The DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING April 16, 2016

The third meeting of the 2015-16 District Board of Trustees was held on April 16, 2016 at the Kiwanis District Office, Harrisburg, PA. Governor Jen Vare presided. The meeting was called to order at 9:30AM.

The meeting began with a reciting of the Objects of Kiwanis.

All board members were present except John Grab and Mike Coolbaugh.

Guests included Laws and Regulation Chair Matt Wise.

Membership & New Club Building (See the pages p1-p3)

Formula Vice-Chair Matt Wise spoke on membership development.

The Philly Blitz new club building effort was discussed.

The board was made aware that the District will be processing credit cards for the blitz and can do this for new club building efforts in the future.

Other new club building efforts across the District were discussed.

The membership incentive contest was discussed. (See p3).

Consent Agenda (See p4-p65)

All items in the consent agenda were approved.

Discussion and Action items

The 2015-16 Budget, account balances, investment reserves and Super Raffle were reviewed and discussed. See p66 -p.69. Other fundraisers were reviewed.

The Key Club and Circle K Convention Financial information and general budgets were reviewed. See p70-p74.

Key Leader was discussed and reviewed. Concerns about the future financial liability to the District for Key Leader Conferences were discussed.

Trustee positions were discussed. A motion was introduced, seconded and approved to appoint Phyliss Palm to the position of Region III for the 2016-17 and 2017-18 year. The motion was seconded and approved.

Vacant 2016-17, Lt. Governor positions were reviewed (p75). There are a lot of vacancies but it appears there is some movement towards filling some of those positions. Training for 2016-17 Lt. Governors will be on June 10-11, 2016 at Bucknell University.

Potential redivisioning was discussed but no action was taken.

Club officer education for 2016-17 was discussed.

The 2016 Midwinter Conference results were reviewed. See p75-p79.

The board approved soliciting a proposal from the Penn Stater to host the 2018 Midwinter Conference. No action will be taken on the 2019 Midwinter conference until such after the 2017 Circle K Convention is held.

Convention sponsorships and ads were reviewed and all board members were urged to support those efforts. May 3, 2016 was established as the date for the conference call to approve a convention budget and program. The board was informed that the Jazz Fest will not be taking place while we are in Scranton. Board member conduct and responsibility in regard to the contested election for Governor-elect was discussed.

The 2016 Kiwanis International Convention in Toronto was discussed. The Pennsylvania District will have its caucus on Thursday, June 23, 2016 at 4:00PM. There will be a hospitality room with times to be determined.

The candidates for International office were discussed (Seep89-p90) and the board endorsed Peter Mancuso from the New York District for the position of International Trustee. The amendments being considered at the convention were reviewed (see p91-p92). The board agreed to support amendments 1, 2 and 3. The board voted to oppose amendments 4, 5, 6 and 8. No position was taken on 7, 9, 10 and 11 and some of these may be considered on the board conference call on May 3rd.

The following clubs have not paid dues for 2015-16: Uniontown, Shamokin, Kingston and Chester. Calls will be made to each one of these clubs during the week of April 18th.

A reminder was provided on the Kiwanis Day at Citizens Bank Park with the Philadelphia Phillies on June 18, 2016.

Background checks for District Officers, Lt. Governors and Chairs were reviewed. See p94–p95. After discussion about the missing checks and because at one time the missing checks had been in hand and showed no issues, the board agreed that all checks had been submitted and the focus will now move to the 2016-17 Trustees, Board and Chairs.

The I-Plan Committee (Strategic Plan) has had a conference call to discuss how to proceed with plan development and assignments have been made. May 3rd is the next date for a conference call to get reports from the various subcommittees working on the plan elements.

The District Foundation nominating committee is chaired by Governor-elect John Gräb. Board members should share the names of any possible Foundation nominees with John.

Proposed amendments to the District Bylaws were considered and presented to the board by Matt Wise (See P96 to P99). All proposed amendments were approved by the District Board and will be considered at the convention in Scranton.

Efforts are still on going to arrange a meeting with the Pennsylvania leadership of JCI.

The District is seeking a Partnerships Coordinator per instruction from Kiwanis International.

It was announced the Immediate Past Governor Bob Raub will be the new District Public Relations coordinator.

A proposal was reviewed from the PA Key and Pennsylvania Office of Early Childhood Development to sponsor the PA One Book for pre-school children in the foster care system. After review and discussion, the board approved having the Executive Director work with the District Foundation President and board to develop this program and find the funding for Kiwanis to sponsor this effort. See p103-p109.

District Awards were discussed in recommendations provided by Trustee Kate Feryo. See p109A-P109H. After review and discussion and with some suggested changes being incorporated, the awards were approved.

An update was given on the District Administrative Secretary position. To date, one applicant has expressed interest in the job. It is hoped that we will have someone in place around May 15th.

A discussion took place on the District Executive Director's job description. The current job description is p116-p117. The proposed job description developed by a board committee consisting of Governor Jen Vare, Governor-elect John Grab, Immediate Past Governor Bob Raub and Trustee Keith Smith is p118-p123. After discussion, the board voted to retain the existing job description for the position.

Discussion then took place on extending the contract for Executive Director Kevin Thomas. After discussion, the following items were decided. 1. That Kevin Thomas would be retained as Executive Director past September 30, 2016. 2. A Committee consisting of Governor Jen Vare, Immediate Past Governor Bob Raub and Trustee Ann Graves will meet with Kevin Thomas to present the details of a compensation package and contract worked out by the board. 3. Trustee Ann Moffitt will chair a committee to discuss standard operating procedures such as audit, expense reporting, etc.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

April 2016 Board Report



The formula event is in a week and a half, April 24-27. A lot of work has gone into this event by the Blitz Team and Kiwanis International. It has been a great learning experience for David, Matt and I. The amount of logistics on the back end of what Kiwanis has to do has truly been eye opening. We appreciate everyone who has been a part of this process.

The blitz will consist of 6 clubs in Pennsylvania and one in NJ. This is due to the amount of people attending from around the Kiwanis World. We will work on the other four clubs after the six identified below are organized.

The 10 new club sites we have identified are:

- 1) South Philadelphia
- 2) Northeast Philadelphia
- 3) Ridley Park
- 4) Conshohocken
- 5) Central Bucks
- 6) Chesterbrook

We are seeing a lot of movement throughout the district by clubs working on membership. I am not going to list them all, however; rest assured we have a lot of great things going on in existing clubs.

Remind your LTG's that Governor Jen put out a challenge; the first LTG to open a new club will receive \$100.00 and another \$100 from the Formula Budget, the Blitz clubs do not qualify for this incentive.

Here are the clubs that I was told would be open this year:

Region One:

- Cochranton is an ongoing effort with Roger and Judy Janes, they are working with the Key Club and community leaders.
- Summit Township, Kiwanis Club of Erie have been out canvassing and have gotten interest in the area.

Region Two:

• Fox Chapel Division six, John M, Keith and I will discuss what we need to do to make this happen.

Region Three:

O At this point due to several issues we do not have a club in the area to open. Bedford is still on the back burner.

Region Four:

From what I have seen and heard there is no club in the works in this region at this
point. I will need to talk with Bill and Matt about what the plan is.

Region Five:

Southern York division 13 S or N. Have not heard anything about this club

- o Colonial Park Division 13 N John Grab committed to opening this club.
- O Quarryville, This is in southern Lancaster County and judy is on the preliminary stage of contacts and getting logistics taken care of.
- O Waynesboro Bob is in the preliminary stages of this club.
- o Hamburg Division 16,
- Region Six:
 - Old Forge Division 15, Mike Coolbaugh has started on this club and will work harder on it after the blitz is complete.
- Region Seven:
 - o Philly Blitz

Ten New Clubs. That is Governor Jen and The Formula's Goal for this year. She has conveyed this message to her team several times.

