the new Pittsburgh Airport Area Club, the Sewickley Club and the Moon Township Key Club was discussed. See the page marked 59. It appears that this situation may work itself out but it is possible that the District may need to intervene in some way.

Club Leadership Education was discussed. See the pages marked 60-61. Mark Mishinski has submitted the application to become the District's master trainer, which is a 3 year commitment. Discussion centered on the training which took place and what needs to be done moving forward in the future.

Discussion took place centered on the Lt. Governor vacancy in Division 2W. After discussion, a motion was introduced, seconded and approved to combine Divisions 2W and 2E into one Division, Division 2.

Vacancies in Divisions 4, 5, 6 and 8 were discussed. It was proposed that Divisions 4 and 5 be merged. A motion was introduced to merge Divisions 4 and 5 pending feedback from the clubs. The motion was seconded. After further discussion, the motion was tabled.

A meeting will be setup during the week of October 20th to have a meeting in Division 17 to discuss future leadership in the Division.

Regions III and IV will be holding trustee elections at their fall meetings. Region IV has a candidate, Bill Henning from the Kiwanis Club of Bald Eagle and Nittany Valleys. Region III has no candidate; discussion focused on this. A list of potential candidates will be developed and vetted.

2015-16 Lt. Governors were reviewed; see the page marked 62A. Divisions 12N, 13N and 22 have candidates in addition to those listed.

The evaluations and financial report from the 2014 Kiwanis District Convention were reviewed. See the pages marked 67-73.

Fall regional meetings were reviewed.

November 5, 2014 at 8:00 PM was established as a date to have a District Board Conference call to approve the Midwinter Conference agenda/program and budget.

The Investment and Account Balances reports were reviewed. See the pages marked 75-79.

An update was provided on the 2014-15 District Budget and finances. See the page marked 80.

An operating budget for 2014-15 was reviewed and considered. See the page marked 81. The budget was approved as presented by proper motion, second and vote.

A District Board finance committee was appointed to review and make additional budget recommendations. The committee will be chaired by Keith Smith. Jen Vare, Rick Relyea, Bob Raub and Kevin Thomas will be members of the committee.

The 2nd annual District Holiday Party was considered. See the page marked 82. The party was approved as proposed.

A report was provided on the 2013-14 District Super Raffle. After review of the 2013-14 raffle results, the raffle was approved for the 2014-15 year.

The electric choice program with Ambit was discussed. The District is receiving about \$17.00 per month from the program. The program has not gained traction. After discussion, another promotional push will be put together and sent out across the District.

A proposal from Dominion energy to market natural gas to Pennsylvania Kiwanis Members was considered. See the pages marked 89-90. After discussion, a motion to table the proposal was introduced, seconded and approved.

A proposal to consider increased compensation for the District Executive Director was discussed. The proposal would involve using the District's American Express points and would result in no salary increase. The proposal was approved as submitted.

The District office lease was discussed. The lease expires on September 30, 2015. Notice of intent to renew or not renew has to occur by June 30, 2015. A committee was appointed to study the lease situation and options. The committee will consist of the Bob Raub, Jen Vare, Kevin Thomas, Rick Relyea and Naomi Fredlund. The committee will report at the January 31, 2015 Board meeting and have final recommendations ready by the board meeting on April 18, 2015.

The procedure that the District will need to follow in adopting the new form for District bylaws was discussed. See the page marked 93. The District Laws and Regulations committee chaired by Matt Wise will be in charge of organizing and establishing the procedure to be followed. Everything will need to be finalized by the board meeting on April 21, 2015.

The Key Club District 2015 Convention Budget was considered. See the page marked 94. The budget was approved as presented.

Governor Mark Mishinski reported on the review of the District strategic plan. See the pages marked 95-100. After review, the recommendations in the report were accepted and Governor-elect Jen Vare will lead a committee to implement the changes recommended in the report.

A report was provided on Early Childhood Learning and Development. See the pages marked 101-102.

The request by the Pre K for PA to have the Executive Director serve on the Leadership Council of the Pre K for PA campaign was considered. See the page marked 103. The board approved the request.

A proposed fundraiser involving the Philadelphia 76's was considered. A meeting will be set up with the 76's representative and Bob Raub, Mark Mishinski and Kevin Thomas to explore this program further. The board approved the committee moving forward as long as there was no financial commitment on behalf of the district.

