Laura and her husband Mark have 2 daughters and 5 grandkids. In addition to Kiwanis, Laura volunteers with the CERT program and with her church. She and Mark love to go salmon fishing. As KOD she asked questions related to the 9-11 event. As incoming president, she also mentioned the board is recommending that the dues be raised to \$135.00 as the current \$125.00 will only cover national dues and division dues and 0 for our club's administrative funding needs.

Club Installation Luncheon Noon Tuesday September 25 At the home of Barbara and Richard Chesbrough. All members are invited. **Sheri Wahrgren** was our guest speaker today. She is the City of Salem Downtown Revitalization Manager. Her position was created in the 1970's due to concerns to keep Salem's downtown active and attractive as shopping malls in the outlining areas were drawing people and business owners to move to those areas and to abandon historical buildings. 67% of the Salem downtown area is considered historical properties.

In 2011, a Strategic Action Plan program was established to decide which areas of the Salem's downtown problems could and would be tackled



including Infrastructure, Water, Electrical, Bike, Parking, Grants and Loans for Salem businesses and building owners and the public who live and work downtown. Salem has seven Urban Renewal Zones. One of the more active groups is the "Can-do" Neighborhood Association. Fifteen years ago the downtown area of Salem had over 100,000 square feet of vacant commercial space. Today most of the space at street level, has been filled with current efforts being made to create housing units above street level commercial space. Having a healthy mixed housing footprint in the downtown core helps with a vibrant downtown. The Downtown Revitalization Plan was developed in 2011 with a focus on infrastructure improvements (sewer, water), parks, riverfront. In 2016 the plan was revisited and now prioritizes Streetscapes as the number 1 issue with Housing as number 2.

Today we are seeing new construction happening near and around the Riverfront Park with addition of a new 26,000 square foot commercial structure in front of the Riverfront Carousel Building. Future new commercial development is planned for the vacant corner lot at Liberty and State Street. It is currently proposed to be a housing project featuring 130 studio units.

The Streetscape plan is being developed with community input and will be presented to the Salem City Council later this fall. Homeless issues are also being discussed and a plan will be presented to the Council early next year to address issues including bath and shower structures along with temporary storage structures for the homeless population.

Sheri's proudest accomplishment so far is the "Signature Project for Salem" which is the Peter Courtney Bridge and its connections between Minto Island and the Riverfront Park. (*text by Laura Hildebrandt & Bob Repine*).
