### DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

September 27, 2014

The first meeting of the 2014-15 District Board of Trustees was held on September 27, 2014 at the Kiwanis District office. Governor Bob Raub presided.

The invocation was provided by Trustee Rev. Ann Graves.

All board members were present except for Trustees Ann Moffitt and Megan Kuffa. Guests included Formula Team Chair Cathy Szymanski, Lt. Governors Lisa Smith, Lt. Governor Tracy Smith and David Szymanski.

The first item of consideration was the appointment of a trustee for Region VII. With the election of Jen Vare to the position of Governor-elect, the position of Region VII is vacant and the board must appoint a replacement. Kate Feryo from the Kiwanis Club of West Chester has submitted a nomination form. After consideration, a motion was made, seconded and approved to appoint Kate Feryo as Region VII until September 30, 2016. See the pages marked 5-8.

At future meetings, board members will be asked to relate a Kiwanis message and/or thought. The order of presenters, starting with the February 1<sup>st</sup> meeting, will be Keith Smith, Megan Kuffa, Mark Mishinski, Judy Janes, Kate Feryo, Ann Moffitt, Ann Graves, Kevin Thomas, Rick Relyea and Jen Vare.

#### Membership & New Club Building (See the pages marked 12-24)

Formula Team Chair Cathy Szymanski led a discussion on new club building and membership.

The decision of the Elk County Kiwanis club to surrender its charter was discussed. The club decided to disband because they did not like getting information from Kiwanis and being told they needed to change to adopt to the Kiwanis way.

New clubs in Warrington, Kennett Square and East Norriton Curves are targeted for the first quarter of the administrative year.

Revitalization in Region 2 was discussed. Rebuilding the Bedford club was discussed.

A through discussion on membership was conducted.

A motion was introduced to send a letter to members of Kiwanis clubs that disband/surrender their charter offering them membership in another club; the Formula Team will develop the letter that will be sent out from the District office. The motion was seconded and approved.

Consent Agenda (See the pages marked 9-11 and 25-58)

The items in the consent agenda were approved by proper motion, second and vote.

#### **Discussion and Action items**

The situation of the new Pittsburgh Airport Area Club, the Sewickley Club and the Moon Township Key Club was discussed. See the page marked 59. It appears that this situation may work itself out but it is possible that the District may need to intervene in some way.

Club Leadership Education was discussed. See the pages marked 60-61. Mark Mishinski has submitted the application to become the District's master trainer, which is a 3 year commitment. Discussion centered on the training which took place and what needs to be done moving forward in the future.

Discussion took place centered on the Lt. Governor vacancy in Division 2W. After discussion, a motion was introduced, seconded and approved to combine Divisions 2W and 2E into one Division, Division 2.

Vacancies in Divisions 4, 5, 6 and 8 were discussed. It was proposed that Divisions 4 and 5 be merged. A motion was introduced to merge Divisions 4 and 5 pending feedback from the clubs. The motion was seconded. After further discussion, the motion was tabled.

A meeting will be setup during the week of October 20<sup>th</sup> to have a meeting in Division 17 to discuss future leadership in the Division.

Regions III and IV will be holding trustee elections at their fall meetings. Region IV has a candidate, Bill Henning from the Kiwanis Club of Bald Eagle and Nittany Valleys. Region III has no candidate; discussion focused on this. A list of potential candidates will be developed and vetted.

2015-16 Lt. Governors were reviewed; see the page marked 62A. Divisions 12N, 13N and 22 have candidates in addition to those listed.

The evaluations and financial report from the 2014 Kiwanis District Convention were reviewed. See the pages marked 67-73.

Fall regional meetings were reviewed.

November 5, 2014 at 8:00 PM was established as a date to have a District Board Conference call to approve the Midwinter Conference agenda/program and budget.

The Investment and Account Balances reports were reviewed. See the pages marked 75-79.

An update was provided on the 2014-15 District Budget and finances. See the page marked 80.

An operating budget for 2014-15 was reviewed and considered. See the page marked 81. The budget was approved as presented by proper motion, second and vote.

A District Board finance committee was appointed to review and make additional budget recommendations. The committee will be chaired by Keith Smith. Jen Vare, Rick Relyea, Bob Raub and Kevin Thomas will be members of the committee.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> annual District Holiday Party was considered. See the page marked 82. The party was approved as proposed.

A report was provided on the 2013-14 District Super Raffle. After review of the 2013-14 raffle results, the raffle was approved for the 2014-15 year.

The electric choice program with Ambit was discussed. The District is receiving about \$17.00 per month from the program. The program has not gained traction. After discussion, another promotional push will be put together and sent out across the District.

A proposal from Dominion energy to market natural gas to Pennsylvania Kiwanis Members was considered. 5ee the pages marked 89 -90. After discussion, a motion to table the proposal was introduced, seconded and approved.

A proposal to consider increased compensation for the District Executive Director was discussed. The proposal would involve using the District's American Express points and would result in no salary increase. The proposal was approved as submitted.