A discussion focused on clubs not submitting the new standard form of club bylaws. See the pages marked 108-110. The laws and regulations committee chaired by Matt Wise will be following up with the clubs that have not submitted the new bylaws.

A discussion took place on the Kiwanis Philadelphia Phillies baseball game. At this time no formal action was taken. A discussion will take place to insure that the information put out on the game does not indicate it is a District event. A discussion will, also, be held about involving the District Foundation as a participant in the 50/50 held at the game.

A discussion took place on the Past District Governors committee and the Past Lt. Governors association. After discussion, a motion was introduced, seconded and approved to no longer provide time on the convention agenda for a meeting of the Past Lt. Governors at the convention.

At the suggestion of Kiwanis International, the District discussed adopting a spousal travel reimbursement policy. After review, the board adopted a policy that the District will not pay for any kind of spouse/partner travel.

Discussion took place on District Awards. After discussion, a committee was appointed to review the awards. That committee will consist of board members Kate Feryo and Megan Kuffa. They will be tasked with reviewing the District awards and making a report at the January 31st District Board meeting.

The District Board considered a request to allow a District Life Membership to be transferred from one member to another. After discussion and consideration, the board determined by proper motion, second and vote to not allow this to happen.

By proper motion, second and vote, it was decided to allow Trustees who are visiting clubs in Divisions with no Lt. Governors to be eligible for the same mileage stipend as are Lt. Governors when they visit clubs in Divisions without Lt. Governors.

The Kiwanis License Plate with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania was discussed. There has been considerable different information coming from the Department of Transportation regarding how the program works. After discussion, it was decided to test the process with one application before submitting additional applications.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 3:35 PM. The next meeting is presently scheduled for January 31, 2015 at the Kiwanis District Office.

SLP and Alumni Coordinator's Report to District Board

K-Family Graduates

We are currently evaluating the conversion of our existing alumni network into a K-Family Graduates program for SLP alumni. A similar program has been implemented with great success in the Rocky Mountains District.

The objective of this program is to keep SLP alumni engaged in Kiwanis. The program was designed to accommodate the lifestyle of recent student graduate, including those who plan to relocate in order to attend college or pursue a job opportunity.

Program Details

- Enrollment: Key Club or Circle K alumna elects to participate in the K-Family Graduates program.
- The alumna is given membership in a home club or district if home club does not recognize program. Home club is defined as the club sponsoring the SLP club.
- Cost to alumna: Fees and dues are assessed according to SLP alumni guidelines.
 - As of 12/1/14: KI new member fee and District Dues waived year 1. KI and District dues waived for years 2 & 3 – magazine and insurance fees assessed.
- Requirements of membership: Complete two service projects per year and attend a minimum of two meetings of a Kiwanis organization per year.
- · Renewal process: Complete proof of participation and renewal form annually.

This program will be entirely voluntary. Voluntary alumna enrollment will help to ensure that program participants are engaged. Voluntary Kiwanis Club participation will help to ensure that only clubs that are prepared to engage with alumni and that are both willing and able to complete the additional administrative responsibilities are involved.

PA Kiwanis Family Large Scale Service Project (LSSP)

The Second Annual LSSP will be held on **August 13, 2015** in **Erie** as a part of the District Convention. Alumni and all members of the Kiwanis family will be invited to attend this service event.

PA Kiwanis Foundation Scholarships

The District Foundation has renewed funding of the \$75.00 scholarship for each participant. We are extremely appreciative of this support.

New this year: this scholarship is automatically applied to the registration when a student applies. This streamlines our existing application process as participants no longer need to enter a special discount code (this had been required in previous years).

Program Cost Increase

The cost to attend Key Leader is established by Kiwanis International. This year, that cost was increased by \$50. With the PA Kiwanis Foundation and Kiwanis Foundation scholarships available, the costs to attendee Key Leader are as follows:

Key Club/Builder's Club students: \$150 All other students: \$175

This increase represents only the second fee increase during the 10 years this program has existed. However, we did express concern regarding this increase and its potential impact on attendance to the KI Key Leader leadership team. Additional conversations are currently taking place at the International level regarding alternative methods of delivering Key Leader programs to ensure that the event is financially feasible. We will continue to update the District Board as information becomes available.

