Our guest speaker, **Mary Grim**, spoke of the beginning of the Salem Multicultural Institute which began on February 15, 1997, on rolls of poster paper stretched across a dining room wall. Two moms with young daughters saw the need to create a positive, tangible response to growing concern about racial tensions in Salem. That response took the form of a festival, a celebration of all of the many cultures that make Oregon such a wonderful place.



The inaugural Salem World Beat was held in conjunction with the grand opening of Salem's long-awaited Riverfront Park on June 27-28, 1998.

The institute operates the **World Beat Gallery** in Salem. The Gallery gives local ethnic communities the opportunity to share artifacts and materials representing their cultural background with the community at large. School groups and historical societies are important visitors, and members of the community make the effort to be present to talk to guests and pass along the flavor of other cultures.

After discharge he went back to KXO and eventually became the station owner. Some of his experiences in radio included interviewing Ronald Regan, Lyndon Johnson, John Kennedy, and Bob Hope just to name just a few.