The District office lease was discussed. The lease expires on September 30, 2015. Notice of intent to renew or not renew has to occur by June 30, 2015. A committee was appointed to study the lease situation and options. The committee will consist of the Bob Raub, Jen Vare, Kevin Thomas, Rick Relyea and Naomi Fredlund. The committee will report at the January 31, 2015 Board meeting and have final recommendations ready by the board meeting on April 18, 2015.

The procedure that the District will need to follow in adopting the new form for District bylaws was discussed. See the page marked 93. The District Laws and Regulations committee chaired by Matt Wise will be in charge of organizing and establishing the procedure to be followed. Everything will need to be finalized by the board meeting on April 21, 2015.

The Key Club District 2015 Convention Budget was considered. See the page marked 94. The budget was approved as presented.

Governor Mark Mishinski reported on the review of the District strategic plan. See the pages marked 95-100. After review, the recommendations in the report were accepted and Governor-elect Jen Vare will lead a committee to implement the changes recommended in the report.

A report was provided on Early Childhood Learning and Development. See the pages marked 101-102.

The request by the Pre K for PA to have the Executive Director serve on the Leadership Council of the Pre K for PA campaign was considered. See the page marked 103. The board approved the request.

A proposed fundraiser involving the Philadelphia 76's was considered. A meeting will be set up with the 76's representative and Bob Raub, Mark Mishinski and Kevin Thomas to explore this program further. The board approved the committee moving forward as long as there was no financial commitment on behalf of the district.

A discussion focused on clubs not submitting the new standard form of club bylaws. See the pages marked 108-110. The laws and regulations committee chaired by Matt Wise will be following up with the clubs that have not submitted the new bylaws.

A discussion took place on the Kiwanis Philadelphia Phillies baseball game. At this time no formal action was taken. A discussion will take place to insure that the information put out on the game does not indicate it is a District event. A discussion will, also, be held about involving the District Foundation as a participant in the 50/50 held at the game.

A discussion took place on the Past District Governors committee and the Past Lt. Governors association. After discussion, a motion was introduced, seconded and approved to no longer provide time on the convention agenda for a meeting of the Past Lt. Governors at the convention.

At the suggestion of Kiwanis International, the District discussed adopting a spousal travel reimbursement policy. After review, the board adopted a policy that the District will not pay for any kind of spouse/partner travel.

Discussion took place on District Awards. After discussion, a committee was appointed to review the awards. That committee will consist of board members Kate Feryo and Megan Kuffa. They will be tasked with reviewing the District awards and making a report at the January 31<sup>st</sup> District Board meeting.

The District Board considered a request to allow a District Life Membership to be transferred from one member to another. After discussion and consideration, the board determined by proper motion, second and vote to not allow this to happen.

By proper motion, second and vote, it was decided to allow Trustees who are visiting clubs in Divisions with no Lt. Governors to be eligible for the same mileage stipend as are Lt. Governors when they visit clubs in Divisions without Lt. Governors.

The Kiwanis License Plate with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania was discussed. There has been considerable different information coming from the Department of Transportation regarding how the program works. After discussion, it was decided to test the process with one application before submitting additional applications.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 3:35 PM. The next meeting is presently scheduled for January 31, 2015 at the Kiwanis District Office.

Kiwanians who have served as a Club President and Lieutenant Governor are eligible to serve as a Trustee provided they are endorsed by their Club and Division and have submitted their Nomination Form to the Pennsylvania Kiwanis District Office on or before March 15.

There is no limit on the number of Trustee candidates that a Club or Division may endorse.

The candidates having met the above criteria are responsible for getting their own information out to the clubs that are in the Region they wish to serve. All expenses incurred will be paid for by the individual candidates and may be done in any manner as long as it is in good taste. Candidates may start their campaigns as soon as they have met the requirements in paragraph one.

Candidates will be elected in Regional meetings held between April 15 and May 15. If there is more than one candidate in the region a vote will be paper ballot. One third of the Clubs in the Region must be present and the majority vote getter is the winner. Each Club may have three (3) delegates. Each candidate will have up to five (5) minutes to speak including the Kiwanian nominating him/her.

A Trustee is making a commitment to serve the Pennsylvania District for a maximum of three (3) consecutive years. A Trustee will serve as the CEO of his/her Region, conduct the Fail & Spring meetings, be responsible for the Governor's official visit, responsible to conduct the election for his/her replacement, and work with the Lieutenant Governors in the region for the success of each Division.

Trustees are also making a commitment to attend a weekend orientation session, four (4) District Board meetings, the District Convention in August and the Midwinter Conference for as long as they continue to be held. Trustees are encouraged to attend the Kiwanis International Convention and District Conventions for Aktion, Circle K and Key Club.

## DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING July 12, 2014

The fourth meeting of the 2013-14 District Board of Trustees was held on July 12, 2014 at Citizens Bank Stadium, Philadelphia, PA. Governor Mark Mishinski presided.