Event Promotion

Key Club and Kiwanis club officers/advisors have received promotional materials for Key Leader via email and the fall mailings. Kiwanis clubs that had sponsored students in the past or expressed interest in sponsoring students this year have been contacted by phone and email to discuss identifying students to attendee the event. There will be a Key Leader presentation and workshop during Key Club convention.

Our Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation has been busy working to promote Kiwanis programs throughout the Pennsylvania district.

At our December 2014 meeting, our Foundation:

- Approved a \$5,000 grant for the Kiwanis Club of Dillsburg to create a playground at a local elementary school.
- Finalized scholarships for the 2015 award cycle, including 4 4-year Key Club scholarships (\$1,000 per year), 3 1-year Key Club scholarships (\$1,000), 3 1-year Circle K scholarships (\$1,000), a dependent scholarship (\$1,000), and the Neiman Endowed Graduate Scholarship (\$1,000). New for this year is that all applications will be able to be submitted electronically and reviewed by the six member scholarship committee.

Two MBA students from the University of Pittsburgh have been selected to work with our Foundation to perform an external analysis and provide recommendations to the board.

To streamline our efficiency at board meetings, we have requested officers and board chairs to submit reports ahead of time and they are distributed to the board for review prior to the meeting.

Our Foundation needs the support of all Pennsylvania Kiwanis members. Our Foundation cannot continue to provide program support without financial resources. Please encourage clubs and members to make our Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation a philanthropic priority. In the next couple months, our Foundation will be sending out a direct mail appeal to members of the Pennsylvania District.

1. Describe your region new club building activities:

There is not enough new club building in Region 4. Division 12 North leads in looking for new club opportunities; Liberty Kiwanis continues in becoming a successful club. The Region 4 Lieutenant Governors continue to seek new club possibilities, and advocate for them at Division and Region interclubs and conferences.

2. Describe your region activities to support and strengthen existing clubs:

Division 12N has shown the most growth recently, thanks largely to its LTGs, although it lost the Loyalsock Club, which surrendered its charter. 12S LTG Shirley McPherrin is very active in contacting her clubs, by visits and frequent messages and division news. She has held a Division Council meeting, and plans to have more. 14 LTGs Paige and Allan Michael are serving for another (their final) year, and are trying to find ways to help their smallest and most struggling clubs. All Region 4 LTGs recognize that there are clubs in their divisions that are in trouble, especially with low and declining membership, including some that are below charter strength.

3. Describe education activities in your region:

Region 4 has successful live CLE Workshops each summer, and expects to have another one this coming July or August, probably again in Lewisburg. We have session facilitators for Presidents, Secretaries, and Treasurers. 2015-16 club officers will again be encouraged to complete their annual online CLE training by the end of June. The most recent (2014) CLE materials have been distributed to all Region 4 clubs. See Paragraph 5 below concerning Region 4 Conferences.

4. What is your region doing to support youth/SLP?

Kiwanis Clubs' relationships with their sponsored Service Leadership Programs are receiving substantial emphasis in the PA District, but there needs to be more emphasis in Region 4 on improving these relationships. Some clubs have good relationships with their SLPs; others need to improve. Some clubs invite Key Club and Circle K members to their division inter-clubs; there needs to be more of this kind of interaction. Buffalo Valley AM Kiwanis is involved in Camp SETEBAID, a camp experience for children with diabetes. It is held each summer, and is always very successful. Kiwanians from other clubs assist with the camp. Mifflinburg Kiwanis joins with their Key Club in their semi-annual highway cleanup, as they did in October, 2014, and expect to do again in April or May, 2015. Mifflinburg continues its program of members reading to young children.

Division 12 South Key Clubbers form an important part of Kisses for Kids; see Paragraph 5 below. They tend to be our best solicitors of donations.