The other goal is to bring in 800 new members in the 2015-2016 year. The lieutenant governors at training agreed this can be and will be done. Each region needs to open at least one new club this year. Please remember that club satellites do not count as a new Kiwanis Club. We have a lot of work to do to get to these numbers. As all of you have seen throughout the years, we show growth right now, however; we need to focus on the big picture.

With new members in our existing clubs, there will be more service making a difference in our community's.

With more clubs we will be in communities that don't currently have Kiwanis; and doing things that other organizations simply could not do.

I have communicated with some LTG's and for that matter formula members to offer my help. A few people have taken me up on the help, please let your regions know that we have a team that wants to help in whatever way that we can. Growth in Kiwanis is one of my top priorities.

Matt and I are only a phone call or email away and want to help in every way we can. However; we cannot do this alone and are asking the board members to reach out to your LTG's and ask them to communicate with the Formula group. We are all one team with the same goal in mind and that is to leave the Pennsylvania District in a much better place than when we started. We all need to work together to make this happen. Keep in mind, we need to stay focused and dedicated, this takes work, determination and passion, growth will not happen overnight. We need to make small daily improvements to achieve long-term results.

DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING February 6, 2016

The second meeting of the 2015-16 District Board of Trustees was held on February 6, 2016 at the Kiwanis District Office, Harrisburg, PA. Governor Jennifer Vare presided. The meeting was called to order at 9:30AM. All board members were present with Trustee Kate Feryo calling in by phone.

The inspirational thought/invocation was provided by Trustee Keith Smith.

Guests included Circle K District Administrator Kelly Shaup, Laws and Regulations Chair Matt Wise, Past Lt. Governor Judy Raub, Past Lt. Governor Tracy Smith, Past Governor/Formula Chair Cathy Szymanski and Administration Chair Paul Kasoff.

Membership & New Club Building (Pages p1-p11B)

Formula Chair Cathy Szymanski led a discussion on new club building.

The Philadelphia new club building blitz on April 24-27, 2016 was discussed. Cathy appealed for support of this effort and explained the effort. As part of that effort, Governor Vare indicate that Kiwanis International asked that the District consider waving the interim dues collected from new clubs. After discussion, the board did not take any action on this request.

Governor Vare asked Formula Chair to add all board members as new club openers if she would like them to be working on new club opening.

Information was provided from Lt. Governor Evaluation Reports #1 about existing clubs. Information was specifically discussed on the East Shore Club and the Zelienople Harmony.

A membership incentive contest was discussed. See the page marked p11A. The board approved this proposed plan.

A corporate member database was discussed. See the page marked p11B. The basic idea is to gather information on who are our corporate members and why they belong to Kiwanis. This information will then be shared with all clubs to give them ideas for potential members.

The Kiwanis and JCI partnership was discussed. Executive Director Kevin Thomas was to write a letter to Kiwanis clubs and JCI Clubs. As he prepared to write the letters, he did research. After research and email exchanges, it his recommendation that before any letters are sent that a meeting be set up between the Kiwanis District Leadership and JCI State Leadership to establish some plans and joint efforts between the organizations.

Changes to the membership portion of the board meeting agenda were discussed. No changes were considered at this time

Consent Agenda (Pages p12-p54)

All items in the consent agenda were approved by proper motion, second and vote.

Discussion and Action items

Reports were reviewed on the 2014-15, 2015 District Convention and 2015-16 Budgets. Those reports can be seen as page p55-p57.

A final report was provided on the District holiday party. It is page p61.

A report was provided on the District shirts. See page p62-p63.

The travel program by the Kiwanis International travel partner AHI was discussed. Information was provided to the board. Executive Director Kevin Thomas recommended the District actively promote these programs to gain the financial benefit to the District offered by AHI travel. By consensus, the board agreed.

Vacancies were discussed in 2016-17 Trustees and Lt. Governor positions as were plans to fill vacancies. The resignation of 2015-16 Division 13N Lt. Governor Lisa Smith was discussed. A Division 13N Council meeting will be called to fill the vacancy as well as get a Lt. Governor in place for the 2016-17 year.

Potential redivisioning was discussed. By approved motion, Trustees were instructed to come to the April district board meeting with any recommendations they might have for redivisioning in their region.

2016-17 Club officer education was discussed. Governor —elect John Gräb will be following up with Education Chair Dennis Bouchard to begin finalizing plans and dates for the 2016-17 year. Lt. Governor training will be June 10-11, 2016 at Bucknell University. Training for 2016-17 Trustees will be scheduled by Governor-elect John Gräb.

A report from the committee looking at District awards was considered. The report is page p99-p100. Trustee Kate Feryo presented the report. After review and discussion, the committee was directed, if possible, to have details for its recommendations in place for the April district board meeting with idea of changes going into effect for the 2016-17 year.

The Midwinter conference program and forums were reviewed. See pages P70, P71, P71A and P71B. Midwinter Conference registration totals, sponsorships received and shout outs were reviewed.

Key Leader was discussed. Emphasis was placed on having Trustee support and promotion of Key Leader events since we are running two events.

Trustee Mike Coolbaugh provided an update on the 2016 District Convention.

The Kiwanis International convention in Toronto was discussed. See pages p79 – 80. By proper motion, second and vote, the board approved the governor having a hospitality room for the convention.

Clubs not paying dues for the 2015-16 year were discussed and reviewed.

A new contract for the District Executive Director was discussed. The committee has met but has not yet finalized a proposal. A proposal will be developed on or before the Midwinter conference with goal of having a new agreement by the Midwinter Conference.

A meeting of District Service Leadership Plan Administrators was discussed. This will be finalized after the new District I-Plan (Strategic) is further refined so that their input into the plan can be gathered; this will be sometime in the spring.

Circle K Administrator Kelly Shaup provided an update on the development of a Circle K Board background check policy. A policy has been developed that the Circle K District board will consider. If the Circle K board approves the policy, it will then be submitted to the Kiwanis District board for approval.

Trustee Mike Coolbaugh will be scheduling a meeting of the committee developing a crisis communication plan.

Dates for the 2016-17 Board meetings were reviewed. See page p87.

Discussion took place on the April 2016 Board meeting date and location. Governor Jen Vare will be doing a survey to determine if there is a need to change the time and location.

Information was provided on the Kiwanis Day at The Phillies. See page p88.

Criminal history and child abuse clearances of board members, Lt. Governors and District Chairs were reviewed. Follow up will be done as needed for those not yet submitted.

District Bylaws Amendments were considered in a discussion led by laws and regulations chair Matt Wise. The recommendations of the Laws and Regulations Committee can be seen as pages p91-p92. The District Board approved all the recommendations of the District Laws and Regulations committee. A discussion was then held on a provision of the bylaws that was inadvertently left out of the new District Bylaws that was in the old bylaws and should have been included in the new bylaws; see page p92A for the provision. After discussion, the board adopted a motion to offer an amendment at the District Convention that will put that provision into the new District Bylaws.

District strategic planning was discussed. This plan is called the I-Plan. On December 11-12, 2015, a committee of Kiwanians appointed by Governor Jen Vare met in Newark, NJ with six other North American Districts. This meeting was facilitated by Kiwanis International. The purpose of the meeting was to begin the development of a District I-Plan under the rubric of the Kiwanis International I-Plan. See pages p93-p98 for the initial work of the committee. This plan will be refined and developed further by the committee and then submitted to the District Board for approval. After District Board approval, the plan will be submitted to Kiwanis International.