The invocation was provided by Governor Mark Mishinski

All board members were present except for Immediate Past Governor Bruce Eberly and Trustees Al Gesler and Ann Graves. Guests included David Szymanski and Past Governor and Membership Growth Chair Cathy Szymanski and Lt. Governors Tracy Smith and Bonnie Houpt.

#### Membership & New Club Building (See the pages marked 3-14)

A report was provided on clubs built in the 2012-13 year. The challenges of the Greencastle and Lancaster clubs were discussed.

The Centennial e-Kiwanis was discussed and reviewed.

The Pittsburgh Airport Area Kiwanis club will hold its charter night on August 5, 2014.

The Liberty club has its charter tentatively scheduled for September 16, 2014. They chartered with 20 members and are now up to 25 members.

The new club effort in Warrington is slated for an organizational meeting on September 24, 2014. Efforts for a new club at Shannondell were discussed. Back Mountain has 11 potential members with an informational meeting tentatively scheduled on July 24<sup>th</sup>. Mohegan Sun as a company club was discussed.

A discussion was held on how to handle checks for a new Kiwanis club. A procedure will be written up by Cathy Szymanski.

New clubs in Bedford, Renovo, Cranberry Township, Cochranton, Reading, South Williamsport and Loyalsock Township were discussed.

A discussion centered on what was needed to do to insure the District has growth on the 2013-14 year. After discussion, it was agreed we would need at least net growth of 232 members to have growth in the District.

#### Consent Agenda (See the pages marked 15-26 and 28-58)

The consent agenda items were approved by the board except for the Executive Director's report which was moved to the action area by a properly received request of Trustee Jen Vare.

#### **Discussion and Action items**

The Executive Directors report was discussed, in particular items 2 and 3. (See the page marked 27) After discussion and follow up plans being formulated, the report was approved.

The 2014-15 Circle K District Budget was submitted for approval. It is the pages marked 59 and 60. After review and discussion, the budget was approved as presented.

The 2014-15 Key Club District was submitted for approval. It is the page marked 61. After review and discussion, the budget was approved as presented.

The 2013-14 Kiwanis District budget was reviewed. It is the page marked 62.

The investment/reserve and account balance reports were reviewed. It is the page marked 63-68.

Ambit Energy program was discussed. Discussion took place on the ways to better promote and enhance the program. A stronger hands on, personal sales approach is needed. A forum will be organized at the convention to highlight the program.

A report was provided on the Super Raffle fundraiser. It is the page marked 69.

No progress has been made on the Community Aid and Unclaimed property fundraisers.

A discussion was held on the A+ Affiliate program; see the pages marked 69E and 69F. A design was submitted for the District Board's consideration for a District shirt. The design for the shirt was approved and a program will be setup to get the shirt ready for the District Convention.

Information was provided on the mixed bag fundraising program. See the pages marked 69B to 69D. After review and discussion and by proper motion, second and vote, participation in the program was approved.

A review was conducted on clubs not submitting a 2014-15 Election Report.

Vacant 2014-15Lt. Governor positions were reviewed. See the pages marked 73 and 74. In effort to find leadership for Division 17, a Division meeting will be scheduled.

A discussion was held on Andrea Cuda of the Kiwanis Club of Sheridan serving as Lt. Governor for Division 5 for the 2014-15 year. See the page marked 75-76. After discussion, a plan was formulated to address the concerns about Andrea not having served as a Kiwanis club president so she can serve as Lt. Governor. A discussion will, also, be held about and with a potential candidate for Division 6.

By proper motion, second and after discussion, Ann Moffitt was appointed Region V Trustee for the term of October 1, 2014 to September 30, 2017 since no official election could be held.

In the event that Region VII Trustee Jen Vare is elected Governor-elect for 2014-15, a procedure to fill the Trustee vacancy that election will create was discussed and determined. Candidates will be solicited by a letter sent to club leaders on Monday, August 25<sup>th</sup>. Candidates will need to submit their application to the District office by September 20<sup>th</sup>. Candidates will be invited to the board meeting on September 27<sup>th</sup> and the board will select a Trustee for Region VII as the first item on the agenda and the new Trustee will be able to vote and participate as a full voting board member.

Information was provided on the District Convention. See the pages marked 84A-84F. District Executive Director Kevin Thomas indicated to the board he has some concern about hotel attrition in the event we do not pick up enough hotel sleeping rooms.

A discussion was held on club officer training. After discussion, Trustees were instructed to implement the live training sessions as best they are able given the training challenges we have encountered this year. Governor Mark Mishinski will send training information to all Region Trustees and facilitators.

Information was provided on Fall Region Meetings and the Governor's official visit. See the page marked 88. Those regions without established dates were urged to establish them as soon as possible.

Information was provided on the District Foundation Nominating Committee. See the Page marked 91.

An update was provided on our work in the area of Early Childhood Development. It was indicated the District Foundation board of directors has approved-funding for 20,000 additional guides. A letter of appreciation will be written on behalf of the District thanking the Foundation for its unwavering support of the guide program.