5. What should the board be aware of in your region?

Division 12 North hosted a Joint Officer Induction Ceremony for several Kiwanis Clubs in Williamsport on October 2, 2014. The ceremony was in conjunction with a "Murder Mystery Dinner". Both the ceremony and the play were great successes. Some of the actors were local Kiwanians. The Region 4 Fall Conference was held October 4, 2014, at the Foss Home at Geisinger Medical Center in Danville. Our guest speaker was Buffalo Valley AM Kiwanis member Mark Moyer, Executive Director of SETABAID Services in Winfield PA. Other speakers were Past District Governor Ethan McBeth, who spoke on the Eliminate Project; District Governor Bob Raub, who delivered his Governor's Message, including his 2014-15 District Goals; and PA District Executive Director Kevin Thomas, who spoke on administrative requirements and highlights. All speakers were excellent and well received. Arrangements are in process for the Spring 2015 Region 4 Conference for a Saturday in April or May. Division 12 South will hold its annual Kisses For Kids the weekend of February 13-15, 2015 at the Susquehanna Valley Mall in Selinsgrove. The event benefits the Children's Miracle Network (CMN) at Janet Weis Children's Hospital at Geisinger. LTG Shirley McPherrin organizes it. Each 12S club, and many Key Clubbers, staff the tables during the weekend. The event involves more than 30,000 Hershey Kisses. We ask for a one-dollar donation for a bag of ten Kisses. We usually raise between \$2500.00 and \$3000.00 for CMN each year.

6. Other information for the Board:

Bill Henning of Bald Eagle and Nittany Valleys Kiwanis has been elected Region 4 Trustee for 2015-18. Division 12 North's system of co-lieutenant governors serving alternating two-year terms continues to work well. The LTGs are in place for 2015-16, and one will continue in 2016-17.

- 2. Kiwanis International Convention Registration is now officially open. There are many new registration options. The registration fee itself has increased significantly to \$275.00.
- 3. The International Convention schedule is very much refreshed and different and celebratory in nature. A couple of outdoor parties. Education on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday.
- 4. Any outstanding club invoice (including dues) can be paid by credit card and shortly electronic checks.
- 5. Kiwanis International may be able to shortly tell us which clubs have and have not filed a form 990. This should help us to help clubs avoid trouble.
- 6. Electronic voting is coming to Kiwanis International that will enable all clubs to vote on officers and/or amendments without being at the convention. The exact timing and format is to be determined but it probably will be here by 2015-16. The District will need to consider if the time has come for us to permit this. - 7. Kiwanis International will be seeking an increase in dues at the 2014 Convention. The exact amount and format are to be determined. 





District Chair Report to Board of Trustees Laws and Regulations Committee

At the September 2014 meeting of the District Board, it was requested that this committee begin a review of the process to update our District Bylaws in order to modernize them using the new Standard Form for District Bylaws as provided by Kiwanis International.

Currently, we are in the process of comparing our current bylaws to the new form and are noting the items that are in our current bylaws that are not in the new form. We will then provide recommendations to the Board as to if we should put them into District Policy or find a way to incorporate them into the bylaws, based on approval from Kiwanis International.

Simultaneously, we must also review the past 10 years of District Board meeting minutes to determine if any policy decisions were made that will need to be written into our District Policy Code. Governor-elect Jen Vare volunteered to review the minutes and provide the preliminary information back to the committee.

Any items that we wish to retain in our current bylaws not already provided for in the new form must be sent to Kiwanis International prior to the April meeting. Most likely, there will not be any issues with this, but we do not wish to rule anything out at this point.

As soon as these two processes reach completion, a committee of the Chair, Executive Director, Governor, and Governor-elect will be formed to discuss the findings of this preliminary review and to collaborate on final recommendations to the District Board, which will be presented at the April 18, 2015 meeting.

Upon final approval by the District Board, the newly proposed District Bylaws will be distributed to all clubs within the Pennsylvania District with notice attached that these will be finally ratified during the House of Delegates at the 2015 District Convention in Erie, PA on August 15, 2015.

Note: In the unlikely event that Kiwanis International does not approve any items that we may wish to retain in our bylaws rather than policy, we have built into the process time to negotiate and have the District Board ratify any said changes that are a result of these discussions at the July meeting.

Attached, for your review, is a Summary of Changes between the current and new versions of the Standard Form for District Bylaws. Please feel free to review – it is very explanatory. Any questions may be directed to this committee at any time during this process.

STANDARD FORM FOR DISTRICT BYLAWS:

SUMMARY OF CHANGES BETWEEN CURRENT AND NEW VERSIONS

Overall

- Reduced the number of articles from 21 to 16, renumbered accordingly.
- Generally clarified and streamlined all wording.
- Reduced references to "delegates and delegates-at-large" to simply "delegates."
- Replaced the word "chairman" with "presiding officer."
- Added the word "qualified" when referring to candidates for office.
- Instruction notes were revised and clarified throughout.
- Added definition of "club" (means club in good standing) and "active member" (a member in good standing with his/her club), which apply through the bylaws.