The District Foundation Nominating Committee was discussed. Governor-elect John Gräb will chair this committee.

Governor Jen Vare talked about missing board meeting reports from board members and district chairs. She will be doing follow ups to try to get all who should be submitting reports to do so.

As part of the I-Plan development, a new position, District Public Relations coordinator, is being created. The District is presently looking for qualified candidates and board members were asked to share the names of anyone they think might be a good fit for the position.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Foundation Report to the District Board April 9, 2016

Our District Foundation board is working hard to strengthen the programs of Kiwanis throughout Pennsylvania and around the world.

A special thank you to Governor Jen Vare for the Mile of Dimes campaign which has added valuable resources to our Early Learning Guides efforts. Guides continue to be available from the District Office at no cost to clubs.

I am proud to report that both the Key Club and Circle K Districts have approved working with Early Learning as their signature projects for the 2016-17 years.

This year, we are doubling our support for Key Leader, providing \$75 scholarships to up to 160 participants (an increase of 80 participants this year).

We hosted a silent auction at the Midwinter Conference raising over \$1,500.

We are planning a direct mail piece that will be mailed to Kiwanis members in the coming weeks.

As a reminder, our board approved effective October 1, 2014, a policy that will provide a \$250 grant to new chartered clubs for use in their service account – this will include any and all clubs that are chartered because of the Philadelphia Blitz campaign. To date, we have presented 2 new club grants: Kennett Square and most recently in Norriton Circle.

The Foundation needs the support of all Pennsylvania Kiwanis members. The Foundation cannot continue to provide program support without financial resources. Please encourage clubs and members to make the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation a philanthropic priority.

Re: Youth Protection Committee Report

- 1. I presented a forum on Youth Protection at the 2016 Mid-Winter Conference. The primary topic was training at the Club Level. Kiwanis International Youth Protection Guidelines require that every club dedicate one of its meetings to Youth Protection training annually. I developed a 20 25 minute overview that can be given by a Club officer or Division officer, including a PowerPoint presentation and script. I am in the process of finalizing with the intent to post as a download on the District website.
- 2. There is still some push-back in the District regarding the change in Kiwanis International policy requiring the use of Safe Hiring Solutions for Club SLP Advisor background checks. I am attaching the FAQ's issued by Kiwanis International for the Board's review and information.
- 3. In line with District Policy, I will send notices to any Kiwanian running for a District elected office, or intending to serve as a District Chair, for whom the District does not have a copy of their Pennsylvania Background checks, when that list (either partial or full) is given to me.

KIWANIS ADVISOR BACKGROUND CHECK REQUIREMENTS FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Q: Who is required to have clear criminal history background checks?
A: Whomever is reported as the official Kiwanis advisor to any sponsored Service Leadership Program club. The Service Leadership Programs are K-Kids, Builders Club, Key Club, Circle K, and Aktion Club.

Q: What about faculty advisors?

A: Faculty advisors need to meet the background check expectations for their school or agency, but do not fall under these Kiwanis policies.

Q: What are the reporting requirements for background checks?
A: Club secretaries can indicate on the club dashboard that advisors have completed and cleared a background check.

Q: What are the consequences for a club that either neglects to or refuses to have a background check performed on the appropriate member?

A: Currently, there are no direct consequences for a club. However, Kiwanis International provides club liability insurance—so an incident following failure to comply with this policy could ultimately affect the cost of such coverage.

Q: Is the club's Kiwanis International liability coverage affected if there is not a clear background check on the SLP advisor? A: No, the club's coverage is not directly affected. However, long-term costs of such coverage for the organization could be impacted if there are claims that result because a club failed to conduct a background check.

Q: Which offenses could exclude a member from working with youth? A: The following categories may serve as a model for your club's policy for members and for any paid employees:

- Decision-makers will likely want to exclude those who have been convicted of crimes such as sexual violence, violent crimes, felony theft, child abuse, child exploitation, child molestation, child seduction, dealing in drugs, possession of child pornography or Internet child crimes.
- Don't necessarily exclude: Offenses such as minor moving violations don't necessarily have an impact on volunteering.
- Kiwanis International criteria outlined in Kiwanis International procedure 197 should be used to determine if a check is 'clear' (www.kiwanisone.org/backgroundchecks).

Q: What would make a criminal history background check not clear?

A: A criminal history background check is considered "not clear" if it indicates: a felony or misdemeanor involving moral turpitude; a felony or conviction or registration of a violent and/or sexual nature, involving any type of abuse of a child,

To the Board,

Attached is the latest giving report. Regardless what you hear, we still need about \$8,000,000 to complete the campaign. While the Canadian Government has pledged to match up to \$4,000,000 from Kiwanians in Canada, and the Kiwanis International Foundation said they would commit to give the rest we still want to make sure that we reach the \$110,000,000. We had a good month with a \$15,000 increase, putting us within about \$7,000 of reaching \$1,200,000. There is no longer an Eliminate Project office as of January 1st. From now on all funds are being received and recorded by the International Foundation.

Here is where we stand at the end of the official campaign. There are 54 Districts, and within those Districts there are 7 regions for the campaign. We had 25 Model Clubs and ranked 18th (tied with Eastern Canada and Caribbean District). Of the 25 Model Clubs (\$750 per member) 1 became a \$100,000 club, 1 became a Diamond (\$2,500 per member), 3 platinum (\$1,500 per member), and 1 Gold (\$1,000 per member). We ranked 24th per member in funds raised.

On the Region level, we are part of Region 1 which was made up of 8 Districts--New England, New York, New Jersey, West Virginia, Ohio, Michigan, Wisconsin/Upper Michigan, and Pennsylvania. We ranked 2nd in Model Clubs, next to Ohio. We ranked 3rd in per member in funds raised. We were also 1 of 2 Districts in our Region to have 100% participation from clubs in the project.

The campaign office had stopped sending out reports on Zeller Fellowship participants this past summer and never sent out a report on Centennial Awards. To the best I can calculate, we had over 200 (closer to 250) Zeller Fellowship participants and about 60 Centennial Award participants. We were number 1 in our Region. A club can make a donation but can no longer make a pledge. A Kiwanian can no longer get a Centennial Award, nor can they get a Hixson or a Tablet of Honor and have the monies go toward the Eliminate Project. A Kiwanian can still get a Zeller (with \$1,250 for a donation to the Eliminate project) if the club made a pledge before the end of the year.

When I took this position it was to be for 5 years. Last year we found out that we are to be involved until 2020 to let Kiwanians and clubs be aware that they can still donate to the Eliminate Project, and to make sure that clubs fulfill their pledges (bill collector:). While I will still send out the giving report with comments, I feel there is no longer a need to send future reports to the Board.