A Pennsylvania State license plate for Kiwanis was discussed. See the pages marked 95 and 96. After consideration, a motion was introduced and second to have the District Executive Director get in touch with PennDOT to get the appropriate

application and make it available to interested Kiwanians. This motion was removed from the table after discussion to allow for the collection of more information that will be shared with the board members. A conference call with Trustees and Lt. Governors is scheduled for August 6<sup>th</sup> and board will stay on after that call to consider the program further.

A request has been received to allow Region VI to house it treasury with the District. Presently, it is housed with a club and the Region cannot setup its own bank account. After discussion and consideration, the District declined this request.

100<sup>th</sup> anniversary activities were discussed for Kiwanis International and for the Pennsylvania District. Governor-elect Bob Raub will be appointing a District committee to promote and maximize participation in the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Kiwanis Club of Detroit and Kiwanis International. The District Board, at its April meeting, appointed a committee, consisting of Trustees Megan Kuffa and Jen Vare, to work on planning special events and promotion for the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Convention of the Pennsylvania District in 2017 and the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Kiwanis Club of Pittsburgh.

The District's strategic plan was discussed. No review or action has taken place since the last board meeting on the plan.

With no further action to discuss the meeting was adjourned at 4:02 PM.



Registration will open in January and will close on April 10 (or when the camp reaches 80 participants). Key Leader sold out five weeks prior to the event last year. Please encourage clubs to register their students early.

#### **Key Leader Ambassador**

The position of Key Leader Ambassador was recently announced by Kiwanis International. Each year, a Key Leader graduate will be appointed to the position by the Key Club District Board. The goal of this position is to increase the visibility of Key Leader throughout Key Clubs, resulting in increased attendance, especially among younger students. The responsibilities of this position will include marketing Key Leader through Pennsylvania Key Club communication channels, distributing material to each Key Club Lt. Governor to promote to their clubs, meeting with the District Key Leader Committee, and submitting a report for each Key Club District Board Meeting.

**Ngodoo Zume** has been name the Key Leader Ambassador. Ngodoo is currently a senior at Shippensburg Area High School. She attended Key Leader in April 2014. The Key Leader Committee is looking forward to working with Ngodoo. We are confident that she is going to do a great job in her new role!

#### **Financial Guarantee**

This year, Kiwanis International is requiring a financial guarantee of those Districts that failed to meet the minimum requirement of 60 student participants last year. As a direct result of the success our April event, the Pennsylvania District was not required to provide a financial guarantee for the 2015 event. If it were necessary for us provide such a guarantee, there might be an unfunded liability of several thousand dollars that would draw into question our ability to host the event.

#### Other Committee Activity

We have submitted a request to the Foundation Board to renew the \$75.00 scholarship for each participant. These scholarships were a crucial piece to our success last year.

A Key Leader workshop was hosted at Kiwanis District Convention. Key Leader promotional materials will be included in the fall Kiwanis and Key Club District mailings.

# Pa. District Kiwanis International Report Report as of September 22, 2014 Aktion Clubs by Luida Shearer, Administrator

The Pennsylvania District Aktion Club annual convention was held at Laurel Lodge in Altoona on August 2. Five clubs and 25 Aktion Clubbers attended the convention along with a number of advisors and guests, including our Pennsylvania District Kiwanis Governor, Governor Elect, District Executive Director and 2 Circle K members. Governor Mark presented a very motivational program in the afternoon together with his 2 favorite people, Sandy and Oreo, who helped underline the most important point of his presentation - no matter who you are or how small you may be, you are still able to make a difference. All of our members truly enjoyed Gov. Mark's presentation as well as meeting his two friends.

We did attend the prayer breakfast held by the Crawford County Aktion Club in April. It is always a great event to attend along with Kiwanis members from several clubs in their division. Their club is quite active even though they are small and they have great support from their Kiwanis Club.

Award applications have been submitted in the various categories offer by Kiwanis International for Aktion Clubs and all have been judged. The first-place recipients at the district level have been forwarded to KI for judging. Scrapbooks are phenominal - they are huge and cover so many activities it almost makes your head swim. First, second or third place certificates have been sent to the clubs and members who submitted award entries and we will know some time in October if any of our first-place entires were given a first place at the International level.

We are facing a problem with one of our clubs, Royal Aktion Club in Wexford. Through a new governmental program that is affecting all organizations who support those with disabilities many are facing closure because they do not have their people out in the community enough. It seems that the thinking is all people are employable and we all know that is not always the case.

The Royal members had met at a church as part of a day program but that was not licensed as a day care and they had to shut down. To avoid losing the club entirely they will be meeting at a different location, with a different group, and with the same Kiwanis advisor. This means we will not lose this club and will be able to continue serving those members.

In addition as an outshoot of the situation some of the people who had worked with the Royal Aktion Club are planning to open another Aktion Club with yet another group using the same Kiwanis Club and Kiwanis advisor for support. So through what could have been a great loss, we will actually gain another Aktion Club.