Purpose and Structure

- Incorporated the revised purpose of districts, as determined by the K.I. Board in 2012.
- Added another point to the district's purpose: to promote the interests of district clubs to Kiwanis International. This promotes two-way communication.
- Provided that the district board not the district House would determine the number and area of divisions.
- Deleted the provisions that clubs are not in good standing if they are 60 days in arrears
 or if they fail to send delegates to the annual district convention for two years in a row.
 Good standing is defined by Kiwanis International and could therefore include other
 factors.

Officers

- District officers may include other positions as required by applicable law and/or as may
 be desired by the district, as long as they are stated in the district's bylaws (including
 qualifications, terms, duties, and the election of appointment process) and provided the
 persons filling the offices are Kiwanians.
- A district officer's *club* must be in good standing for him/her to hold district office.
- Allow a district to determine additional qualifications for district officers or candidates,
 as long as such qualifications are provided in its bylaws, not its policies.
- Removed the requirement for the Secretary and Treasurer to be bonded. (Instead, districts should have crime insurance; however, insurance is not a bylaw provision.)
- Group together and expand the *general* duties required of *all* district officers to include normal expectations such as supporting programs of the district, attending required meetings, etc.
- Clarify the duties of each individual officer, including:
 - Added specific growth and SLP elements to the governor's duties;
 - Adjusted the training duties of the governor-elect;
 - Eliminated the requirement for the secretary to attend Kiwanis International conventions and councils;



- Allowed two of the secretary's duties regarding funds and accounting to be given to the treasurer;
- Clarified the roles of lieutenant governor vs. trustees, when the district has both offices.
- Stated that the district secretary-treasurer may have the title of executive director.
- Clarified that, if the district employs the Secretary or Treasurer, the employment relationship supersedes the officer relationship.
- Clarified that the district board has ultimate oversight over divisional meetings (and regional meetings, if the district has them).

Board

- The district board will be referred to simply as "district board," rather than "district board of trustees."
- District board members may include other positions as required by applicable law
 and/or as may be desired by the district, as long as they are stated in the district's bylaws
 and provided the board members are Kiwanians.
- A quorum of the district board would now be a majority, rather than one-half. (This is an increase of only one person.)
- State that the district board may adopt policies and procedures.
- Provide that the governor will determine the time and place of district board meetings.
- Provide for special meetings of the district board, with only 3 hours (not 3 weeks) required notice.
- Deleted detailed rules regarding how electronic board meetings are conducted, which belong in district policy or procedure instead.

Committees

- Provide that the district may have standing committees beyond those required by Kiwanis International.
- Changed all references to "mailing" notice to "notifying," allowing for electronic methods commonly used today.
- Deleted the statement that district committees may meet and conduct business in the same manner as the district board. How committees operate belongs in district policy or procedure instead.
- Clarified that the Governor appoints all committee chairs and members (not just special committees), subject to district board approval.

Conventions

- Require that only 60 days notice (not 6 months) must be given to the Kiwanis International Executive Director prior to each annual district convention and to provide that district clubs also receive 60 days notice.
- Removed some of the administrative process for electing club delegates for district conventions. This is up to each district to decide (or, barring any rules, each club).

- Allow current and past lieutenant governors to represent clubs in their divisions not
 otherwise represented by three delegates at district conventions. They are not restricted
 to representing only a club that otherwise would have no delegates. However, if the
 district is in danger of not meeting quorum for the convention, lieutenant governors should
 first be designated to represent additional clubs vs. clubs who already sent one or two
 delegates.
- Provide that, if the annual district convention must be cancelled due to an emergency,
 the preference will be: (a) to reschedule it; or (b) to hold a meeting of delegates-at-large.
- Clarify and revise the process regarding convention resolutions so that:
 - o The district board may propose resolutions after the deadline for clubs;
 - The district board shall have final authority on district resolutions;
 - Clubs must receive 30 days advance notice of all resolutions other than those of memoriam and appreciation (that is: any resolutions of substance).
- Broadened provisions regarding standing rules for the district convention, removing administrative details that should be at the district's discretion.
- Deleted the statement that the district board may be guided by the house of delegates in choosing district convention locations. Since it is not a requirement, it is up to each district, and the board may solicit house guidance on any subject.
- Deleted the statement that club invitations to hold district conventions must be delivered in writing to the district secretary. This is up to each district and should be stated in district policy or procedure instead.
- Allowed any elected member of the district board, selected by the board, to act as
 presiding officer at the district convention in the absence of the Governor.