Report to District Board of Trustees April 16, 2016

1. Update to District Bylaws:

- a. As per the last district board meeting (February 2016), the District Bylaws were amended in conjunction with the recommendations made in the report of this committee for consideration by the District Board.
- b. In addition, Governor Jen asked that this committee include language to detail the requirements in order to hold the position of Lieutenant Governor. This item was inadvertently omitted in the last bylaw update.
- c. A Draft copy of the amended bylaws is included with this report (in the agenda packet) for consideration by the District Board. The amendments are in **bold italic type-face.**
- 2. The PA District Policy Code was adopted in April 2015. Since then, several amendments to the Youth Protection policy have been made as well as a few new policies adopted:
 - a. Per the July 18, 2015 meeting of the District Board, the District Policy on criminal and child abuse background checks was amended to change the requirement that background checks be done every three (3) years to a requirement they be done every five (5) years. This can be found on page 11 of the Policy Code document.
 - b. Per the July 18, 2015 meeting of the District Board, the District adopted a policy on Personal Confidential Information at the direction of Kiwanis International. This policy was added to the code in its entirety as Policy XXV and can be found on page 17 of the Policy Code document.
 - c. Per the July 18th, 2015 meeting of the District Board, the District adopted a new logo to be in compliance with the Kiwanis International Graphics Standards. A copy of this logo was added to Policy 1, Section C (District Emblem). This can be found on page 1 of the Policy Code document.
 - d. Per the October 3, 2015 meeting of the District Board, the policy on background checks was amended to have the checks be submitted to the District Executive Director and if a check is not clear, they will be submitted to the District Youth Protection chair for further review and possible action. Formerly, the checks were submitted directly to the District Youth Protection chair. This can be found on page 12 of the Policy Code document.

I am very happy to report that the Kiwanis Club of Dillsburg Area received a \$10,000 grant from the Kiwanis International Foundation for their upcoming community playground build. The next grant cycle applications are due to the Kiwanis International Foundation office by November 15, 2016.

The Foundation needs the support of all Pennsylvania Kiwanis members. The Foundation cannot continue to provide program support without financial resources. These club recognitions are awarded annually at the end of the Kiwanis year. Eligible clubs will be determined by the Kiwanis International Foundation. Recognition will be sent to district leadership for presentation. There are four recognition levels: Blue, Silver, Gold and Diamond. To achieve one of these four levels, clubs must reach the following per-member giving average:

- Gold US\$50
- Diamond, US\$100

Executive Director's Report - April 16, 2016

- 1. In case you did not know, Circle K has taken on Early Childhood Development and Learning as its District project. That means Kiwanis, Circle K and Key Club are all focused on the same area of service and emphasis.
- 2. From the point of view of cash, the Key Club District and the Circle K District are in a stronger position than any time in recent years. This is due primarily to structural changes made in the operating budget of each organization and support of the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation.
- 3. I am concerned about the future viability of a standalone Circle K District convention in its present format. There are various factors but they all come down to financial viability and hotel contracts. Unless a significant increase occurs in attendance in the next year or two, it may be necessary to hold the Circle K Convention at the same time and location as the Key Club Convention or the Kiwanis Midwinter and/or change the format of the convention to shorten its length. Probably the best fit, if this is necessary, would be the Kiwanis Midwinter Conference.
- 4. We need all board members to promote and support the District Super Raffle, District Convention Sponsorships and District Convention Program Ads. It is vitally important you do so. I am buying an ad and I am asking both clubs I belong to buy an ad and a Super Raffle ticket. I am asking all board members to join me in that regard and as well as asking your home clubs to do the same.
- 5. I am concerned that there is some disconnect between decisions being made by the Kiwanis International Board and Staff and what is actually taking place out here in districts, divisions and clubs. Kiwanis International keeps asking us to appoint people to positions they are creating or telling us we need to create when we don't have enough effective people to fill all the important positions we presently have and when some of the positions they want us to create are not necessary. I'm sure that they'll tell you that this is all under the guise of the I-Plan. However perhaps some reality needs to interjected into that effort and modification made where necessary. Perhaps it is time for some pushback and discussion on this issue.

I am, also, including my travel/calendar and schedule for January, February and March. I have heard some expression that in the past board members could not read everything as things got "cut off". Hopefully, this new format addresses that concern. However if at any time anyone has any concern or question about an event or a day, feel free to ask.

As always, feel free to write or call any time your need assistance, have questions or concerns.

Key Club Bylaws

- The Pennsylvania Kiwanis Executive Director shall mail to each club president, faculty advisor, sponsoring Kiwanis advisor, Pennsylvania Kiwanis Key Club Committee, and to the Administrator of Key Club International an official call to the annual District Convention at least forty-five (45) days prior to the date of the convention. The Board of Trustees shall have full supervision and management of all conventions under the supervision of the District Key Club Administrator, Pennsylvania Kiwanis Key Club Committee, and the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International.
- Section 3. Each club in good standing shall be entitled to two (2) delegates and two (2) alternates in any District Convention.
- The members of the Board of Trustees shall be delegates-at-large at any District Convention. A Lieutenant Governor may represent any club in their division not otherwise represented at the convention. By doing so, that Lieutenant Governor cannot be a Delegate At Large.
- **Section 5.** Each accredited delegate shall be entitled to vote on each question submitted at any District Convention. There shall be no voting by proxy.
- In the absence of the Governor from any convention/conference of the District, the Board of Trustees shall designate a Lieutenant Governor to act as a chairperson.
- A quorum at any convention/conference of the District shall comprise of the official delegates present, and representing not less than one third (1/3) of the total number of clubs in the District.
- Section 8. Within fourteen (14) days after any District Convention, the Secretary/Treasurer shall make a report of the proceedings of the convention/conference, including a complete synopsis of all action taken, and shall submit a copy thereof to the Administrator of Key Club International and the members of the District Board of Trustees.
- Frustees.

 Each District Convention program shall include the following:

 (a) Address by the Governor of the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International, and the Governor of the Pennsylvania District of Circle K International.

 (b) The judging and awarding of the following awards under the rules prescribed by the Board of Trustees and Key Club International and the Pennsylvania District. The judging and awarding of all contests, awards, recognitions, and scholarships by Key Club international and the Pennsylvania District will be awarded under the rules prescribed through the Key Club International
 - (c) The nomination and election of officers for the ensuing year.

Guidebook and the Pennsylvania District Policy Code.

- (d) Such other activities as may be specified in the Pennsylvania District Policy Code.
- Proposed amendments to the Pennsylvania District Key Club Bylaws may be submitted by any Pennsylvania District Key Club in good standing, and must be received in writing by the Pennsylvania District Key Club Administrator at least forty-five (45) days prior to the call to order of the Annual House of Delegates. The Pennsylvania District Key Club Administrator shall have a copy of the proposed amendments on the district website no later than thirty days prior to the call to order of the Annual House of Delegates.

Article X Vacancies in Office Between Conventions

- In the event, between District Conventions/Leadership Conferences, of a vacancy in the office of the Governor, a member of the District Board of Trustees shall fill the vacancy. The District Key Club Administrator, pending approval of the District Board of Trustees, shall designate the replacement. The term shall consist of the remaining months until the next District Convention, when, at that time, elections to choose a Governor will be held.
- Section 2. In the event, between District Conventions/Leadership Conferences, of a vacancy in the office of Lieutenant Governor, the Governor, District Key Club Administrator, and the respective Zone Administrator shall designate a qualified

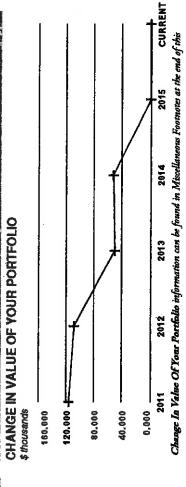

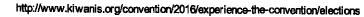

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Amendment and resolution proposals

Amendment and resolution proposals

Don't just have an opinion. Put it into action. Important amendments and resolutions are submitted for votes at the convention every year. As a convention delegate, you'll be a part of the discussion.



If you plan to represent your club as a delegate in 2016, it's easy to prepare. Download the certificate of election of club delegates and alternates.

If your club wishes to propose an amendment to the Kiwanis International Bylaws or a resolution to be considered by the House of Delegates, consult the quidelines for making a proposal. Any new proposals submitted after October 31, 2015, cannot be considered until the 2017 convention in Paris.

