Salem Police Chief Jerry Moore

Salem Police Chief Jerry Moore is a Salem native. He has been a cop for some 38 years. He has been Police Chief here for 10 years. He feels that after the Michael Brown shooting in Ferguson, Mo., the police have come under increased pressure and critique of their procedures.

He touched on an article in the *Statesman Journal* stating that the percentage of black arrests in Salem are higher than white. The ratio is about 3 to 1 whereas the population ratio is about 1.7% African American. Chief Moore wrote an article in the paper in response to the article. He says in his article "As the article states, those disparities are easier to measure than to explain."

He believes "there is more work to be done" and he and the department are reaching out to the African American pastors in Salem. Chief Moore is continuing to have training in police policies to improve the community.