The annual dues for Aktion Club members has increased from \$5 to \$8 per year. Even

though this is the first increase since Aktion Club became an official member of the Kiwanis Service Leadership Program in 2000 it remains to be seen just how much this may affect our membership. # Comments regarding committee:

There were tensions and concerns over the summer within the committee as the committee felt that I had not given enough direction to the committee as to what they should be doing. I had taken too much of a "back seat" approach to see what the Circle K District Board was going to do, and the committee expressed their concerns. In many ways in retrospect I agree with their assessment. Since the PA Kiwanis District Convention, which was when we had a very open and honest conversation, I have taken more effort in communicating with the committee and the Circle K board to help keep things on track and in the right direction. We have held 2 phone conferences since then as well as communicated via email to assist with planning the events this fall. They have attended at least one Fall Training Conference that was held on their respective sides of the district (there was one held in Pittsburgh and one in Philadelphia).

# Concerns/issues:

We have had several members apply and join the board, but because of personal issues (including financial, familial, and medical reasons), 3 have already resigned. Despite multiple attempts to contact another member via phone, text, email, and Facebook by multiple people, we were unable to get any response from the District Treasurer, and he was removed from office by a vote of the District Board.

At this time, we have a board of 6 members: Governor Heather Christensen, Secretary Melissa Campbell, Three Rivers (Pittsburgh) Division LTG Emily Croll, Keystone (State College) LTG Division Aileen Liew, and Liberty (Philadelphia) Division LTG Jackie Briguglio.

Vacant positions: District Treasurer, Snowbelt (Erie) Division LTG, Colonial (Harrisburg) Division LTG, and Black Diamond (Wilkes-Barre/Scranton) Division LTG, in addition to any chairs.

Due to the small size of the board, I feel the board feels overwhelmed with the amount of work that has to be done to maintain the functions of the District. The board needs a lot of support both emotionally, educationally, and to some degree needs assist with the functions of the District. It is with much appreciation that Chair Stef Stamatopoulos and Governor-Elect Jen Vare is helping with leading up the effort to assist InterPACK planning.

# Concerns/issues that require District Board action or knowledge:

Over the last couple of months with the way things have gone and with the conversations I have had with multiple people both within Kiwanis and outside of Kiwanis, I have thought a lot about my role as District Chair/Administrator for PA Circle K. I have learned more and more what I don't know as far as "how things should be done". I feel that there are others who can view the needs of the district much more analytically than I can, and can see things several steps further than I can. I have thought about my leadership style and how it fits in with things. I would say I am a "lead

by example" type of person, leading by "getting my hands dirty" with those I'm working with. In some ways, I feel like I suit the "do here and now" mind set.

Having stated this and by inherent nature of the District Chair/Administrator position, I feel like I may not be the best fit for this position. My first two years in this position, I was enthusiastic about where I wanted things to go with the District. I feel that I was lucky in my first two years that I have had a Circle K Governor who was enthusiastic as well as who was able to take charge in getting things done to keep the District moving. At a point now where we need the District moving forward further with growth in membership and leadership, I feel that someone who is able to have the foresight is better fit for this position than I.

What I have stated above is of course is coming from a place of personal sentiments, but also intellectual thoughts. I will use an analogy of situations that have arisen at work. When departmental leadership roles such as department manager, supervisor, or director have become available, my co-workers would ask if I am interested in the position. My usual response for years is that I do not want the position because I "don't want to be in charge". I feel more comfortable working under the direction of someone else. Applying this to Kiwanis and Circle K, I have asked myself that if I don't feel comfortable leading a department at work, why am I leading the PA District of Circle K?

To ease any concerns, I will finish out this administrative year and will continue in this role for as long as needed, and also still do the best that I can with the help of the Kiwanis Committee for PA Circle K, but I suggest that the Kiwanis Board begin looking for someone who is able to effectively see and execute a long term plan for growth for the PA District of Circle K.

# 1. Describe your region new club building activities:

12 North: The eKiwanis 2.0 club continues to function well. The Liberty Kiwanis Club had their Charter Night September 16, 2014. They appear to be on their way to being a successful club. All Region 4 Lieutenant Governors seek new club possibilities, including promoting them at Division and Region interclubs and conferences.

# 2. Describe your region activities to support and strengthen existing clubs:

The Division 12N LTGs continue to do well at encouraging and strengthening their clubs, as shown by their membership growth over the past several months. They are, however, losing the Loyalsock Club, which seeks to surrender its charter. 12S LTG Don Ulrich continues in constant touch with his clubs, by club visits and frequent messages and division news. 2014-15 12S LTG Shirley McPherrin has already scheduled her first division meeting. 14 LTGs Paige and Allan Michael are serving for another year, and are trying to find ways to help 14's smallest and most struggling clubs grow. All Region 4 LTGs recognize that there are clubs in their divisions that are in trouble, especially with low and declining membership, including several that are below charter strength.