Download the amendments booklet.

Here are the current proposed amendments to be discussed and voted on during the 2016 Kiwanis International convention:

1 - Auxiliary bodies Purpose: To eliminate obsolete and potentially confusing wording regarding auxiliary bodies of Kiwanis International.

2 - Use of Kiwanis name and marks

Purpose: To clarify Kiwanis International authority regarding use of the Kiwanis name and marks as it relates to foundations and other affiliated entities, including intellectual property.

3 - Kiwanis International affiliates and subsidiaries

Purpose: To codify Kiwanis International "affiliates," which are regions or other groups composed of clubs and districts, and "subsidiaries," which are wholly-owned organizations and business entities.

4 - District treasurer

Purpose: To revise the term and selection process for district treasurers in order to align districts with Kiwanis International's strategic plan and provide better oversight over district funds, assets, and financial operations.

5 – Annual adjustment option for Kiwanis International dues

Purpose: To provide that Kiwanis International dues may be adjusted by no more than US\$2 annually, with a cap of US\$5 over a five-year period, to keep up with inflation.

6 - Secure web-based voting for Kiwanis International business

Purpose: To provide that the business of Kiwanis International decided by delegates will be conducted by secure electronic voting, thereby giving an equal voice to all Kiwanis clubs.

7 - Tiered dues

Purpose: To base tiered dues on a percentage of the gross national income of the U.S.

8 - Members who belong to more than one club

Amendment and resolution proposals

Purpose: To provide that members who belong to more than one Kiwanis club shall only pay Kiwanis International and district dues to their primary club.

9 - Life membership status fee

Purpose: To provide a variable life membership status fee based on the member's age.

10 - Foundations, charitable funds, and other affiliated entities

Purpose: To clarify Kiwanis International's authority regarding foundations and affiliated entities.

11 - Delegate verification process for electronic balloting

- **b.** No offices other than those of Secretary and Treasurer may be combined in one person. The Secretary-Treasurer has the title of Executive Director.
- c. After their election and before their assumption of office, all officers shall be known and designated by the titles of the offices to which they have respectively been elected followed by the term "designate."

Section 2.

- a. Each officer shall be an active member in good standing in a club of the district.
- b. Each Lieutenant Governor shall be a member of a club in the division from which elected. Each Lieutenant Governor and Lieutenant Governor-elect shall: be a member of a club in the division from which he or she is elected; shall be, or have been, a club president; or shall have served as club secretary for at least two (2) years; and shall be active in the affairs of his or her club and his or her division. Lieutenant Governors and Lieutenant Governors-elect shall not be members of the District Board of Trustees. The Lieutenant Governors shall assist the Governor and the Board of Trustees in the work of the District and shall represent the Governor and shall have full responsibility under the direction of the Governor and the Board of Trustees in supervision of the District administrative work in their respective divisions. The Lieutenant Governors shall also perform such other duties as may be assigned to them by the Governor or the Board of Trustees.
- c. Each Trustee shall: be a member of a club in the region from which he or she is elected; have been a member of one or more Kiwanis Clubs for at least (5) years; have been a Lt. Governor; and be active in the affairs of his or her club, division and region.
- d. The Governor and Governor-elect shall: have served as a Lieutenant Governor of a division in the Pennsylvania District; have been an active member of one or more Kiwanis Clubs in the Pennsylvania District for at least six (6) years; and shall have and maintain a clear criminal history background check conducted and verified by Kiwanis International.
- **Section 3.** Officer terms shall be as follows or until said officer's successor shall be duly elected and qualified. The terms of all district officers shall begin on October 1.
 - a. A trustee shall serve a term of three (3) years. A trustee may serve multiple terms, but shall not serve for two or more full consecutive terms.
 - b. All other officers shall serve a term of one (1) year.
 - c. The time served by any person appointed by the District Board to fill a vacancy shall not count for the purpose of this provision.
- Section 4. Each district officer has the duty and responsibility to:
 - a. Promote the Objects and objectives of Kiwanis International.
 - **b.** Promote the interests of the clubs within the district.

c. Plan and preside at regional meetings, under the direction of the District Board.

ARTICLE IV. DISTRICT BOARD

- **Section 1.** The District Board shall consist of the Governor, Governor-elect, Immediate Past Governor, Executive Director, and a trustee for each region. The Circle K District Governor, Key Club District Governor and a representative of the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation Board shall be non-voting, ex officio members of the District Board. Lieutenant Governors shall not be members of the District Board, but may participate in discussion without voting privileges.
- **Section 2.** The management and control of the affairs of the district not otherwise provided for in these bylaws shall be vested in the District Board, subject to the supervision and control of the Kiwanis International Board of Trustees. The District Board may adopt policies and/or procedures, provided they are not in violation of any applicable laws or any higher governing documents.
- **Section 3.** The District Board shall hold at least four (4) regular meetings during each administrative year, one of which shall be held prior to October 31, at such times and places as designated by the Governor. If the first meeting is held prior to October 1, any action taken shall become effective on October 1, unless specified otherwise a later date is specified.
- **Section 4.** A special meeting of the District Board may be called by the Governor or two-thirds (2/3) of the entire Board.
- **Section 5.** Subject to the laws of local jurisdiction, the District Board may meet and conduct business by any method that allows all participants to simultaneously communicate with one another or as otherwise allowed by law. Participation by such methods constitutes attendance. Normal board meeting rules and processes apply unless otherwise determined by the Board.
- **Section 6.** The Executive Director shall notify each member of the District Board and the Executive Director of Kiwanis International of the time, place, and date of any regular meeting at least three (3) weeks in advance and of any special meeting at least three (3) days in advance.
- **Section 7.** In the absence of the Governor from a meeting, the District Board shall elect one of its members to act as presiding officer.
- **Section 8.** A majority of the total members of the District Board constitutes a quorum, and a majority vote of those present and voting is required for all business unless otherwise provided in these bylaws.
- **Section 9.** Within thirty (30) days after any District Board meeting, the Executive Director shall provide a draft of the meeting minutes or a summary of the actions taken to Kiwanis International, and a copy shall be made available to clubs in the district. The district shall provide a copy of the official minutes of each board meeting to Kiwanis International within thirty (30) days after approval by the District Board.

ARTICLE V. COMMITTEES

Section 1. The titles, structure, and duties of district standing committees shall be those defined by

Section 6. The Governor shall be an ex-officio member of all standing and special committees of the district.

Section 7. All committee members appointed by the Governor shall be subject to removal by the Governor.

ARTICLE VI. CONVENTIONS

Section 1. The annual convention of the district shall be held at such place and date, between March 15 and September 15 25, as shall be mutually agreed upon by the District Board and the Kiwanis International Board of Trustees, except that no district convention shall be held within the period of thirty (30) days prior to, during, or thirty (30) days following the Convention of Kiwanis International unless approved by the Kiwanis International Board. In the event the annual convention of Kiwanis International is held within the geographic boundaries of a district, the district may hold its convention in conjunction with the Kiwanis International convention; in such cases, district functions may not be held during general sessions of the International Convention.

Section 2. Special conventions of the district shall be called by the Governor upon the request of a majority of the clubs or upon the request of three-fourths (3/4) of the members of the District Board.

Section 3. The Executive Director shall notify each club and the Executive Director of Kiwanis International at least sixty (60) days prior to the date of the annual convention and at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of any special convention or rescheduled annual convention.

Section 4. The District Board shall have full supervision and management of all conventions.

