GUEST SPEAKER

Valerie Steele was our guest speaker today. She is the Volunteer Director for Salem-Keizer Education Foundation. She has been with SKEF for five years. Her talk today was on the ASPIRE Program. *The following information is from their web site*.

ASPIRE is a mentoring program that matches trained adult volunteers with middle and high school students so they can jointly form a plan to meet education goals beyond high school. Mentors help students explore college options, admissions and financial aid



and work one-on-one with students throughout the year.

ASPIRE is for ALL students and serves the ENTIRE student body.

Oregon runs the program through the Office of Students Access and Completion. It has used ASPIRE as its official post-secondary mentoring program since 1998. Currently, it is in 135 high schools, middle schools and community colleges around the state.

ASPIRE in Salem-Keizer

In an unprecedented partnership between the Salem-Keizer School District, ASPIRE and Salem-Keizer Education Foundation. The first district-wide The ASPIRE program was launched in the state of Oregon here in Salem. ASPIRE sites have been established at 11 Salem-Keizer middle schools and 6 high schools. Volunteers are necessary to make this program a success. ASPIRE is a new way for community members to make a difference in the lives of Salem-Keizer youth.

ASPIRE mentors play a unique role in the life of a student, helping guide and assist them in pursuing education and training beyond high school. ASPIRE volunteer mentors:

- Meet with students and encourage their interests
- Explore careers, schools and scholarship opportunities with them
- Proofread applications and essays for students
- Keep students focused and on a timeline
- Help students at FAFSA filing time.







Eric Arthur Howard

August 26, 1930 - February 13, 2016

Eric Arthur Howard was born on August 26, 1930 in London, England. He passed away on February 13, 2016, in Keizer, OR after bravely battling cancer and its effects for almost a decade. He was 85 years old.

Eric spent his youth in England, where he and his brother were two of the many children evacuated to the English countryside to live with other families as London was being bombed during World War II. At age sixteen, Eric joined the Scottish Black Watch Regiment. After seven years in the army he attended the Royal Academy of Music and Trinity College of Music where he pursued his passion for music and specifically the bassoon.

In 1955 Eric met Noreen Roche and they married in 1958. In 1962 they emigrated to America with their three-year-old daughter and landed in San Francisco, CA. Two sons came along shortly after the move to America. Eric and Noreen divorced in 1980, but were great friends right up to the time of Eric's passing. In 1998, Eric married Shirley Kropf whom all agreed was fantastic for him and to him. They spent much time traveling, dancing, golfing, and enjoying the Howard kids and grandkids.

Eric had a rich and varied working career. He owned and operated two English Fish and Chip restaurants in Oregon, the Piccadilly Pub in Salem and the Tower of London in Corvallis. Other career stops included Bank Vice President, Director of Bank Acquisitions, Convention and Visitors Bureau Manager, Foundation Development, Director of Economic Development and Property Appraiser.

Service organizations such as Kiwanis International and the United Nations Association of the United States were important volunteer commitments to Eric. He was a dedicated Kiwanian for over 50 years and served as a Club President and Lieutenant Governor.

Eric is survived by his wife, Shirley; brother Leslie (Olive) of St Albans, England; daughter Yvonne (Thomas) of Woodinville, WA; sons Tom (Lisa) of Keizer, OR and Bruce (Karen) of Gresham, OR; as well as grandchildren Kaitlin, Trevor, Samantha, Rachel and Drake.

Eric was loved and we will miss him dearly. The family would like to thank caregiver extraordinaire, Michelle, as well as Willamette Valley Hospice for their service to Eric and his family. A private service will be held at Restlawn Cemetery.