# 3. Describe education activities in your region:

Region 4 had a very successful live CLE Workshop in Lewisburg July 26, 2014. 12S LTG Don Ulrich (Presidents) and 12S LTG-Elect Shirley McPherrin (Secretaries and Treasurers) facilitated the sessions, with excellent support from Governor Mark. 2014-15 club officers were encouraged to complete their online CLE training by the end of June. The 2014 CLE materials have been or are being distributed to all Region 4 clubs.

See Paragraph 5 below concerning the Region 4 Fall Conference.

# 4. What is your region doing to support youth/SLP?

Kiwanis Clubs' relationships with their sponsored SLPs are receiving substantial emphasis in the PA District, but there needs to be more emphasis in Region 4 on improving these relationships. Some clubs, but not enough, have good relationships with their SLPs. Many clubs need encouraging and direction in developing and maintaining those relationships. Some clubs invite Key Club and Circle K members to their division inter-clubs; this needs to happen more. Buffalo Valley AM Kiwanis is involved in Camp SETEBAID, a summer experience for children with diabetes; it was held August 10-16, 2014, and by all accounts was quite successful. Mifflinburg Kiwanis joins with their Key Club in their semi-annual highway cleanup, and will again, probably in October, 2014. Mifflinburg continues its program of members reading to young children.

A former Builders Club Advisor in Sayre PA has offered to start such a club in a school in that area. 12N Co-LTG Mike Haven is following up with The Valley, Athens Kiwanis Club.



## 5. What should the board be aware of in your region?

Division 12N will host a Joint Officer Induction Ceremony for all interested Kiwanis Clubs in Williamsport on October 2, 2014. The ceremony will be in conjunction with a "Murder Mystery Dinner". Last year's ceremony aboard the river boat "Hiawatha" was a great success.

The Region 4 Fall Conference will be held October 4, 2014, at the Foss Home at Geisinger Medical Center in Danville. Our guest speaker will be Buffalo Valley AM Kiwanis member Mark Moyer, Executive Director of SETABAID Services in Winfield PA; see Paragraph 4 above. Other speakers will include Past District Governor Ethan McBeth, who will speak on the Eliminate Project; District Governor Bob Raub, who will deliver his Governor's Message; and PA District Executive Director Kevin Thomas, who will speak on District and International administrative requirements and highlights.

Division 12 North continues to operate successfully in its structure of two sub-divisions.

Division 12 South will hold its annual Kisses For Kids, to benefit the Children's Miracle Network at Geisinger, at the Susquehanna Valley Mall in Selinsgrove, the weekend of February 13-15, 2015.

### 6. Other information for the Board:







### HOW THIS REVIEW WAS CONDUCTED

The Pennsylvania District Board has commissioned a review of the Pennsylvania Strategic Plan at the district board meeting of July 12, 2014. This report presents the findings of that commissioned review.

Data used in the preparation of this report were gatheted from the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International Strategic Plan of 2013, Kiwanis International prepared documents and online resources, Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International documentation and online resources.

The Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International Strategic Plan of 2013 is divided into five areas of excellence spanning the administrative years 2012-2013 to 2016-2017. Each area of excellence was examined separately comparing the stated district goals with actual Pennsylvania District performance over the past two years when performance data is available. The following sections are the findings of this review.

### AREA OF EXCELLENCE NUMBER 1 - MEMBERSHIP

### GOAL NUMBER 1 - TO REVITALIZE EXISITING CLUBS:

- 1. Objectives 1, 2 and 3 are either complete or are in the process of being finalized as a part of the Kiwanis International Global Campaign for Growth (i.e. The Formula). The Formula has necessitated a slight change in the annual review of these positions due to the five year commitment of the members who are currently in place as the District Growth Chait, Regional Club Builders and Regional Growth Teams. Additionally, The Formula has mandated that the growth teams be constructed as Division Club Builders and Division Growth Teams
- 2. Objective 4 has been incorporated into The Formula Campaign where the current district leadership will be vital components of their division Formula Teams.
- 3. Objective 5 is no longer necessary since The Formula has provided opportunities for all clubs to develop and enlist Formula Team focus into strengthening Kiwanis Clubs.

### GOAL NUMBER 2 - TO BUILD NEW CLUBS:

1. Objectives 1, 2 and 3 are either complete or are in the process of being finalized as a part of the Kiwanis International Global Campaign for Growth (i.e. The Formula). The Formula has necessitated a slight change in the annual review of these positions due to the five year commitment of the members who are currently in place as the District Growth Chair, Regional Club Builders and Regional Growth Teams. Additionally, The Formula has

- mandated that the growth teams be constructed as Division Club Builders and Division Growth Teams
- 2. Objective 4 has been incorporated into The Formula Campaign where the current district leadership will be vital components of their division Formula Teams.
- 3. Objective 5 is being accounted for by the Formula Teams looking at all sites where Kiwanis Clubs may be established.