Section 5. For each convention, the Governor shall appoint a Committee on Credentials and a Committee on Elections, each to consist of at least three (3) members. All members of the Committee on Elections shall be delegates.

Section 6. At any district convention, each club shall be entitled to seat up to three (3) delegates, two (2) of whom should be the club president and president-designate, as well as nominate three alternates who may serve if any delegate is absent. Club delegates and alternates shall be active members of the clubs they represent. However, the Lieutenant Governor or a past Lieutenant Governor may represent any club in their division not otherwise represented by three delegates. Delegates shall be elected by each club prior to the convention and certified to the district by the club president and secretary. A current or past Lieutenant Governor representing a club may be certified by the Credentials Committee or its designee.

Section 7. Official delegates of a newly organized club shall be granted full privileges at district conventions after the charter has been approved by the Kiwanis International Board of Trustees, even if it has not been formally presented to such club.

Section 8. All officers and past Governors of the district who are active members of a club in the district shall be delegates-at-large to all district conventions.

Section 9. To be accredited, a delegate must have paid a convention registration fee, if such is required.

Section 2. The registration fee for the annual district convention shall be \$25.00 per person. Each district club shall pay to the district a convention fee of three (3) times the registration fee, which shall entitle the club to credit for three (3) delegates to attend the district convention. The convention fee shall be billed with district dues and must be paid by all clubs, whether or not they send three (3) delegates to the convention. Any additional club member, who is not a delegate, shall pay to the district the convention fee. Upon application by a club to the District Board for good cause, including but not limited to financial hardship or other special circumstances, the Board may, at its discretion, waive payment of all or a portion of the convention fee for a club. Income from convention fees shall be used solely to defray the expenses of the annual district convention.

Section 3. Any Kiwanian holding active membership in a club in good standing in the District may be granted District Life Member Status with a one-time payment of a fee of fifteen (15) times the annual District Dues. Upon granting District Life Member Status, the member's club is thereby relieved of any further dues obligation to the District for that member. District Life Member Status shall be in force only during the time the member is a member of an affiliated Kiwanis Club in the Pennsylvania District.

Section 4. A Kiwanis club shall be relieved of any obligation to pay District dues for any club member for a period of two (2) years from the date of joining that club, provided such member was a former member of a Kiwanis International Service Leadership Program.

Section 5. Each new club shall pay a charter fee for each member equal to the amount of prorated district dues based on when the club is organized. See Sec-4 6 for the schedule of prorated district dues.

Section 6. A fee for each new member shall be paid to the district equal to the amount of prorated district dues based on when the member joins the club, as shown below. Clubs are exempt from paying the district new member fee for persons who are former members of a Service Leadership Program (SLP).

October and November: \$35.00
December and January: \$30.00
February and March: \$25.00
April and May: \$20.00
June and July: \$15.00
August and September: \$10.00

Section 7. The District Board may establish registration fees for district conferences or other meetings.

Section 8. No financial obligation shall be placed upon clubs of the district other than those provided in these bylaws or adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the House of Delegates. No voluntary contribution for any district activity shall be requested of all clubs by the District except the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation and the Pennsylvania District Kiwanis Outreach Program. All other solicitation shall require a two-thirds (2/3) vote upon a referendum submitted to all clubs of the district.

ARTICLE XI. FINANCE

Section 1. Not later than October 31, the District Board shall approve a budget of estimated revenues and expenses for the year, including capital expenditures.

Attached please find the request to the Pennsylvania Kiwanis for sponsorship support in reaching the most atrisk children in Pennsylvania—those children in foster care—to supply them with their own copy of the 2017 PA One Book, Every Young Child selection.

Currently in its 11th year, the PA One Book, Every Young Child campaign has strived to reach preschool-aged children through early learning programs, such as Head Start and PA Pre-K Counts, and local libraries. However, there remains a selection of preschool-aged children who are more difficult to reach—those children within, or in danger of becoming involved in, the foster care system. These children and their families may often be isolated from typical community supports or early learning programs, and may not be able to access those supports or services which can help their children be successful in school. Something which many of us may take for granted, the act of sharing a book between an adult and child, may not be an option for these children.

In 2016, we reached out to the PA Office of Children, Youth and Families (OCYF), who oversees the foster care system, with a simple idea: PA One Books for preschool-aged children in the foster care program. While OCYF was receptive, the funding was not available to support this effort. They were, however, able to identify opportunities for partnership opportunities between those agencies who provide supports within the foster care system, at-risk children and their families, and community partners.

The Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation and individual Clubs have a well-established history of investing in children and their school success. We are asking PA Kiwanis to take the next step in sponsorship to underwrite the costs of 7,500 PA One Books for those children and families who are most vulnerable within our communities.

The Office of Children, Youth and Families, PA One Book, Every Young Child committee, the PA Office of Child Development and Early Learning, and the PA Key are grateful for this opportunity to partner with Pennsylvania Kiwanis members in providing this outreach and support to the most vulnerable Pennsylvania children.

Supporting Young Children in Foster Care through the PA One Book, Every Young Child Program

This proposal requests a sponsorship of support between the Pennsylvania Kiwanis and/or individual PA Kiwanis Clubs and the PA One Book Campaign to underwrite the costs of 7,500 2017 PA One Book, Every Young Child selection for children and families currently involved, or at-risk of becoming involved, within the Pennsylvania foster care system, via two sponsorship opportunities: the State-Wide Annual Family Center Conference, and the Local Resource Family Associations and National Foster Care Month.

In 2017, the *PA One Book, Every Young Child* program will celebrate its 12th consecutive year, leading the way and highlighting the importance of early literacy development in preschoolers ages 3 to 6. The *PA One Book, Every Young Child* campaign was developed by a dedicated committee of librarians, museum educators and early learning professionals from across Pennsylvania to promote the value and benefits of reading early and often to preschoolers and to encourage bonding through books and reading. Research has demonstrated that reading aloud to children helps them acquire early language skills, develop positive associations with books and reading, and build a stronger foundation for school success. (Reach Out and Read)

The PA One Book, Every Young Child program has demonstrated an extensive outreach throughout Pennsylvania, reaching thousands of children and families in libraries, early learning programs, schools, and community programs. However, those within the foster care system may not be reached.

There are currently over 13,000 Pennsylvania children within the foster care system, overseen by the Department of Human Services, Office of Children, Youth and Families. These children are some of the most at-risk children within Pennsylvania, having experienced or in danger of experiencing abuse and/or neglect, and unable to remain safely within their familial home. Research tells us these children may suffer from cognitive, behavioral, and emotional problems.

Entering the foster care system does not end the risk for the child—their education is also impacted. Children in foster care have worse education prospects than children in the general student population. Children within foster care typically have challenges with school attendance; are far more likely to transfer to a new school for noneducational reasons; and may score lower on 3rd through 8th grade reading and math exams. (VERA Insitute of Justice, 2001)

The PA Office of Children, Youth and Families provides several different training and outreach events for professionals, families, and children to provide support for children while in foster care, or reach those at danger of entering the foster care system. There are two primary events which reach families, children and foster care staff for which assistance is being requested.

Request for Sponsorship of PA One Book selections; PA Kiwanis Foundation April 2016

The State-Wide Annual Family Center Conference

Family Centers play a significant role in service delivery in communities, in preventing children and families from entering into the formal child welfare system. Each year, nearly 14,000 Pennsylvania families use their local, neighborhood Family Centers to obtain the information, services, and supports to achieve positive outcomes for their families and for their children. Services include child development and parenting education activities and home visits, adult education services, employment information and assistance, health care information and assistance, pregnancy support services, life skills training, access to community resources, recreational and social activities, after-school programs, and emergency services. Pennsylvania has 32 state-funded Family Centers. Twelve are based in schools, and 20 are community-based centers. Family Centers are located in 28 of Pennsylvania's 67 counties and include 62 sites.