Nomination and Election of Officers

- Districts may determine whether to allow officers nominations until the business session begins or to stop them at an advance deadline of their choosing.
- Clarified that nominations from the floor for *any* district officers (at the convention or at division/region election meetings) may only be made for *qualified* candidates (that is: those that meet the stated qualifications).
- Clarified the role of the credentials and elections committees.
- Revised provisions regarding the election of lieutenant governors and trustees:
 - The elections may be held as late as the annual district convention.
 - Clarified confusing language regarding "personnel" and "representatives."
 - Each club may send three voting delegates to the election meeting, two of whom should be the club president and president-designate (rather than the president and immediate past president).
 - There is no longer any reference to "one vote for each club representative present."
 Only club delegates may vote.
 - o Reduce quorum from 2/3 of the clubs to a majority of the clubs in good standing.
 - o Lieutenant governor elections may be conducted by either the incumbent lieutenant governor or some other position designated by the district.
 - o Non-delegate club members shall also be invited as non-voting attendees.

 Deleted the statement that the lieutenant governor and trustee election meetings "shall be guided by the principles, traditions, and precedents of Kiwanis International," since Kiwanis does not provide such guidance.

Vacancies in Office

- Clarified that the provision regarding a vacancy in immediate past governor shall be filled as indicated, *regardless of the reason for the vacancy*.
- Clarified provisions for filling a vacancy in lieutenant governor, depending on the length of term remaining.
- Added a statement that, if the election of any district office is incomplete for any reason, the district board may fill it as a vacancy.
- Added a statement that the "disability or inability of a governor-designate to serve for the year for which elected shall first be determined by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the entire district board-designate." (This is per K.I. Bylaw provisions.)
- Changed the vote required to elect an Acting Governor from 2/3 to majority.
- Reduced the vote required to fill a vacancy in lieutenant governor or trustee from twothirds to a majority.

Public Activities

 Replaced the article on Public Activities with one paragraph that the district shall not be used for political purposes.

Removal of Officers

• Incorporated the revised provisions on conduct unbecoming and failure to perform the duties of officer, as previously adopted by the Kiwanis International Board.

Revenue

- Removed the statement of a specific dues amount from the bylaws—but retained the requirement that the dues may only be amended by the house of delegates.
- Added a provision for districts to use if they charge clubs for more than district dues and new member add fees, provided such charges are approved by the district house of delegates.

Finance

- Provided that the district's annual financial examination shall be made available to district clubs, upon request.
- Deleted two statements that the expenses of district officers may be paid by the district.
 Since it is not a requirement, it is up to each district board to include or not include in the district's budget.

Other Authorities

 Clarified that the district bylaws, like the club bylaws, must comply with all applicable laws, and clarified the authorities that apply beyond the club bylaws. Added "District Policies or Procedures" as one of the authorities districts should consult
on matters not addressed by the bylaws. Also allowed districts outside of North
America the option to state a parliamentary authority other than Roberts Rules of Order.

Amendments

- Clarify and revise the process regarding district bylaw amendments so that:
 - o The district board may propose resolutions after the deadline for clubs.
 - Require that amendments conform not only to the Kiwanis International Bylaws, but to the Standard Form for District Bylaws as well. This is because the Standard Form encompasses best practices for districts.
 - o Amendments which are in conformity with the Kiwanis International Bylaws and the Standard Form for District Bylaws may be effective immediately, unless a later effective date is stated. Amendments not in conformity, as determined by Kiwanis International, are not effective until or unless approved by the Kiwanis International Board." ("Conforming amendments," must first be verified by Kiwanis International as such before they may become effective immediately upon adoption.
 - Added a new provision: "If the Kiwanis International Bylaws are amended in such a way that necessitates revisions to the Standard Form for District Bylaws, [choose one: __the district house of delegates shall amend the district bylaws to reflect such revisions or __the district board shall amend the district bylaws to reflect such revisions and shall inform clubs and members." Also added timeframes for adption of those amendments.
 - What was the separate article on "Approval of Kiwanis International" is now incorporated into the "Amendments" article.