### GOAL NUMBER 3 - TO RECRUITE KEY CLUB AND CIRCLE K GRADUATES INTO KIWANIS CLUBS:

- 1. Objective 1 is complete with the appointment of an Service Leadership Alumni Coordinator.
- 2. Objective 2 is an ongoing process that was begun during the 2013-2014 administrative year. CKI and Key Club members were provided information about the International Alumni Associations at their respective district conventions. Additionally, graduating senior contact information was collected from interested members who wish to remain in contact with the K Family
- 3. Objectives 3 and 4 have not begun at this time. Currently, there is no vehicle to easily link a graduating SLP member to a Kiwanis Club. Although, the International Board of Trustees has made membership in a Kiwanis Club easier, less expensive and hopefully more attractive for graduating SLP members with actions taken in 2014.

### MEMBERSHIP TARGETS:

- 2012-2013 target was 5,000 members. The actual membership total for the year as of September 2013 was 4,131 members which was a substantial loss in membership of approximately 500 members according to Kiwanis International.
- 2013-2014 target is 5,250 members. The actual membership total for the year as of the August 2014 membership report was 4,282 members which reflects a growth in membership of 151 members to date.
- 3. In conclusion, neither goal is reflective of the actual district membership at this time and appears to be unrealistic given the past five year performance of the district. A revision of these targets is warranted.

### AREA OF EXCELLENCE NUMBER 2 - SERVICE

This entire area of excellence is void of any goals. The objectives listed in the area appear to be written in the form of goals; however, objectives 2-6 are not measureable. Objective 1 does call for an increase of service hours by each club at the rate of 10% increase; however, this information was unavailable for review. The format of this area made it unreviewable. A revision is warranted.

### AREA OF EXCELLENCE NUMBER 3 - LEADERSHIP

GOAL NUMBER 1 — DEVELOP A LEADERSHIP PROGRAM AND METHOD FOR DELIVERY THROUGHOUT THE DISTRICT:

 Objectives 1 and 2 have been provided for us by Kiwanis International in many areas from club leadership, membership development, youth protection and many other areas. We need to use what is available more effectively.

GOAL NUMBER 2 – IDENTIFY POTENTIAL NEW LEADERS AND CULTIVATE NEW LEADERS AND MEMBERS IN COMMUNITY:

- 1. This is being done at many levels of the organization, but in most cases, it is simply done when a vacancy becomes available or the need arises.
- 2. The process of identifying leaders needs to be extended farther in advance of crunch time.

### LEADERSHIP TARGETS:

- 2012-2013 target was: Indentify potential new leaders and cultivate new leaders and members in community
- 2013-2014 target was: Indentify potential new leaders and cultivate new leaders and members in community and Indentify potential new leaders and cultivate new leaders and members in community
- 3. Agreed both of the targets need to be accomplished with appropriate lead time so the proper training can be completed.

### AREA OF EXCELLENCE NUMBER 4 - ADMINISTRATION/GOVERNANCE

### GOAL NUMBER 1 - PROVIDE MEMBER EDUCATION:

1. Objectives 1, 2 and 3 are currently being provided to the district by Kiwanis International and the Pennsylvania District Education Committee.

### GOAL NUMBER 2 – PROVIDE CLUB LEADERSHIP EDUCATION TO THE DISTRICT:

 This goal is currently being provided to the district by Kiwanis International and the Pennsylvania District Education Committee.

2. Club Leadership Modules have been updated by Kiwanis International.

### ADMINISTRATION/GOVERNANCE TARGETS:

- 1. Administration/Governance targets for this are of excellence do not exist.
- 2. A revision of this area is recommended.

### AREA OF EXCELLENCE NUMBER 5 - FOUNDATION

### GOAL NUMBER 1 - TO GROW THE PA KIWANIS FOUNDATION:

- 1. Objective 1 is in the process to reach 1 million dollars. As of June 28, 2014, the foundation portfolio was at \$815,588 which was a ten year gain of \$30,294.
- 2. Objective 2 is to increase the number of contributions to the foundation. Empirical data to assess this objective was not available.

### GOAL NUMBER 2 - PROFESSIONALIZE THE PA FOUNDATION:

Objective 1 to hire a part time staff person in the district office cannot handle the business
of the foundation has not been done. The district office continues to handle foundation
business.

GOAL NUMBER 3 – STRENGTHEN DISTRICT PROJECTS (THE EARLY CHILDHOOD LEARNING PROGRAM):

### IN CONCLUSION

THIS STRATEGIC PLAN HAS GREAT VALUE TO THE DISTRICT AND CAN SERVE AS A COMPASS HELPING TO GUIDE FUTURE DECISIONS OF THE DISTRICT BOARD AND LEADERSHIP. A TREMENDOUS AMOUNT OF TIME, EFFORT AND WORK WENT INTO THE FORMATION OF THIS STRATEGIC PLAN. IT IS A TRESTAMENT TO THE DEDICATION OF THE MEMBERS WHO SERVED ON THE COMMITTEE TO DEVELOP IT. SINCE THE PURPOSE OF A STRATEGIC PLAN IS TO SET THE COURSE FOR FUTURE PLANNING, INVAIAIABLY SOME ADJUSTMENTS MUST BE MADE MID COURSE. WITH THIS IN MIND, THE FOLLOWING SUGGESTIONS ARE MADE:

- The language and terminology of this document should be revised to comply with the current Kiwanis International and Pennsylvania District standards of branding and program language.
- Area of Excellence 1 Membership targets should be revised to reflect the current state of district membership to make them reasonable district goals.