Each year, an annual conference is held in which staff from the individual Family Centers receive professional development training and resources. This training and resources are instrumental in providing support to the at-risk families and children they serve.

A request is being made for sponsorship to underwrite the cost of 2,500 PA One Books to be distributed at the statewide Annual Family Center Conference. Sponsors will have the opportunity to meet with Family Center staff, provide PA One Books to the staff for the families served by the Family Center. The books will then be distributed to children by Family Center representatives at their individual centers.

Local Resource Family Associations and National Foster Care Month

The Pennsylvania State Resource Family Association advocates for all those who care about children and their families, working supportively with foster, adoptive, and kinship families, and with local foster parent associations and agencies. The PA State Resource Family Association (PSRFA) is the statewide agency that advocates and supports foster parents and local Associations throughout Pennsylvania.

During May's National Foster Care Month the Local Resource Family Associations supports activities and events held by local Associations. During these events and activities, resources are distributed to the foster and adoptive families and their children.

A request is being made for sponsorship to underwrite the cost of 5,000 PA One Books to be distributed during April-May 2017. This is not a single event, rather, individual events hosted by organizations located throughout Pennsylvania that help support the foster and adoptive families in their counties. (Specific event information and locations will be available from PSRFA.) Sponsors will have the opportunity to distribute PA One Books to the children and families who attend these local events and provide readings of the PA One Book to the children.

Request for Sponsorship of PA One Book selections; PA Kiwanis Foundation April 2016

Sponsorship to Underwrite the Costs of 2017 PA One Books

Each year, the *PA One Book, Every Young Child* selection is identified via a PA One Book committee, comprised of librarians, museum staff, and early learning partners. During fall 2016, the 2017 selection will be announced, as well as the opportunity to order books. Due to a partnership with the publishers, the PA One Books are typically available at a greatly reduced cost of \$2.50 per soft cover book. (This price includes shipping and is based on the past three year's costs.)

Costs to underwrite the sponsorship of the 2017 PA One Books to children in foster care:

- State-Wide Annual Family Center Conference: 2,500 books @ \$2.50/ea. (est) = \$6,250
- Local Resource Family Association events: 5,000 books @ \$2.50/ea. (est) = \$12,500
- Total estimated cost to sponsor 7,500 books @ \$2.50/ ea. = \$18,750

In addition, the club can be given a certificate with a lapel pin (For the committee chairperson). We will ask Bill Cater to create something based upon on suggestions that cost less than \$1.00 per pin for (100) pins. If it is not feasible to create such a pin in a cost effective way, the award will simply be the recognition online, Keystone Kiwanian, and certificate.

PENNSYLVANIA DISTRICT KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR – SECRETARY/TREASURER JOB DESCRIPTION

INTRODUCTION

The District Executive Director occupies a key position which demands that an authoritative knowledge of all Kiwanis operations affecting the District. In general, the District Executive Director does everything possible to assist the Governor in the administrative work of the District. The Executive Director will perform the official duties and responsibilities of the District Secretary and District Treasurer as outlined in the Manual for District Secretaries and as further specified in the District Bylaws.

<u>DUTIES:</u>

- 1) Maintain financial and accounting records of the District and prepare reports as required.
- 2) Keep a record of all receipts and disbursements made in the manner authorized by the Board of Trustees.
- 3) Sign all checks for approved expenditures.
- 4) Keep all records of the District, the minutes of the convention and the minutes of all meetings of the Board of Trustees.
- 5) Collect all funds due the District and shall deposit same in the District depository, and shall furnish a statements of all receipts and expenditures to the Governor and Governor-elect.
- 6) Submit to the proper officials and committees all communications received from Kiwanis International.
- 7) Cooperate with the Governor in forwarding and collecting all official reports required by Kiwanis International.
- 8) Make a report to the annual convention, all official board meetings and at such time as the Governor and Board of Trustees shall require.
- 9) Travel by the Executive Director will include official District functions, including the International Convention, the International Council, the District Convention, the Organizational and Mid-Winter Conferences and the official visit of the International President or his designated representative. From time to time the Executive Director may also travel to special Divisional and Club events and provide programs at Divisional and Club events.
- 10) Manage the District Office, including but not limited to:
 - a. Employment of staff;
 - b. Discipline of staff as necessary;
 - c. Maintenance of facilities and equipment;
 - d. Responsible for proper insurance coverage, bond protection, etc;
 - e. Insure the policies of the Kiwanis District are followed, whether written or implied;
 - f. Keeper and protector of the Official Seal of the District.
- 11) Serve as Financial Counselor to the Key Club District and Circle K District under the direction of the District Administrators. This shall include making all disbursements, depositing receipts, establishing budgets and establishing financial policy. This shall include negotiating and reviewing all contracts for both organizations.
- 12) The Executive Director shall be responsible for making recommendations for District Convention sites to the Board of Trustees and shall also be responsible for the general management of the convention as well as contract negotiation.
- 13) The Executive Director shall be responsible for the overall management, site selection and contract negotiation for the Mid-Winter Conference, subject to District Board review and approval.

- 14) The Executive Director shall be responsible for the overall management and contract negotiation of all other Kiwanis District official functions and training conferences.
- 15) The Executive Director shall be responsible in association with the respective Administrators for the general management, site selection and contract negotiations of the Key Club and Circle K District Conventions.
- 16) The Executive Director shall over see the compilation and distribution of mailings and electronic communication for the Kiwanis, Key Club and Circle K Districts.
- 17) The Executive Director shall strive to keep the District Board informed on all matters affecting them as well as the clubs in the Pennsylvania District.
- 18) Other than financial guidance and convention services, the Executive Director shall provide services to either Key Club or Circle K only by arrangements made with the respective District Administrators.
- 19) The Executive Director shall not be the Editor of the Keystone Kiwanian. The selection of a publisher should be made by the Board of Trustees upon the recommendation of the editor. The Executive Director will be involved in the distribution of the Keystone Kiwanian.
- 20) The Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation should not be the responsibility of the Executive Director except that he/she shall over see the deposit of Foundation receipts and the acknowledgment of the contributions. The Executive Director will, also, be involved in preparing materials for the Foundation convention activities and provide general guidance for those events.
- 21) The Executive director will provide support and direction for District New Club Building activities as planned and implemented by the District Governor and Board of Trustees.
- 22) Under the direction of the District Board of Trustees, the Executive Director shall seek to develop service initiatives focused on young children that will raise the visibility of Kiwanis in Pennsylvania in a significant and meaningful manner.
- 23) As determined and approved by the District Board of Trustees, other duties maybe assigned to the Executive Director.

• It is estimated that full-time performance of the duties listed herein should average 40 to 55 hours per week.

Position Summary:

The District Executive is appointed by and reports to the District Board of Directors.

As provided for in the Pennsylvania District By-Laws, the person in this position serves a key position in the blended role of District Executive, District Secretary, and District Treasurer.

The District Executive will have overall strategic and operational responsibility for the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International non-profit staff, programs, strengthening and growth, and overall execution of its mission. The District Executive will have developed a deep knowledge of Kiwanis International and the Pennsylvania District core programs, operations, and business plans.

It is a requirement that the District Executive be an active member of a Pennsylvania District Kiwanis Club.

