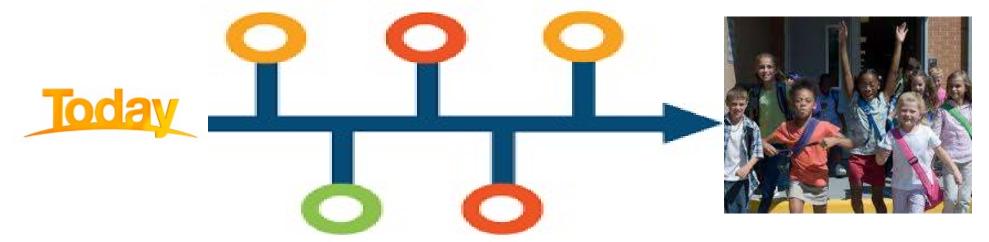

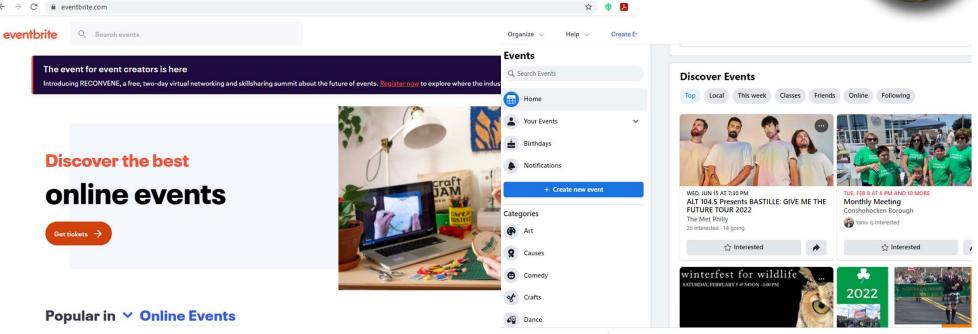

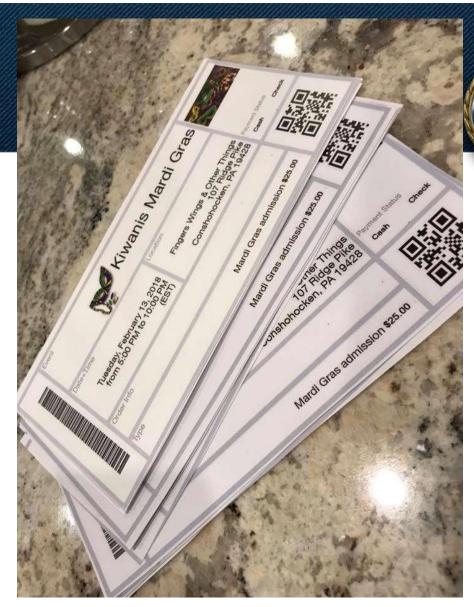












THINNER FAT TUESDAY

Conshohocken Kiwanis adds a spin to annual Mardi Gras celebration

Thanks to COVID-19 restrictions aimed at crowd control, New Orleans' signature Mardi Gras is way different this year. Most no-tably, the event's boisterous parades and elaborate rolling floats have been replaced by thousands of stationary "house floats" on res-idential exteriors and porches – brilliant bead, flower and featherbedecked montages with in-your-face special effects and dazzling sculptures dubbed "Yardi Gras. Also among the missing this Fat Tuesday - open bars and NOLA's trademark "go-cups," the result of a temporary, city-wide ban that confines Mardi Gras alcohol sales to restaurants.

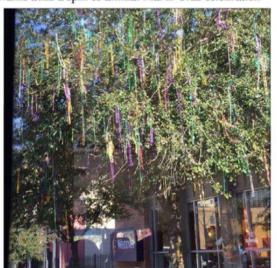
Not surprisingly, Con-shohocken Kiwanis Club's annual Mardi Gras fundraiser – set for Feb. 16 at Fingers Wings and Other Things, 107 Ridge Pike in Plymouth Township - has also been altered to suit the times. In short, the club came up with a hybrid celebration that combines pandemic protocols with in-person options. As usual, FWOT is the event's primary sponsor and will turn over 15 per cent of Feb. 16's daylong dine-in, take-out or delivery sales when ordered as part of "Kiwanis Mardi Gras." The restaurant's delivery radius is 2.5 miles and include shohocken, Lafayette Hill, Plymouth Meeting and portions of West Conshohocken and Norristown (610-828-6191 and www.fingerswingsandotherthings.com).

"We could crush this by getting all the local businesses to order take-out," says Jen Vare, who is co-chairing the fundraiser with Lori Tomczak.

On the other hand, the Kiwani members are not asking area businesses for Mardi Gras 2021 sponsorships.
"We just didn't want to ask peo-

ple for money when they're already hurting because of the pandemic," Vare says. "(FWOT) has and they've just always been awe-some. We're very grateful.