- Area of Excellence 2 Service should be revised to reflect accepted goal/objective format writing.
  - Goals in area 2 need to be written in a way that they can be measured for assessment.
  - o A complete rewrite of this Area of Excellence is warranted.
- Area of Excellence 3 Leadership should reflect an extended lead time in identifying
  future club, division, and district leaders. A stated pathway and mechanism should be

- Area of Excellence 4 Administration/Governance should reflect the resources
  provided by Kiwanis International and the resources developed and provided by the
  Pennsylvania District.

I wanted to take a few moments to update you on our efforts and work in the area of Early Childhood Learning and Development.

We continue to advocate, provide resources and educate for the benefit of the youngest children in Pennsylvania.

Kiwanis in Pennsylvania continues to work and partner with the Pennsylvania Early Learning Investment Commission as a strategic partner of the Commission. Kiwanis is represented at all state-wide Commission meetings and Commission members participate in many Kiwanis sponsored presentations. Commission members have joined Kiwanis and through the Commission, Kiwanis is well recognized in Pennsylvania State Government for its work in the area of Early Childhood Education and Development. While I will touch on our learning guides program shortly, our association with the Commission has brought us the program and strongly leveraged the dollars we have invested in the program.

There have been nearly 65 Kiwanis sponsored presentations across Pennsylvania including community symposiums in Bradford, Upper Bucks County and Meadville. The Bradford and Meadville presentations were attended by over 100 community members and were the impetus of 20 or more people joining Kiwanis.

Because of our work and leadership in this area, Pennsylvania has been asked to provide leadership to the Kiwanis International World. In 2012-13, 2013-14 and again in 2014-15, I have chaired or been asked to chair the Kiwanis International Young Children Priority One Committee. Additionally, Carlisle Kiwanian Nancy Fishman has been appointed to the committee. Nancy works with and for the Early Learning Investment Commission.

Additionally, the First Annual Kiwanis International Conference on Early Childhood Development, held in Louisville, Kentucky on April 15, 2013, was a Pennsylvania Kiwanis spearheaded effort as will be the second conference in Indianapolis, Indiana on September 30, 2014. Additionally, Kiwanis International is a signed supporter of the Strong Start Act, the first time Kiwanis International has signed on as a supporter of a piece of legislation.

Kiwanis Clubs and Kiwanis members continue to read to children across Pennsylvania and distribute books. In the last 12 month period, over 800 Kiwanis members read to over 22,000 children.

In the area of advocacy, over 100 Kiwanis Clubs wrote to their State Representatives and Senators during the latest State government budget debate expressing their support for the programs in the State budget that support quality early learning and development opportunities for young children. The good news here is that the Kiwanis efforts combined with the Early Learning Investment Commission and other groups and organizations across Pennsylvania helped procure funding increases for virtually all items in the state budget dealing with early development and learning.

Kiwanis Clubs are increasingly partnering with child care facilities and providers across the District; several clubs have "adopted" centers; some of the clubs which have been particularly proactive in this area include State College, Meadville, Nittany, Lewistown and Dillsburg.

Kiwanians are, also, receiving information on and being asked to support the Pre-K for PA program, which would insure quality early education opportunities for all Pennsylvania Children. Kiwanis in Pennsylvania is a supporting organization for this campaign. Bill France, president of the Nittany club, is a co-chair of the efforts being conducted in Centre County.

Finally but certainly not least, we continue to be involved in the distribution of the early learning guides, "Learning is Everywhere" and "Kindergarten Here I Come". With the generous support of the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation, Kiwanis Clubs and Kiwanians, we have funded and printed 100,000 guides and have distributed 88,500 of those to Pennsylvania families. That means we have reached over 88,500 households across Pennsylvania with these important learning resources (that have the Kiwanis logos) at no cost to those families.

We have reached into 55 of Pennsylvania's 67 Counties with these guides. The 13 we have not reached are: Lawrence, Beaver, Washington, Greene, Cameron, Potter, Bedford, Fulton, Susquehanna, Wayne, Pike and Wyoming.

Enclosed you will find a donation/pledge card for the Kiwanis Children's Early Fund. While we have enjoyed success with the guides and made a real impact, that program and our other efforts with early learning cannot continue without the financial support of Kiwanis Clubs and Kiwanians. We hope you and your club will consider making a pledge or donation by submitting the enclosed form. Last year, 10 Kiwanians and 19 Kiwanis clubs gave or pledged \$23,144 to the fund.

I am pleased to provide you this update. Five years ago, we were doing little in this area. Now we are helping to lead a movement. We should all feel proud of the difference we are making! Thanks for taking the time to read this.