This position description does not create an employment contract, implied or otherwise, or create anything other than an "at will" relationship. However, inasmuch as the District Board membership is changed annually, the District Board is prevented from removal of the incumbent district director for reasons other than negligent performance of duties or criminal activities during the first 90 days of each Kiwanis administrative year (October 1 through December 31).

General Responsibilities:

Leadership & Management:

- Ensure ongoing District program excellence, rigorous program evaluation, and consistent quality of finance and administration, fundraising, communications, and systems; recommend timelines and resources needed to achieve the strategic goals of the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International.
- Actively engage and energize Pennsylvania Kiwanis members, volunteers, board members, district committee chairs, alumni, partnering organizations, and donors.
- Develop, maintain, and support the Board of Directors, serve as ex-officio of each committee, seek and build board involvement with strategic direction for both ongoing local operations as well as for Kiwanis International overarching direction.
- Lead, coach, develop, and promote the Pennsylvania Kiwanis District leadership team. Working hand-in-hand with the elected District Governor and others, ensure effective systems are in place to track program progress, and regularly evaluate program components, so as to measure successes that can be effectively communicated to the Board, and other constituents.
- Attend all District formal meetings such as the annual District Convention, Regular District Mid-Winter Conference, all Trustee meetings, District Key Club Convention, District Circle-K convention, and other meetings that may require the District Executive's expertise and direct involvement.
- Attend the Kiwanis International Convention, International Council Meeting, and any District Executives' meetings called by Kiwanis International.
- From time to time, attend those additional Division, Region, and Club meetings and events as agreed to by the District Board and/or Governor.
- Coordinate all activities in advance with the District Governor, and Governor Elect by regularly sharing electronic calendars such as Outlook or through other acceptable means such as written "planned weekly activity reports".
- All functions of the District Executive position will be performed in a timely manner with acceptable quality.
- Preserve, and protect all District assets.

Official District Relationship:

• The District employs the District Executive to represent the District and the overall Kiwanis membership in a wide variety of situations throughout each Kiwanis year.

Unless the District Executive's activities are directly related to District support or
otherwise authorized activity, it shall be assumed that the District Executive is
acting as a Kiwanis member volunteer representing his or her home Kiwanis Club.

Fundraising & Communications:

- Expand District:revenue generating and fundraising activities to support existing District program operations.
- Assist the District Public Relations Chair to deepen and refine all aspects of communications — from web presence to external relations with the goal of creating a stronger brand
- Use external presence and relationships to garner new opportunities.

Planning & New Initiatives:

- Support the District's implementation of Kiwanis International's I-Plan strategic initiative.
- Actively develop and build partnerships in new markets, establishing relationships with partner, political, and community leaders.
- Be an external District-wide presence that promotes and communicates Kiwanis program results with an emphasis on the successes of the local District/Club programs as a model for District and Kiwanis International replication.

As District Executive:

- Manage the District Office, including but not limited to:
 - Manage, negotiate and execute all contracts for the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International and District Key Club and Circle-K.
 - Employment and supervision of authorized staff
 - Maintenance of facilities and equipment
 - Maintain proper insurances, bond protection, etc. as authorized by the District Board of Trustees.
 - Keep and protect the official seal of the District.
- Obtain proposals and provide recommendations to the Board of Trustees for the annual District Convention sites.
- Serve as ex officio member of the Convention Committee assisting in contract negotiations, convention budget development, program recommendations, and activity suggestions, etc. Represent the District Board and serve as the authorized official signing all approved contracts for convention commitments for the convention.

- Similarly, perform the same duties as they may pertain to the District Mid-Winter Conference as provided for in the above paragraphs.
- In a similar manner, work closely with the District Key Club Board, Circle K Board and respective District Administrators to propose and manage their respective District Conventions and training meetings.
- The District Executive shall keep the District Board, and District Officers informed of all matters affecting the district.
- Prepare a "District Executive Report" for presentation to the District membership at the annual District Convention, District Mid-Winter Conference to the District membership; and to the participants at Trustee meetings, and other meetings that the Board of Trustees from time to time may require.
- In addition to other services provided to the Key Club and Circle K Districts, the District Executive may provide other services to these organizations by arrangement with the respective District Administrators and as authorized by the District Board of Trustees.
- In addition to other services provided to the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation, the District Executive may provide other services to this organization by arrangement with the foundation President and as authorized by the District Board of Trustees.
- The District Executive will provide support to the District Committee Chairs as planned and implemented by the District Governor and the Board of Trustees
- The District Executive will seek to develop service initiatives focused on young children as authorized by the Board of Trustees. The purpose of these efforts would be to raise the visibility of the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International in a significant and meaningful manner.
- As determined and approved by the District Board of Trustees, other duties may be assigned to the District Executive.

As District Treasurer:

- Maintain financial and accounting records of the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International and its service leadership organizations as may be required from time to time.
- Prepare and submit monthly reports for the various funds under the District Executive's control and responsibility to keep board members fully informed of revenues, expenses, and performance to budget. Additionally, these reports should include detail about any and all unpaid invoices.
- Prepare and submit monthly reports of all receipts and deposits into the accounts of the Pennsylvania Kiwanis District Foundation.
- Maintain all records of revenues and disbursements in accordance with commonly acceptable accounting practices.

- Sign all checks and issue payment via check or district credit/debit card for authorized and approved expenditures.
- Collect all funds due to the District and deposit them into the appropriate District accounts.
- Serve as the financial counselor to the Key Club District and Circle K District boards with the advice and consent of the respective District Administrators.
 This shall include but not limited to, making all deposits, making authorized disbursements, developing budgets and recommending financial policy.
- Prepare and submit monthly reports for all expenses of the District Executive including those expenses either direct billed to the District or those submitted for reimbursement.

As District Secretary:

- Maintain and retain all records of the District to include minutes of District Board meetings, District convention, and other District meetings.
- Receive all official correspondence for the District. As appropriate, distribute to District Officers, Trustees, region, division, and club leaders including club secretaries and, when appropriate, all District Kiwanis Club members.
- Compile and distribute mailings and electronic communications for the Pennsylvania Kiwanis, Key Club, and Circle K Districts.
- Collect data for submission and submit all official reports required by Kiwanis International.
- Prepare a "District Secretary's Report" for presentation to the District membership at the annual District Convention, District Mid-Winter Conference, Trustee meetings, and, from time to time, other meetings that the District Board may require.

Minimum qualifications (Education, Experience, and Skills):

- 4-year college degree in Business administration of equivalent.
- At least 5 years of Kiwanis membership and experience.
- Ability to work closely with internal and external constituents.
- Ability to work on multiple tasks simultaneously.
- Have proven leadership, coaching, and relationship management experience.
- Have excellent organizational management skills with the ability to coach, and manage; and manage a budget.
- Past success working with a Board of Directors with the ability to cultivate existing board member relationships.
- Have strong written and verbal communication skills; a persuasive and passionate communicator with excellent interpersonal skills.

Ability to work effectively in collaboration with volunteers.

Physical Demands and Work Environment:

- The description of the physical demands and the work environment characteristics here represent those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform and those that may be encountered while performing the essential functions of the position of District Executive.
- Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.
- While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to sit, and
 use hands. The employee frequently is required to talk, and hear to facilitate
 communication. The employee is occasionally required to stand, walk, reach.
 stoop, kneel, crouch or crawl in order set up for conferences and meetings. The
 District Executive is required to occasionally lift and/or move items up to 70 pounds.

This job description in no way states or implies that these are the only duties to be performed by the District Executive. The District Executive is required to follow any other job-related instructions and to perform any other job-related duties requested by the District Board or other person authorized to give instructions or assignments.
