Proposed \$619.7 Million Bond Measure for Schools



Our Guest Speaker today was Michael Wolfe. He talked about the May 15, 2018 ballot Measure 24-429.

This issue is about addressing the future growth of the student population in Salem-Keizer schools.

For schools in my neighborhood... Leslie Middle School... The bond

measure addresses the identified building improvement projects that would include technology and communications upgrades, such as expanded wireless capacity and intercom system upgrades. Bond funds would also be used to provide updated electronic badge access and improved supervision of the main entry. Select existing classrooms would be retrofit into two (2) science labs. Additional projects would include kitchen upgrades, library improvements, music room improvements, exterior seal, roofing replacement, and site work.

And for Morningside Elementary... a single-story facility constructed in 1953, the identified building improvement projects would include heating/ventilation upgrades, music room improvements, roofing replacement and plumbing improvements. Technology and communications improvements would include expanded wireless capacity and intercom system upgrades. Bond funds would also be used to provide improved supervision of the main entry and make seismic improvements.

The goal of this program is to improve both safety, security and opportunities for all students in the Salem-Keizer School District.

Voters will decide if they want to help the kids and teachers in our community by paying a little more in taxes to make some needed improvements to help the future of our young people.

Club History continued from last week: In 1963 our club helped plan and supervise an all-night graduation party for the high school seniors. We provided the chaperons for the party until 1972. Since 1964 we have presented the banner awards for the FFA livestock show at the State Fair. Bell ringing at Christmas for the Salvation Army began in 1966 and continues today. Kids Day Parades in the 60s turned into Kiwanis Kids Day football games in the 70s. Popcorn sales began in 1971. Along with track meets in the 70s and early 80s, we began sponsoring a Spelling Bee in 1976 which continues today. We sponsored a low rider rally in the 80s and began the Educator of The Year award program in 1986. Our annual pizza lunch and party at Christmas was begun in 1985 also, with over 100 underprivileged children from local schools. We began sponsoring a booth at the Art Fair to raise funds for these and other projects in 1982. Over the years the Salem Kiwanis Club has played a leading role in helping improve the livability of Salem. The project list included 37 projects. During our 70 years our club has had ten Lieutenant Governors and many awards for leadership. We have sponsored three continuing clubs, Albany in 1923, Dallas in 1927, and North Salem in 1948. We have been represented in many District and International conventions and have continued a tradition of international as well as local involvement in Kiwanis goals.
