
Structure of the board

- Calls special meetings of the board, if necessary.
- Establishes goals for the club, in consultation with the club board of directors, which align with the club's strategic plan.
- Serves as ex-officio member of all standing and special committees.
- President elect / Vice President backs up President in the event of absence



Purpose:


Opportunity to plan and develop goals with your leadership team before taking office.



Scenario 1

Each week your meetings decline in attendance, and many members sometimes do not respond to communication sent out. How would you start to determine the issues and motivate members to join meetings?



Scenario 1- Potential Solution

Potential solution - First discuss the issue with the board to get any feedback from them. It is recommended that you contact your Lt. Governor to administer a Member Satisfaction Survey to determine if the meeting location, date or time is the issue for most members. To motivate members, suggest a handson service project at the meeting to encourage attendance and allow members to bring family members. (Eg Card making, blessing bag stuffing etc). Meetings with a purpose provides values for all members.

Scenario 2

You receive an email from a new member that indicates that they are leaving the club. They state at a recent service project the chair did not delegate and did not offer jobs to the new member. They new member felt they were just "bossed" around and did not feel valued or welcomed. This is not the first time this has happen. Their time is valuable and do not feel Kiwanis is worth the aggravation.

Scenario 2- Potential Solution

Potential solution - Respond promptly so the member does not feel ignored or that their feelings are not important. A request to discuss over the phone would be recommended as email can be misconstrued in sensitive matters. Find out the facts from the project chair and new member who lodge the complain. Work with board to set up clear communication and roles/responsibilities for each project to ensure all volunteers can participate. Continue to follow up with new member, if they choose to stay, to see if things improved.





Pillar 1: Membership Goals

- Net gain in membership over the previous year, as certified by October 10, 2023



Pillar 2: Service Leadership Programs

- 90% of the service leadership programs be active in their school and communities.
- Have 100% of the service leadership programs be sponsored and have an engaged and active Kiwanis advisor.
- Open two (2) new clubs in Circle K, Key Club, and Builders Club.
- Open five (5) new K-Kids Clubs.



Pillar 3: Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (J.E.D.I) Initiative

- Continue the Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Initiative throughout the district.
- Continue District Convention, Midyear and quarterly J.E.D.I awareness opportunities.



Pillar 4: Leadership Education

- Have 20 members of Pennsylvania clubs participate in Kiwanis Amplify leadership program and provide 50% funding for attendees.
- Have monthly virtual educational opportunities for members.
- 60% of club officers attend Club Leadership education.




Pillar 5: District Leadership and Operations






Kiwanis Engage!

Work with your Treasurer

- Ensure club reports financials monthly
- Dues are paid to maintain that clubs are in good standing.
- Provide records for annual audit
- Retain records for seven years





Annual Audit



- Legal requirement
- Completed by independent auditor or an internal committee
- Standard Form for Club Bylaws
- Treasurer serve on committee



Incorporation





- Each club is required to incorporate
- Confirm your club has original paperwork
 - Kiwanis International and your state or local government needs a copy
 - Incorporation must be renewed annually

Form 990



The IRS requires all U.S.-based Kiwanis clubs to submit a 990 form annually.

 Failure to file in a timely manner may put your club's incorporation status at risk