Other

- Added requirements that the district should incorporate or otherwise register with the government as required by law.
- Added a provision about proper dissolution.
- Stated the administrative year of a district, which was not previously stated.

Review of Current District Awards

- 1) PA District Club Newsletter Contest In order to recognizing the changing times and increased role of technology in communication, it is recommended to alter this award to include social media. Perhaps a panel of judges can evaluate the Facebook page of Kiwanis clubs who submit an application to participate in the new award. In addition, to the judges viewing the information online, clubs can submit a basic screen shot or print a sample of some of the information relayed via social media. Another option would be to submit a short paragraph explaining how/why they have effectively used social media in their club. It would be difficult to evaluate something like Twitter because it's more difficult to see something like permanent record or long-range history of the news shared. Curious how many applicants have we had in this category over the past 3 years?
- 2) PA District Club Brochure Contest While it is still important for clubs to create and use club brochures for recognition & networking, the use of a website is another very important tool to share the news and contact information of clubs. This should be added to the criteria or change the focus all together to internet based. Another thought is to adjust it to be a "business card" focus rather than brochure since many clubs are taking advantage of the "template" available from International. We could at least add the business card as an option or alternative. This card can highlight important information like how to contact the club with an email address (i.e. membership chair), listing the district website, and/or the club website, how to connect on Facebook/twitter, etc. with some graphics or mission statement. The categories/ colored divisions remain appropriate for both contests.
 - While the newsletter is more geared towards "internal use" with club members & the brochure is more geared towards attracting and education the general public about Kiwanis, both media forms serve the same purpose of sharing information. We could consider combining these first two awards and call it something related to "Kiwanis Branding" or "Marketing & Media Tools" award. The purpose being an opportunity to recognize clubs for their effective & creative use of media and distributing information, or related to the use of electronic/internet based forum rather than paper copy.
- 3) <u>Distinguished Kiwanian Award</u> this award continues to be appropriate and is a nice mix of achievable criteria with a bit of a higher standard. The only question would be the "perfect attendance for 9 consecutive months". Perhaps consider adjusting that to 9 out of 12 months?
- 4) George F. Laning Interclub Award this still seems appropriate. I'm not sure that all clubs have a copy of the most recent criteria. Perhaps it's a good idea to re-send electronically to secretaries and presidents or have a few copies available at Mid-Winter for folks to pick up.
- 5) <u>District Multiple Service Award</u> no information available. This appears to be based upon monthly reports submitted by club secretaries.

- 6) Prayer Breakfast Award This award seems to be "outdated". Not many clubs continue this practice, and clubs are now a bit more inclusive in their religious affiliations. Although this award ties into the human & spiritual values object of Kiwanis, perhaps there is a better way to recognize this important aspect of our organization. A new award can be created with the title of "Human & Spiritual Values". A committee can be formed to determine what that should look like.
- 7) <u>Distinguished Club</u> I'm not certain we have much ability to revise this award as it is based upon the criteria determined by International. However, if possible it seems appropriate to amend the first criteria of net growth & take out the requirement of clubs being 15+ in order to qualify. Small clubs working hard to increase their net growth should be recognized (even more in my opinion). In addition, the SLP criteria should be adjusted to include something related to participating in projects or events together, sponsoring Key Leader, or number of meetings attended by Kiwanians, etc. rather than just "sponsoring a new program". It gives no recognition to supporting and maintaining strong, healthy service leadership programs.
- 8) Kiwanis Hero in Service Award appropriate to maintain the current standards and procedures.
- 9) <u>Membership Growth Awards</u> new information available. It's now based upon the Formula materials. We need to review this award and see how criteria will be distributed to clubs.

KIWANIS COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA LICENSE PLATE PROGRAM

- The cost of the plate is \$25.00. As well, there is a striking/production cost of \$6.00 per plate. The total that must be covered is \$31.00.
- All applications must come to the District office. The Executive Director must approve all applications. No applications can be submitted directly to the Department of Transportation. All applications must be sent from the District Office to the Department of Transportation with the appropriate payment of \$25.00 per application.
- It takes four to six weeks from the time an application is submitted by the District office to PennDOT until the Kiwanian has his or her plate. The amount of time it takes the District office to submit the plate to PennDOT will vary. It will not be an immediate priority to submit applications and they will be submitted in groups as checks are written when paying other bills.
- It is recommended that the price the District charges for the plate will be \$35.00.


